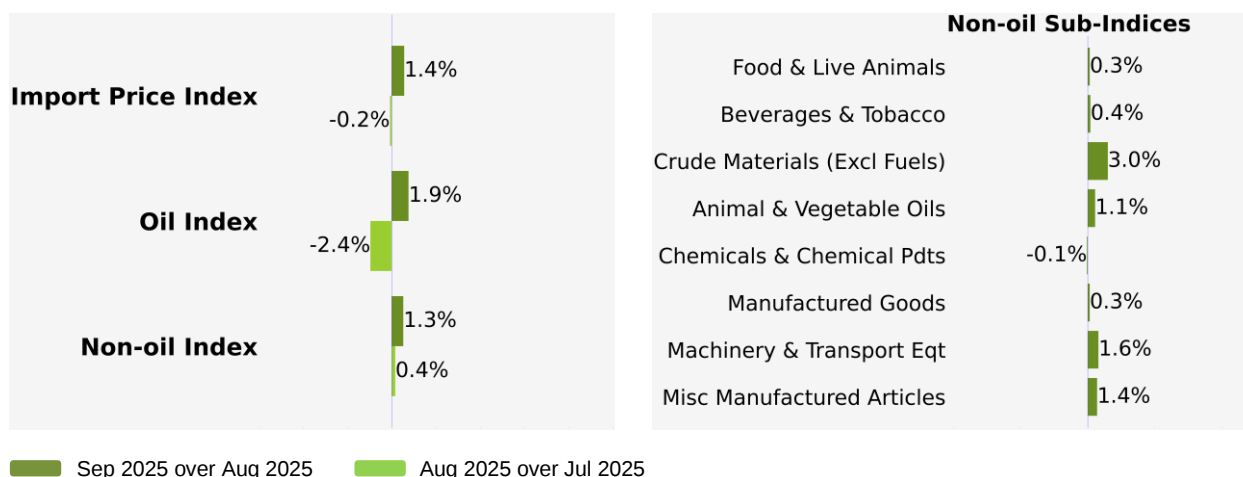

Import Price Index (2023 = 100) September 2025

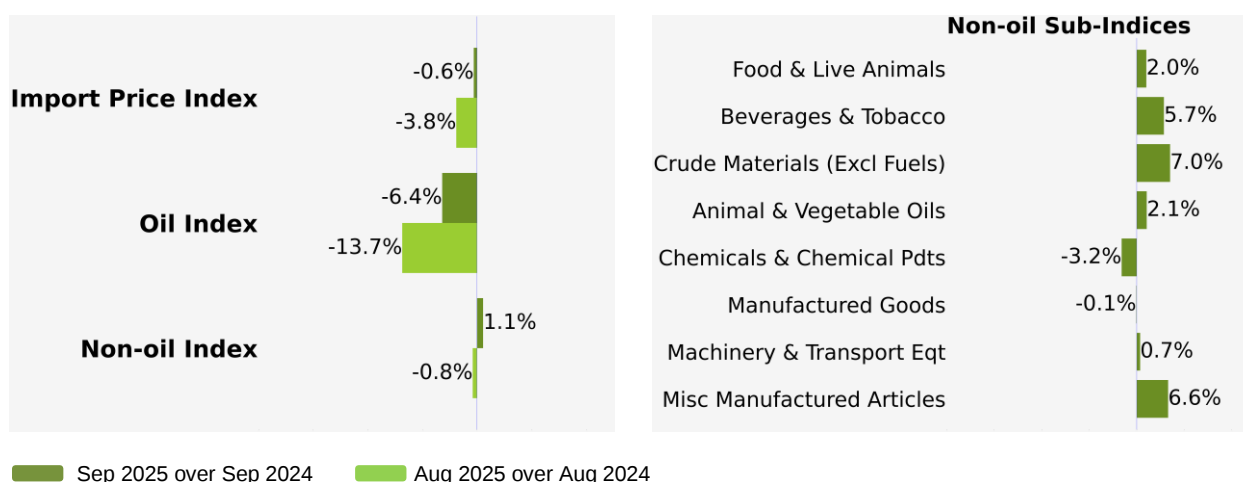
Month-on-Month Change



The Import Price Index rose 1.4% in September 2025, in contrast to the 0.2% decrease in August 2025. The Oil index gained 1.9%, reversing the 2.4% decline in the previous month, mainly led by higher prices of petroleum and products. The Non-oil index rose 1.3% in September 2025, continuing the 0.4% increase in August 2025.

