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PREFACE

The Census of Population 2010 was the fifth census carried out in Singapore since Independence and the fourteenth in the series of census taking in Singapore. The census is the most comprehensive source of information on population and households. It provides benchmark data for all demographic, economic and social statistics.

The Census 2010 adopted a register-based approach, similar to the Census of Population 2000. Basic population count and characteristics were compiled from administrative sources. More detailed information on demographic, education, economic, transport, household and housing characteristics were obtained from a sample enumeration of about 200,000 households.

As in the conduct of the Census 2000, a tri-modal collection strategy comprising Internet, Computer-Assisted Telephone Interviewing (CATI) and face-to-face interviews was adopted to facilitate data collection for the households in the census sample. The Census 2010 went paperless during the face-to-face interviews, with the use of Ultra-Mobile Personal Computers (UMPCs) to aid data collection. This data collection methodology brought about savings in manpower, data security in the field, as well as improvements in quality and timeliness of data.

This Advance Census Release analyses the key trends in population size, growth, demographic profile and broad geographic distribution of the Singapore population as at end-June 2010, compiled from multiple administrative sources. The report includes detailed statistical tables to enable more comprehensive study by users as well as a glossary of census concepts and definitions. More tables and analyses based on the sample enumeration will be published progressively in a series of Statistical Releases on specific topics.

I would like to thank all who have, in one way or another, contributed to the success of this project. My deep appreciation is extended to all participating households who had given their full support to the Census 2010. The contributions of many government ministries and statutory boards, which provided pertinent information for the Census 2010, are gratefully acknowledged.

INTRODUCTION

The Census of Population, Singapore's largest national statistical exercise, is conducted once in ten years by the Singapore Department of Statistics. The Census of Population 2010 was the fifth census after Singapore's Independence, and the fourteenth in the series of census-taking in Singapore.

The Singapore Department of Statistics is pleased to announce the first release of data from the register-based Census of Population. This report presents the key trends in population size, growth, demographic profile and broad geographic distribution of the Singapore population as at end-June 2010, compiled from multiple administrative sources.

A sample enumeration of some 200,000 households was undertaken to collect additional information not available from any administrative sources. These include marriage and fertility, education and languages, religion, household and housing, and transport. More detailed tables and analyses will be published progressively in a series of Statistical Releases on specific topics.

Census of Population – Concept and Coverage

The Census of Population 2010 adopted the de jure concept for Singapore's population estimates based on a person's place of usual residence. Under the de jure concept of "usual residence", Singapore residents (citizens and permanent residents) with local addresses and who were not away from Singapore for a continuous period of 12 months or longer were included in the total population count. The non-resident population comprising foreigners who were working, studying or living in Singapore but not granted permanent residence were also included in the total population. The transient population such as tourists and short-term visitors was excluded.

Register-based Census of Population

In the register-based Census, the basic population statistics were compiled using administrative records from multiple sources. The merged administrative records provided the basic population count and characteristics such as age, sex, ethnic group, place of birth, type of dwelling and geographic distribution in Singapore.

Sample Enumeration

To collect additional information not available from administrative sources, some 200,000 households were selected to participate in the sample enumeration. Building on the success and lessons learned from the Census of Population 2000, a tri-modal data collection strategy comprising Internet enumeration, Computer Assisted Telephone Interviewing (CATI) and face-to-face interviews was adopted to facilitate data collection for the households in the sample.

The option of Internet enumeration was made available to all households selected for the census sample enumeration. Available 24 hours a day, 7 days a week, Internet enumeration provided respondents with the flexibility of responding at any time they desired. It allowed respondents to provide their survey returns directly to the system without having to go through a third party, i.e. the interviewer.

Respondents, who were not able to complete their returns via the Internet, had the option to provide their returns over the phone with the assistance of telephone interviewers. Households that did not complete their returns via the Internet by a stipulated date were also contacted by telephone interviewers for telephone interviews. The CATI system allowed the telephone interviewer to perform multiple tasks of interviewing, data entry and simple coding simultaneously.

Households were scheduled for face-to-face interviews if they did not respond via Internet and could not be contacted by CATI after several attempts. Those who preferred to provide their information to the trained interviewers could also choose to do so. In the event where the field interviewers failed to contact the respondents in these households, they left appointment slips behind for the respondents to contact the interviewers to schedule a convenient time for an interview.

Unlike the traditional paper and pen approach, the Ultra-Mobile Personal Computer (UMPC) was adopted for field enumeration in Census of Population 2010. The use of technology provided logistic convenience, eliminating the need for printing and transportation of hardcopy survey forms. Automatic branching of questions with consistency checks was also introduced to reduce back-end processing efforts with electronically coded data captured in the field.

