

Singapore Manufactured Products Price Index (2023 = 100) July 2024


Month-on-Month Change



The Singapore Manufactured Products Price Index fell 2.6% in July 2024, reversing the 0.4% increase in June 2024. The Oil index gained 0.1%, following the 0.8% increase in the previous month. The Non-oil index fell 3.1% in July 2024, after the 0.3% increase in June 2024.

The decrease in the Non-oil index was mainly driven by the Machinery & Transport Equipment index, attributed to lower prices of electrical machinery apparatus, followed by the Chemicals & Chemical Products, Food & Live Animals, Miscellaneous Manufactured Articles, and Animal & Vegetable Oils indices. The declines were partially offset by increases in the Crude Materials and Manufactured Goods indices.

Year-on-Year Change




The Singapore Manufactured Products Price Index rose 0.1% in July 2024 from a year ago, following the 4.4% increase in June 2024. The Oil and Non-oil indices increased 0.1% and 0.2% respectively.

Among the Non-oil sub-indices, the increases were mainly led by the Chemicals & Chemical Products index, due to higher prices of organic chemicals, followed by the Machinery & Transport Equipment, Food & Live Animals, and Crude Materials indices. The increases were partially moderated by declines in the Miscellaneous Manufactured Articles, Manufactured Goods, Animal & Vegetable Oils, and Beverages & Tobacco indices.

Domestic Supply Price Index (2023 = 100) July 2024


Month-on-Month Change



The Domestic Supply Price Index fell 1.9% in July 2024, in contrast to the 0.1% increase in June 2024. The Oil index decreased 0.1%, extending the 0.5% decline in the previous month. The Non-oil index fell 2.6% in July 2024, after the 0.3% increase in June 2024.

The decrease in the Non-oil index was mainly driven by the Machinery & Transport Equipment index, due to lower prices of electrical machinery apparatus, followed by the Chemicals & Chemical Products, Manufactured Goods, Crude Materials, Animal & Vegetable Oils, and Beverages & Tobacco indices. The decreases were partially offset by the increase in the Food & Live Animals index.

Year-on-Year Change



The Domestic Supply Price Index rose 1.8% in July 2024 from a year ago, following the 4.4% increase in June 2024. The Oil and Non-oil indices rose 7.4% and 0.2% respectively.

Among the Non-oil sub-indices, the increases were mainly led by the Machinery & Transport Equipment index, attributed to higher prices of electrical machinery apparatus, followed by the Chemicals & Chemical Products and Food & Live Animals indices. The increases were partially moderated by decreases in the Miscellaneous Manufactured Articles, Manufactured Goods, Animal & Vegetable Oils, Beverages & Tobacco, and Crude Materials indices.

Technical Note

The **Singapore Manufactured Products Price Index (SMPPI)** monitors price changes of locally manufactured commodities. The weights of the index are derived from the distribution of local production by commodity in 2023. Ex-factory prices are obtained from principal manufacturers of the items concerned.

The **Domestic Supply Price Index (DSPI)** is designed to measure the changes in the price level of goods manufactured locally or imported which are retained for use in the domestic economy by the government, business or household sectors. For imported products, the prices refer to those paid by importers in bringing the goods into Singapore, commonly referred to as c.i.f. prices. In the case of Singapore manufactured products, the quotations used are ex-factory prices. The weight for each commodity item is proportional to the value of its total supply or availability in the domestic market in 2023.

Index Formula

The 2023-based series is compiled using the 'modified Laspeyres' formula where the weight reference period of 2022 preceded the price reference period of 2023. The geometric mean formula has been adopted in the computation of unweighted elementary aggregate price indices. The arithmetic mean formula is applied in compiling indices at higher levels of aggregation where weights of specific sub-indices are available.

Measurement of Changes in Price Indices

Change over previous month compares the index of the month with that of the preceding month. Such comparisons measure the change in the price index between two consecutive months. They serve as useful short-term indicators of the price movements.

Change over same period of previous year measures change in the index over a twelve-month period. Such comparisons compare the movement in the price index between similar months in two consecutive years.

Linking the Old 2018-Based Price Index Series to the New 2023-Based Price Index Series

The SMPPI and DSPI have been rebased from base year 2018 to base year 2023. To facilitate comparison of the historical price indices across base years, the old 2018-based series are linked to the new 2023-based series by re-scaling them via a Linked Coefficient. The Linked Coefficient is the ratio of the annual 2023-based index in 2023 to the annual 2018-based index in 2023.

Example: Linking the old Iron & Steel Index series for SMPPI prior to 2023, to the 2023-based Iron & Steel Index (2023=100)

1) Calculate the linked coefficient

Year	Iron & Steel Index (2018=100)	Iron & Steel Index (2023=100)	Linked Coefficient

2) Re-scaling the old series to the 2023-based series using the Linked Coefficient

Rescaling the 2023-Based Index Series to Previous Years

To continue the old 2018-based index series going forward in time, re-scale the new 2023-based index series to the old base year 2018 level, via a Rescaling Coefficient. The Rescaling Coefficient is the ratio of the annual 2023-based index in 2023 to the annual 2023-based index in 2018.

Example: Rescaling the new 2023-based Iron & Steel Index series for SMPPI to the 2018-based Iron & Steel Index (2018=100)

1) Calculate the rescaling coefficient

2) Re-scaling the new series to the 2018-based series using the Rescaling Coefficient







Singapore Manufactured Products Price Index (2023 = 100) July 2024








Domestic Supply Price Index (2023 = 100) July 2024