The increase in the Non-oil index was due to the Machinery & Transport Equipment index, attributed to higher prices of electrical machinery apparatus, as well as the Miscellaneous Manufactured Articles, Crude Materials, Manufactured Goods, Food & Live Animals, Animal & Vegetable Oils and Beverages & Tobacco indices. The increases were partially offset by the decrease in the Chemicals & Chemical Products index.

Year-on-Year Change

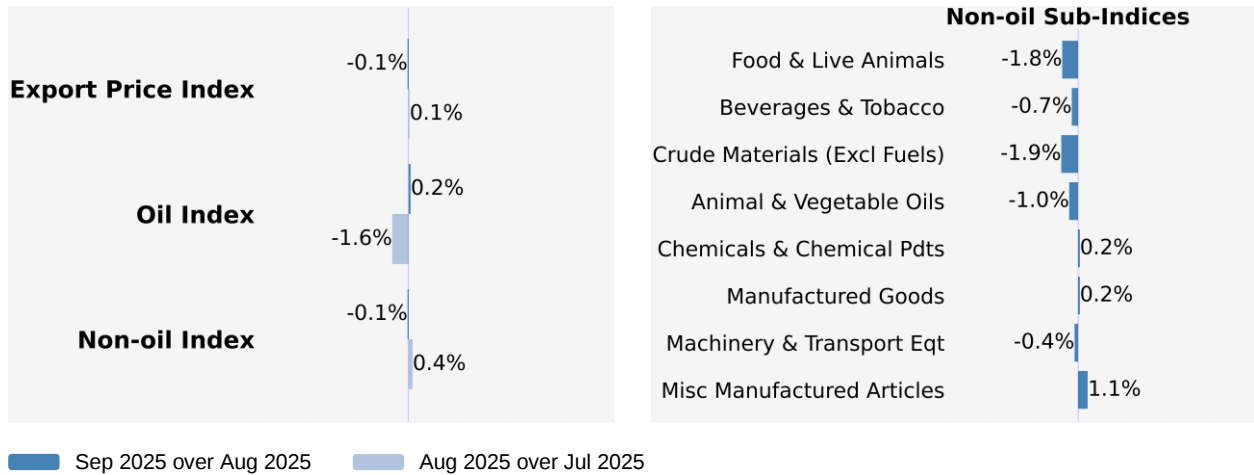


The Import Price Index fell 0.6% in September 2025 from a year ago, following the 3.8% decrease in August 2025. The Oil index dipped 6.4%, mainly led by lower prices of petroleum and products, while the Non-oil index rose 1.1%.

Among the Non-oil sub-indices, the increase was due to the Miscellaneous Manufactured Articles index, attributed to higher prices of articles of precious/ semiprecious materials, as well as the Machinery & Transport Equipment, Beverages & Tobacco, Food & Live Animals, Crude Materials and Animal & Vegetable Oils indices. The increases were partially moderated by decreases in the Chemicals & Chemical Products and Manufactured Goods indices.