Data Processing and Reports

Census returns submitted via the Internet, CATI and field enumeration were captured electronically and updated into the Census database directly without the need for separate data entry back in office. Trained coders performed online computer-assisted coding of data on occupation, industry and education while editors checked on the consistency and completeness of survey returns. The final processing of the census data involved the editing and verification of records to ensure consistency and good quality of the data.

After stringent quality checks and the completion of data processing, multiple aggregated cross-tabulations were generated for analysis of data trends. Statistical reports on specific topics were prepared for public release.

Key Demographic Trends

KEY DEMOGRAPHIC TRENDS

Population Size and Growth

Singapore's total population was 5.08 million as at end-June 2010 (Table 1). There were 3.77 million Singapore residents, comprising 3.23 million Singapore citizens and 0.54 million permanent residents, and 1.31 million non-resident foreigners.

Singapore's total population registered a lower growth of 1.8 per cent in 2010, reflecting the slower growth in the number of permanent residents and non-residents over the past year. The number of permanent residents grew by 1.5 per cent in 2010, down from at least 6 per cent growth per year between 2005 and 2009. Growth in the number of non-residents also slowed to 4.1 per cent in 2010, down from the peaks of 15 per cent in 2007 and 19 per cent in 2008.

The number of Singapore citizens grew by 0.9 per cent between 2009 and 2010. This is comparable to the annual growth rate of 0.8 – 1.1 per cent that was registered between 2005 and 2009.

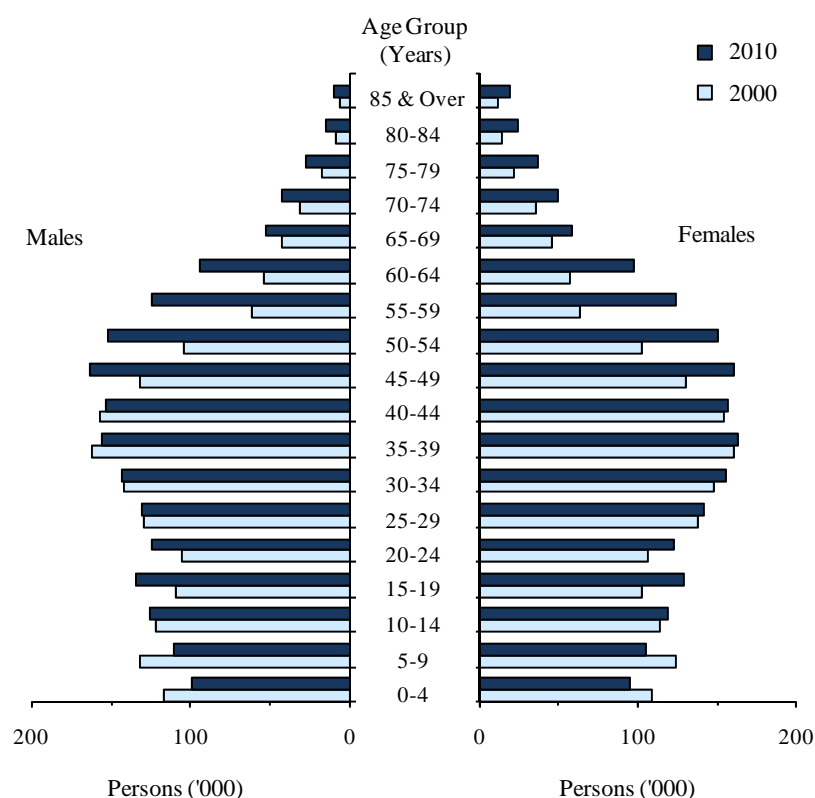
Age Structure

The Singapore resident population has grown older. The proportion of Singapore residents aged 45 years and over in 2010 was higher as compared to a decade ago (Table 2 and Chart 1). The median age of the resident population rose from 34.0 years in 2000 to 37.4 years in 2010.

