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PREFACE

The Singapore Department of Statistics (DOS) develops national statistical standards and promotes their adoption and use in Singapore. The adoption and use of these standards in the collection, analysis and dissemination of statistics ensure consistency and comparability of data, facilitating relevant and meaningful analysis as well as data sharing.

The Singapore Standard Educational Classification (SSEC) is the national standard for classifying educational programmes and qualifications. The SSEC is used for censuses of population, household surveys and administrative databases. The SSEC makes reference to and is consistent with the basic framework and principles of the International Standard Classification of Education 1997 (ISCED 97) prepared by the United Nations Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organisation (UNESCO) Institute for Statistics (UIS). It is reviewed periodically to reflect developments in the education system as well as initiatives in workforce education and updating.

The SSEC 2010 is the second version of the SSEC and supersedes the first version. It consists of three sub-classifications – classification of level of education attending, classification of educational qualification attained and classification of field of study. This publication includes the educational codes, scope and structure of the classification. Comparison tables of SSEC 2000 and SSEC 2010 for the three sub-classifications are also included to facilitate better understanding of the changes.

The review of the SSEC was undertaken by a working group comprising representatives from several agencies, including the Singapore Department of Statistics, Ministry of Education, Ministry of Manpower, Institute of Technical Education and Singapore Workforce Development Agency. Inputs from other ministries and statutory boards have also been incorporated, where appropriate. I would like to thank all who have contributed to the review of the classification.

SINGAPORE STANDARD EDUCATIONAL CLASSIFICATION 2010

Introduction

The Singapore Standard Educational Classification (SSEC) is designed for use in the collection of data (e.g. censuses, surveys, administrative records) that requires the classification of educational programmes and qualifications. It is also used in the compilation, presentation and analysis of a wide range of statistics, including demographic, social and education statistics. To ensure the continuing relevance of the SSEC, the classification is revised and updated regularly, taking into account developments in the education system as well as initiatives in the workforce education and updating which tend to bring about new programmes and qualification/ certification systems.

2 The SSEC 2010 makes reference to and is consistent with the basic framework and principles of the International Standard Classification of Education 1997 (ISCED 97). It is developed to take into account changes in the Singapore education landscape while enhancing international comparability.

Scope and Structure of the Classification

3 The SSEC 2010 comprises of three sub-classifications:

- Classification of Level of Education Attending
- Classification of Educational Qualification Attained
- Classification of Field of Study

4 The hierarchical structure of the SSEC is defined by aggregation levels and groups which use Singapore's present education system and the formal educational qualifications currently awarded in Singapore as the basis. For educational programmes offered in Singapore based on foreign education systems, and qualifications which were awarded in Singapore in the past or those awarded overseas, the approximate equivalence to the current system and qualifications in Singapore can be used to facilitate the appropriate classification.

5 The SSEC is revised to maintain relevance with various developments in the area of education in Singapore. Apart from evolutions of the full-time education system and vocational certification system, development in recent years of the continuing education and training programmes, in terms of recognition and rigor compared to the mainstream formal education system, has also been taken into consideration when revising the SSEC. Appendix I briefly summarises the key developments in the Singapore education landscape. Appendix II provides a chart of the various programmes in Singapore's full-time education as well as continuing education and training systems.

Sub-classifications of SSEC 2010

Classification of Level of Education Attending

6 The level of education attending refers to the grade or standard of formal education that a full-time student is attending.

7 The classification for level of education attending is a two-digit hierarchical structure. Six broad levels of education can be identified:

Broad Level	Typical Age (years)	Years of Schooling

8 The six broad levels of education are broken down into more detailed categories by the grade of education at primary and secondary level, and by type of curriculum (general/vocational) at post-secondary level.

9 When classifying the detailed categories, considerations have been taken in terms of the educational content of the various educational levels. In practice, supplementary criteria for classifying educational level attending also include typical age of students attending the educational programme, duration of education, minimum entrance requirements and next typical educational level.

10 An example to illustrate the application of the criteria is the six-year Integrated Programme. While the Integrated Programme does not include a national examination at the end of secondary school, a student would typically progress from the fourth year to the fifth year to prepare for pre-university examinations such as the GCE 'A' Level Examination to be attempted at the end of the sixth year. The typical age of students in the fifth and sixth year of the Integrated Programme is 16 to 18 years old. In addition, the progression and duration within an Integrated Programme is similar to the conventional educational pathway with separate secondary and pre-university programmes. Therefore, the fifth and sixth year of the Integrated Programme would be classified as Post-Secondary (Non-Tertiary) level.

Classification of Educational Qualification Attained

11 The level of educational qualification attained refers to the grade or standard of formal education passed or the highest level of education where a certificate, diploma or degree is awarded by a formal educational institution. The educational qualification may be attained through full-time or part-time study in a structured educational programme.

12 The classification for level of educational qualification attained is a two-digit hierarchical structure. The levels of educational qualifications are categorised into nine broad groups:

Primary Qualification	Passed PSLE or equivalent
Lower Secondary Qualification	Did not pass General Certificate of Education (GCE) at 'Normal' ('N') or 'Ordinary' ('O') Level or equivalent
Secondary Qualification	Obtained at least one pass at GCE 'N' or 'O' Level or equivalent
Post-Secondary Qualification (Non- Tertiary)	Obtained at least one pass at GCE 'Advanced' ('A') Level or equivalent, or awarded at least an ITE Nitec or Higher Nitec certification or equivalent
Polytechnic Diploma	Awarded a diploma or advanced diploma by a Polytechnic
Professional Qualification	Obtained a certificate, diploma or other qualification by a professional body or vocational institution
University First Degree	Awarded first degree by a university
University Postgraduate Qualification	Awarded postgraduate diploma or degree by a university or postgraduate educational institution

13 The nine broad groups contain more detailed distinction by type of qualification (general/vocational), where appropriate.