Export Price Index (2023 = 100) September 2025

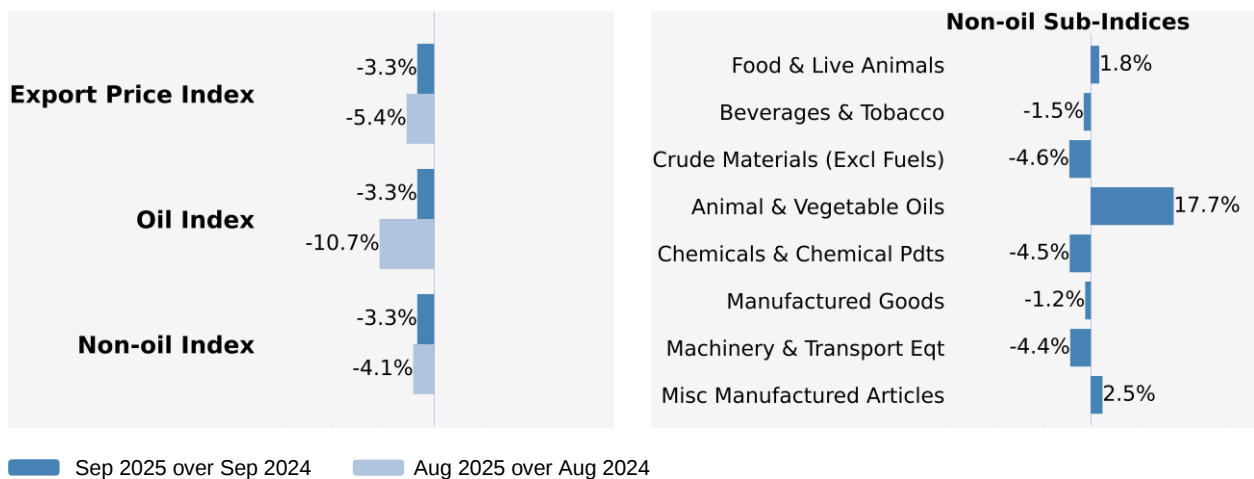
Month-on-Month Change



The Export Price Index fell 0.1% in September 2025, in contrast to the 0.1% increase in August 2025. The Oil index gained 0.2%, reversing the 1.6% decrease in the previous month. The Non-oil index fell 0.1% in September 2025, against the 0.4% increase in August 2025.

The decrease in the Non-oil index was due to the Machinery & Transport Equipment, Food & Live Animals, Crude Materials, Beverages & Tobacco and Animal & Vegetable Oils indices. The decreases were partially offset by increases in the Miscellaneous Manufactured Articles, Chemicals & Chemical Products and Manufactured Goods indices.

Year-on-Year Change



The Export Price Index fell 3.3% in September 2025 from a year ago, following the 5.4% decrease in August 2025. Both the Oil and Non-oil indices fell 3.3%.

Among the Non-oil sub-indices, the decrease was due to the Machinery & Transport Equipment index, contributed by lower prices of electrical machinery apparatus, as well as the Chemicals & Chemical Products, Manufactured Goods, Crude Materials and Beverages & Tobacco indices. The decreases were partially moderated by increases in the Miscellaneous Manufactured Articles, Food & Live Animals and Animal & Vegetable Oils indices.

Technical Note

The **Import Price Index (IPI)** is used primarily as an indicator to track the price trends of imported goods into Singapore. Prices of imports, valued at CIF terms (cost, insurance and freight) are obtained monthly from major importers. The weighting pattern of the index is derived from import statistics for 2023.

The **Export Price Index (EPI)** measures changes in the price of all exports of merchandise from Singapore, including re-exports. In general, prices are obtained from major exporters of the selected commodities. Prices used in the index computation, are the prices of goods that physically leave Singapore's main ports of export; also termed as Free on Board (FOB) prices. The weights of the index are derived from the distribution of export by commodity in 2023.

Index Formula

The 2023-based series is compiled using the Laspeyres formula where the price and weight reference periods are aligned to the year 2023. The geometric mean formula has been adopted in the computation of unweighted elementary aggregate price indices. The arithmetic mean formula is applied in compiling indices at higher levels of aggregation where weights of specific sub-indices are available.

Measurement of Changes in Price Indices

Change over previous month compares the index of the month with that of the preceding month. Such comparisons measure the change in the price index between two consecutive months. They serve as useful short-term indicators of the price movements.

Change over same period of previous year measures change in the index over a twelve-month period. Such comparisons compare the movement in the price index between similar months in two consecutive years.

Linking the Old 2018-Based Price Index Series to the New 2023-Based Price Index Series

The IPI and EPI have been rebased from base year 2018 to base year 2023. To facilitate comparison of the historical price indices across base years, the old 2018-based series are linked to the new 2023-based series by re-scaling them via a Linked Coefficient. The Linked Coefficient is the ratio of the annual 2023-based index in 2023 to the annual 2018-based index in 2023.