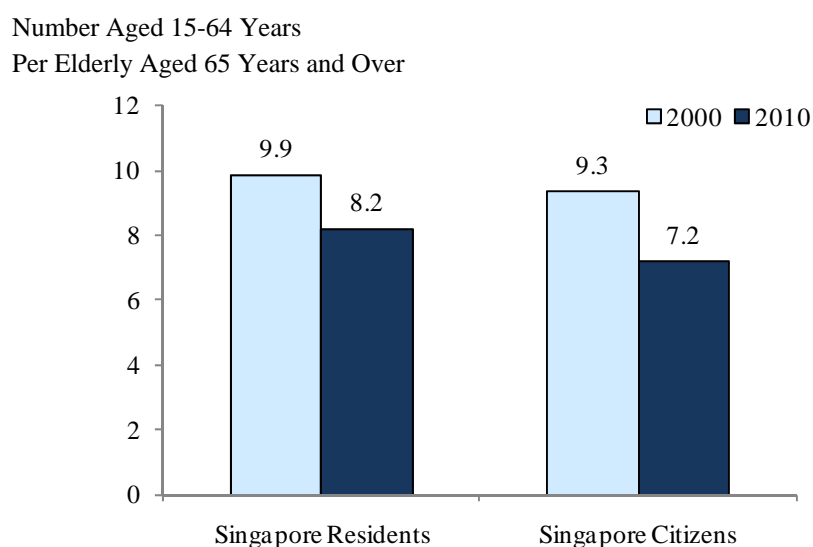
Chart 1 Age Pyramid of the Resident Population



With the ageing population, the ratio of working-age residents to elderly residents has declined. There were 8.2 residents aged 15-64 years for each resident aged 65 years and over in 2010, a decline from 9.9 in 2000 (Chart 2).

The inflow of permanent residents slowed down the pace of ageing. In 2010, the old-age support ratio among the resident population was higher than the old-age support ratio of 7.2 for the citizen population. The decline in the old-age support ratio among the resident population between 2000 and 2010 was also slower than that for the citizen population.

Ethnic Composition

The Chinese formed 74 per cent of the resident population in 2010 (Table 3). The Malay and Indian share of the resident population stood at 13 per cent and 9.2 per cent respectively.

Sex Composition

There were more females than males in Singapore's resident population since 2000. In 2010, the difference widened with females outnumbering males by 49,500. The sex ratio fell to 974 males per 1,000 females in 2010, down from 998 males per 1,000 females in 2000 (Table 4).

Place of Birth

The proportion of the resident population born outside of Singapore increased from 18 per cent in 2000 to 23 per cent in 2010 (Table 5). The last decade saw an increase in the proportion of those born in Malaysia, the Indian sub-continent and Other Asian countries.

Geographical Distribution

Out of the 3.77 million Singapore resident population as at 2010, about 57 per cent were concentrated in ten planning areas¹. Bedok was the registered place of address for the largest group of Singapore residents (294,500), followed by Jurong West (267,500) and Tampines (261,700) (Table 6).

Sengkang recorded the largest growth in the number of Singapore residents, with an increase of 105,800 Singapore residents between 2000 and 2010 (Table 7). Jurong West, Punggol and Woodlands were the next three planning areas that registered relatively large increases in the number of Singapore residents.

