










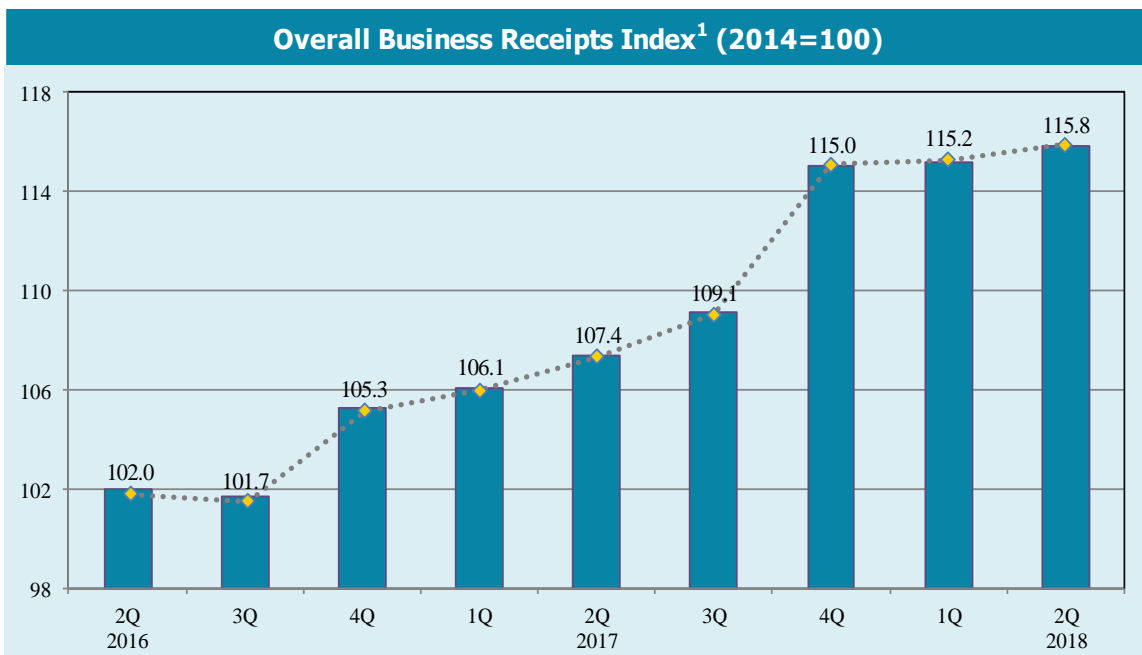

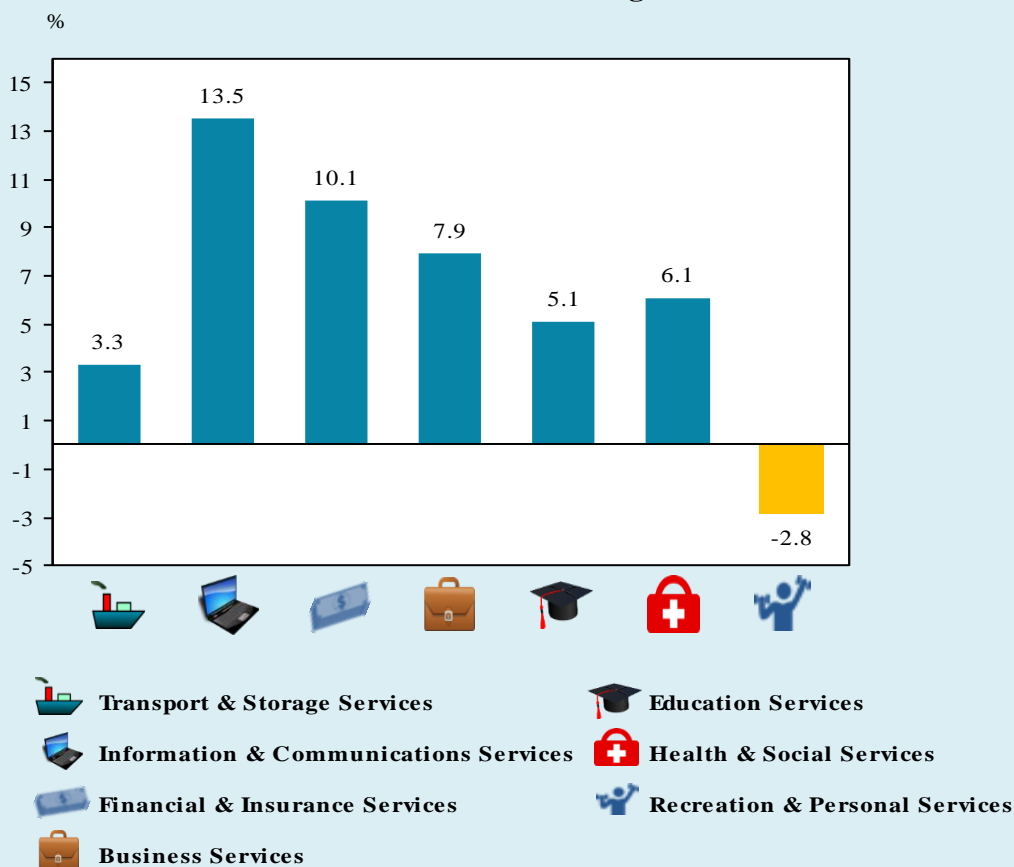
## BUSINESS RECEIPTS BY INDUSTRY

### Year-on-Year Change

Overall business receipts of the services industries (excluding Wholesale & Retail Trade and Accommodation & Food Services) grew by 7.8% in second quarter 2018 on a year-on-year basis. All industries except Recreation & Personal Services registered higher revenue (Chart 1).