Example: Linking the old Iron & Steel Index series for IPI prior to 2023, to the 2023-based Iron & Steel Index (2023=100)

1) Calculate the linked coefficient

Year	Iron & Steel Index (2018=100)	Iron & Steel Index (2023=100)	Linked Coefficient
2023	117.2	100.0	$100.0 \div 117.2 = 0.853$

2) Re-scaling the old series to the 2023-based series using the Linked Coefficient

Year	Month	Iron & Steel Index (2018=100)	Iron & Steel Index (2023=100)
2021	Dec	130.3	$130.3 \times 0.853 = 111.1$
2022	Jan	128.7	$128.7 \times 0.853 = 109.8$

Rescaling the 2023-Based Index Series to Previous Years

To continue the old index series going forward in time, re-scale the new 2023-based index series to the old base year level, via a Rescaling Coefficient. The Rescaling Coefficient is the ratio of the annual 2023-based index in 2023 to the annual 2023-based index in the old base year.

Example: Rescaling the new 2023-based Iron & Steel Index series for IPI to the 2018-based Iron & Steel Index (2018=100)

1) Calculate the rescaling coefficient

Base Year	Annual Iron & Steel Index in 2023	Annual Iron & Steel Index in 2018	Linked Coefficient
2023	100.0	85.3	$100.0 \div 85.3 = \mathbf{1.172}$

2) Re-scaling the new series to the 2018-based series using the Rescaling Coefficient

Year	Month	Iron & Steel Index (2023=100)	Iron & Steel Index (2018=100)
2024	Jan	95.6	$95.6 \times \mathbf{1.172} = \mathbf{112.0}$
2024	Feb	95.3	$95.3 \times \mathbf{1.172} = \mathbf{111.7}$