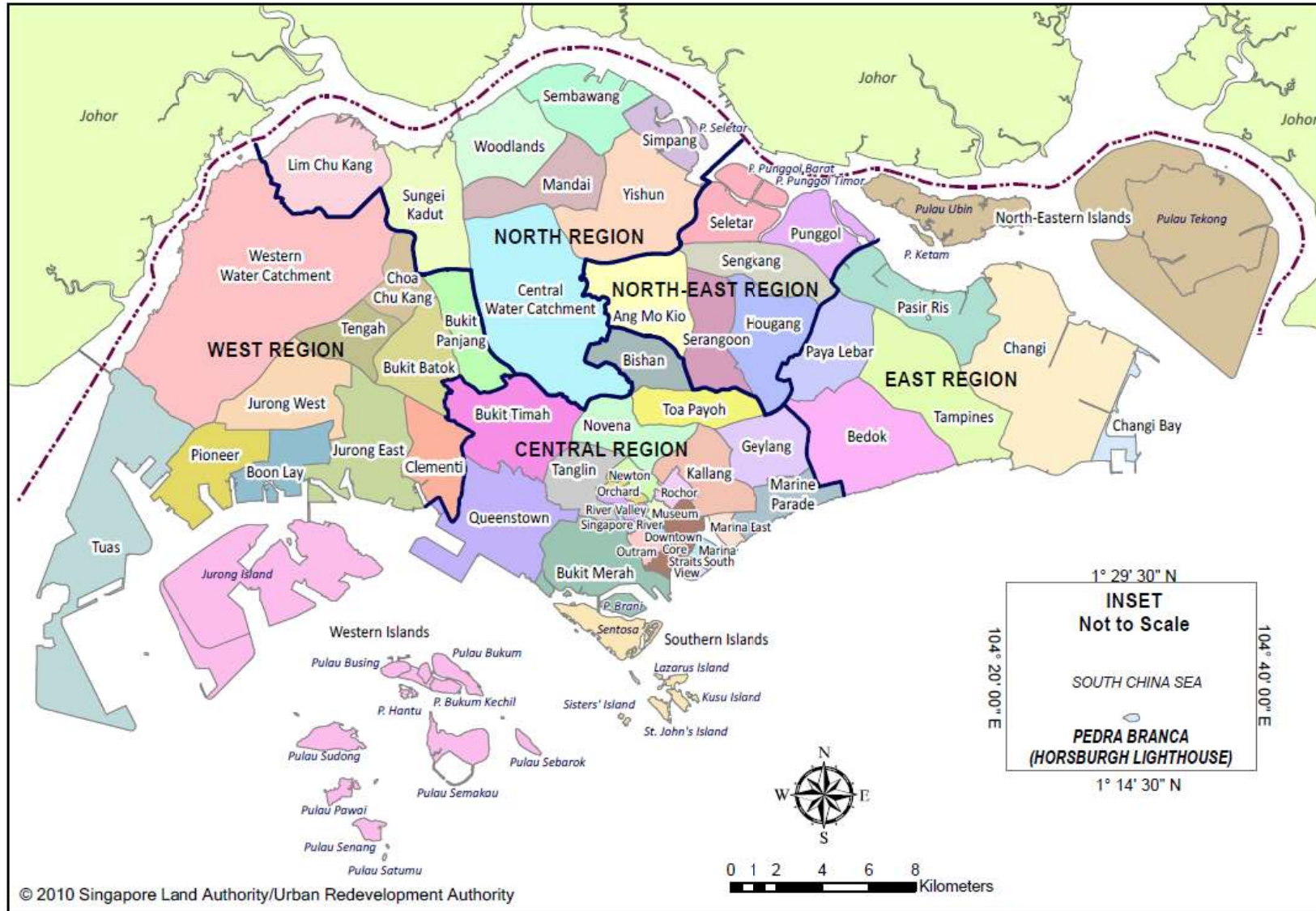
Bedok had the largest population of elderly residents as at 2010 (Table 8). Other relatively older estates such as Bukit Merah and Ang Mo Kio also had larger population of elderly residents.

In contrast, relatively newer estates had larger populations of children aged below 15 years. In 2010, Woodlands had the largest number of children aged below 15 years, followed by Jurong West.

Glossary of Terms and Definitions

GLOSSARY OF TERMS AND DEFINITIONS

Age

Age refers to the number of completed years between a person's date of birth and the reference date of 30 June 2010.

Ethnic Group

Ethnic group refers to a person's race. It is as declared by the person. The population is classified into the following four categories:

Chinese This refers to persons of Chinese origin such as Hokkiens, Teochews, Cantonese, Hakkas, Hainanese, Hockchias, Foochows, Henghuas, Shanghainese, etc.

Malays This refers to persons of Malay or Indonesian origin, such as Javanese, Boyanese, Bugis, etc.

Indians This refers to persons of Indian, Pakistani, Bangladeshi or Sri Lankan origin such as Tamils, Malayalis, Punjabis, Bengalis, Singhalese, etc.

Other Ethnic Groups This comprises all persons other than Chinese, Malays and Indians. They include Eurasians, Europeans, Arabs, Japanese, etc.

Old-Age Support Ratio

The old-age support ratio is defined as the number of persons aged 15-64 years per elderly person aged 65 years and over.

Place of Birth

Place of birth refers to the geographical area in which the person was born as defined by current political boundaries.

Planning Areas

Planning areas refer to areas demarcated in the Urban Redevelopment Authority's Master Plan 2008.

Residential Status

Singapore citizens and permanent residents are classified as Singapore residents or the resident population. Singapore permanent residents refer to non-citizens who have been granted permanent residence in Singapore. The non-resident population comprised foreigners who were working, studying or living in Singapore but not granted permanent residence, excluding tourists and short-term visitors.

Sex Ratio

The sex ratio refers to the number of males per 1,000 females in the population.

Type of Dwelling

A dwelling refers to a building, part of a building, or a covered space used or intended to be used by one or more persons as living quarters. Each dwelling has its own separate entrance with direct access to a public road or pathway. A dwelling may be a residential building by itself, or a unit in a residential building, or part of a non-residential building such as a shop or factory with space used as living quarters.

Dwellings are broadly classified into the following three categories: HDB flats, condominiums and private flats, and landed properties.