Information & Communications Services recorded the highest revenue growth of 13.5%. This double-digit growth was mainly attributed to higher revenue registered by firms engaged in software publishing and information service activities such as data centre and web portal services. Other industries which registered higher turnover include Financial & Insurance Services (10.1%) and Business Services (7.9%). On the other hand, the Recreation & Personal Services industry reported a decrease in revenue of 2.8%.

## BUSINESS RECEIPTS BY INDUSTRY

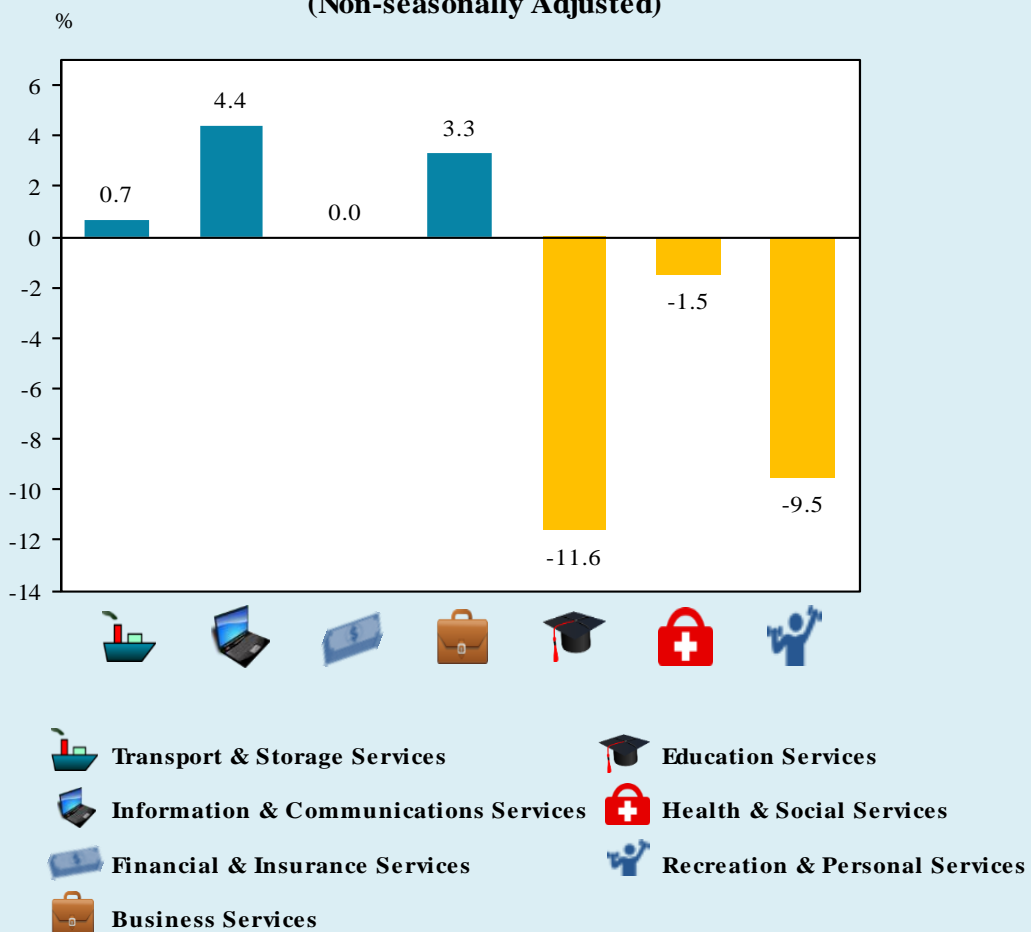
### Quarter-on-Quarter Change (Non-seasonally Adjusted)

On a quarter-on-quarter basis, overall business receipts grew by 0.5% in second quarter 2018 compared to first quarter 2018.

Performance was mixed among the industries. Business receipts of Information & Communications Services and Business Services registered increases of 4.4% and 3.3% respectively, due to higher demand for their services (Chart 2).

On the other hand, the Education Services industry recorded a decline of 11.6% in turnover<sup>1</sup>. The Recreation & Personal Services industry also recorded a quarter-on-quarter drop of 9.5% in business receipts.

## **Explanatory Notes**

### ***Introduction***

The Business Receipts Index (BRI) for the services industries (excluding wholesale & retail trade and accommodation & food services) measures the short-term changes in the amount of business or operating receipts on a quarterly basis. The BRI is compiled at current prices.

Business or operating receipts is the income earned from business operations i.e. includes income from services rendered, sale of goods, commission fees as well as rental of premises and machinery & equipment.

To reflect the changes in the structure of the services industries over the years, the weighting pattern of the index series is revised regularly. The BRI series have been re-based from base year 2008 to 2014. The new BRI series (2014=100) has been released with effect from 1Q2015 report.

### ***Data Collection***

Data for the compilation of the index is sourced from administrative data as well as the Quarterly Survey of Services (QSS) and Survey of Quarterly National Income Estimates conducted by the department.

The 2014-based BRI is compiled based on survey and administrative records of more than 11,000 enterprises.

### ***Index Compilation***

To derive the BRI at detailed industry level, the quarterly business receipts for that industry is divided by the average quarterly business receipts for the same industry in the base year. The overall BRI is then computed by combining the indices of the detailed industries, using weights which measure each industry's relative importance in the overall services sector.