Chart 1: Index

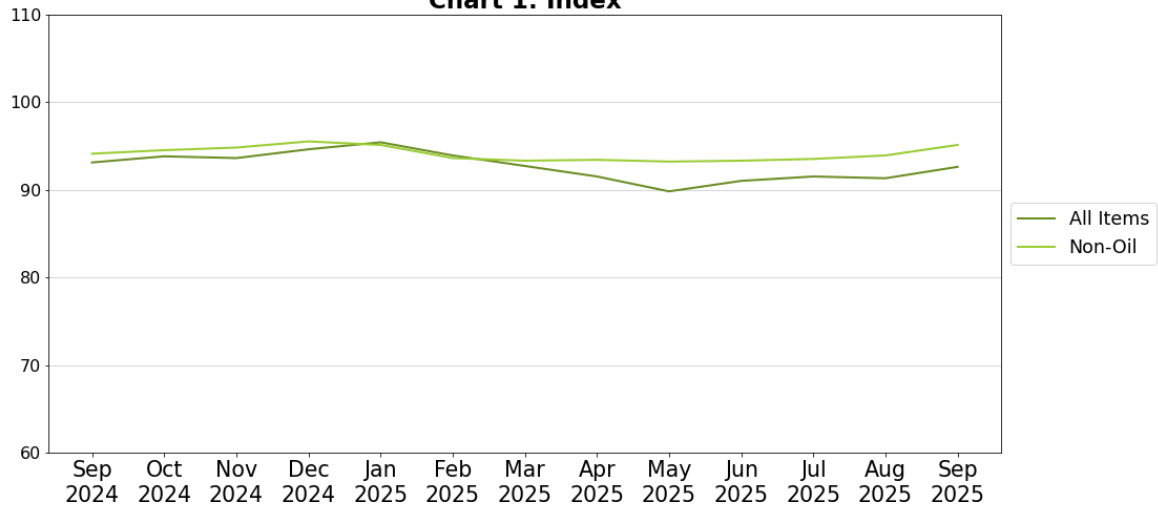


Chart 2: Month-on-Month Change

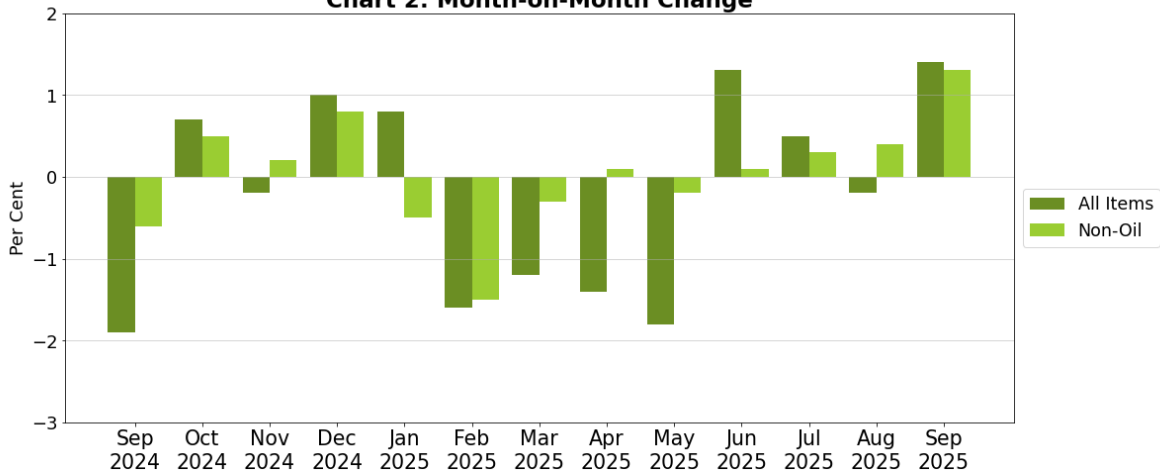
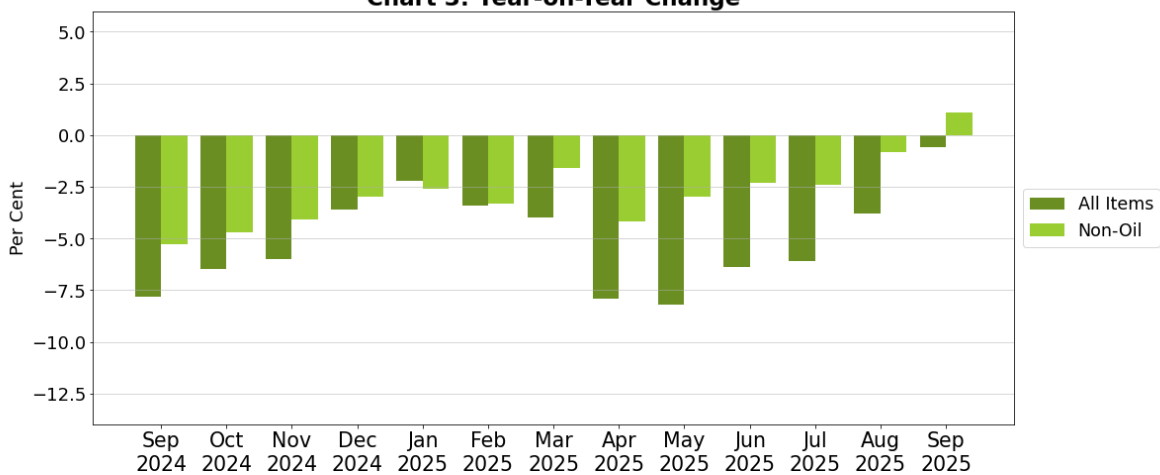


Chart 3: Year-on-Year Change

Chart 4: Index

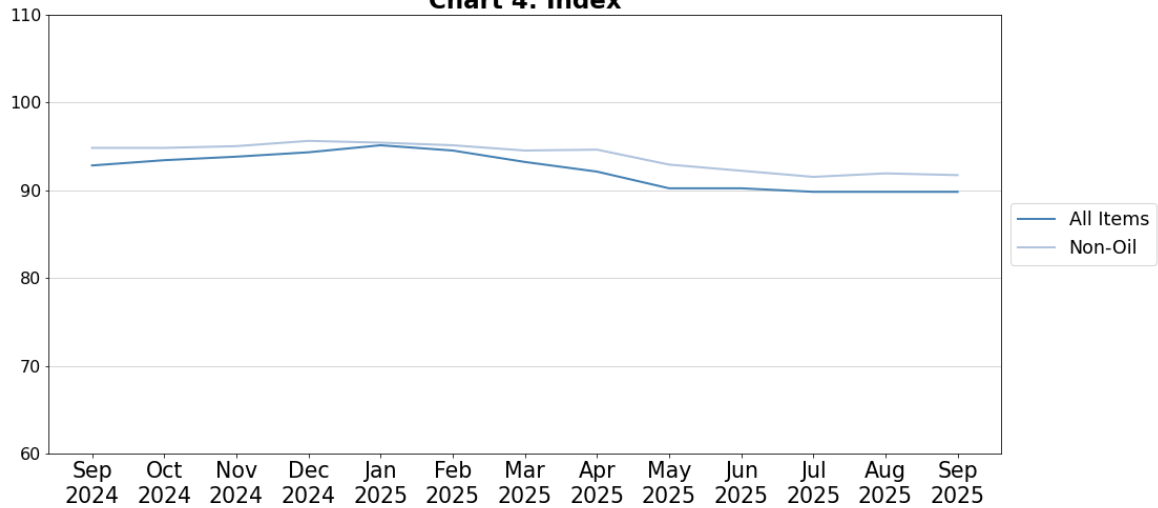


Chart 5: Month-on-Month Change

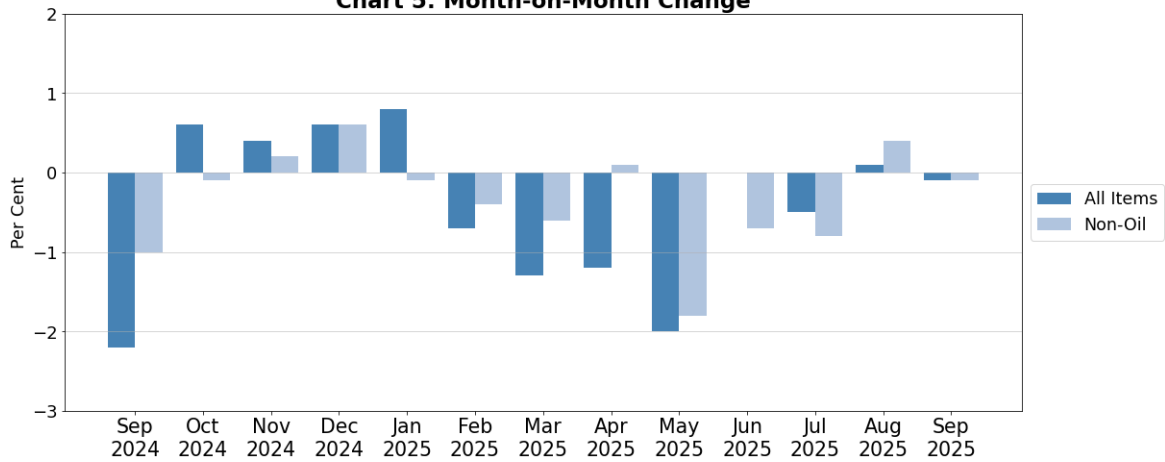


Chart 6: Year-on-Year Change

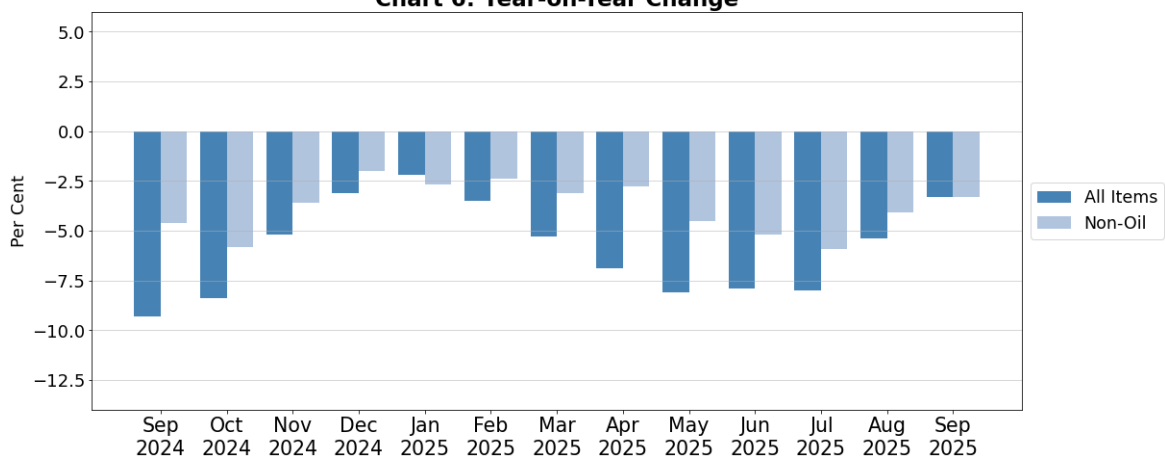