14 In defining the broad groups of educational qualifications, the certification used in Singapore's formal education system is used as a benchmark. This has been of particular importance when identifying equivalent qualifications awarded by continuing education and training system in SSEC 2010. For qualifications awarded by professional bodies, these must be the result of the fulfilment of the requirements of structured educational programmes and passing of the appropriate standards. The levels of educational qualifications exclude skill certifications, certificates of courses attendance and honorary qualifications which are not the result of formal learning and examination by a formal educational institution or professional body.

15 The attainment of an educational qualification usually occurs when a certain grade or standard of education is passed at the end of an educational programme. Therefore, similar considerations of formal educational content, as in the case for level of education attending, have to be done when classifying the educational qualification attained. Supplementary criteria for classifying educational qualification include the typical age of education, duration of education, minimum entrance requirements and next typical level of educational qualification.

Classification of Field of Study

16 The field of study refers to the principal discipline, branch or subject matter of study that leads to the award of the qualification attained at polytechnic or university levels. Vocational qualifications at post-secondary level may also be classified by field of study.

17 The classification for field of study is a four-digit hierarchical structure comprising three levels, following the ISCED 97. The levels of this hierarchy are termed as broad fields (two-digit), narrow fields (three-digit) and detailed fields (four-digit). Broad fields constitute the highest level of aggregation in the field of study classification. Currently there are 14 broad fields. Moving down the hierarchy, there are 59 three-digit narrow fields and 238 four-digit detailed fields of study.

18 The 14 broad fields of study are listed as follows:

- 01 Education
- 02 Fine & Applied Arts
- 03 Humanities & Social Sciences
- 04 Mass Communication & Information Science
- 05 Business & Administration
- 06 Law
- 07 Natural, Physical, Chemical & Mathematical Sciences
- 08 Health Sciences
- 09 Information Technology
- 10 Architecture & Building
- 11 Engineering Sciences
- 12 Engineering, Manufacturing & Related Trades

- 13 Services
- 99 Other Fields

19 The following illustrates the formation of the hierarchy of the field of study classification from the broad field to the detailed field, using 'Human Resource Management' as an example:

At the three or four-digit levels, the digit '9' that appears in the last digit position denotes residual fields of study grouped at the respective level of detail.

In classifying an educational programme by the field of study, the main consideration is the theoretical content of the programme. In the case of inter- or multidisciplinary programme, i.e. programme which combine two fields of study, the 'majority rule' should be applied. Based on the majority rule, an inter- or multi-disciplinary programme should be classified to the field of study which most time is spent on. In practice, the number of modular credits may be used in place of time spent on a field of study.

Comparison with SSEC 2000

Classification of Level of Education Attending

By comparison, the number of the highest aggregation (one-digit) groups for the classification of level of education attending has been reduced from ten in SSEC 2000 to eight in SSEC 2010. This is mainly the result of re-classifying general and vocational educational programmes of similar educational level within the same onedigit group. The re-classification more clearly groups educational programmes of similar level together and distinguishes educational programmes at the more detailed two-digit categories where general and vocational educational programmes can be separately identified. The comparison is illustrated in the following table.

In SSEC 2010, the phrase "Upper Secondary" has been replaced with the term "Post-Secondary". This is to further align with the terminology used in ISCED 97.

At the two-digit level, the number of educational level categories has been reduced from 36 in SSEC 2000 to 34 in SSEC 2010. This is the result of a more streamlined New ITE Certification System which more clearly groups and demarcates the level of training into three categories only. A detailed comparison of the level of education attending classification between 2010 and 2000 is presented in Appendix III. Classification of Educational Qualification Attained

Due to the close relation between educational level attending and the educational qualification attained, the comparisons between SSEC 2010 and 2000 in the preceding section for the educational level attending classification also apply to the classification of educational qualification attained. Nonetheless, the number of one-digit groups remains unchanged while the number of two-digit categories under the educational qualification attained classification increased from 31 in SSEC 2000 to 44 in SSEC 2010¹. The following table compares the one-digit groups of SSEC 2010 and 2000:

Due to the recognition and rigor of the continuing education and training programmes under the Singapore Workforce Skills Qualifications (WSQ) system, the SSEC 2010 incorporates an additional group – "Other Education (Non-Award Courses/Degree)" – to cater to users' needs to classify educational attainment within the WSQ system. In addition, full qualifications awarded based on the WSQ system have been classified, at the two-digit level, to the equivalent benchmarked educational qualifications of the formal education system.

Classification of Field of Study

In the SSEC 2010 field of study classification, the numbers of narrow fields and detailed fields have increased from 57 to 59 and 230 to 238, respectively, while the number of broad fields remains unchanged. The two new narrow fields consist of Trainer Training (013) and Complementary Therapies (087). The former is identified as a field of study which curriculum content is focused on continuing education and training, and which is appropriate to be distinguished from that of Teacher Training (011). Separately, the emergence of formal education in the field of complementary therapies such as Traditional Chinese Medicine (TCM) and acupuncture in the formal education system provides the basis to classify Complementary Therapies within a separate and unique narrow field. Two new detailed fields of study were also created in line with the newly created narrow fields for Trainer Training and Complementary Therapies.

The narrow field of Social Work (034) has been expanded in scope and called, "Social, Sports and Community Services", to classify more detailed fields of study in social and community services as well as sports and recreation. In addition, the field of Actuarial Science has been re-classified from Mathematics & Statistics (074) to the narrow field of Banking, Insurance and Financial Services (053) in response to the greater orientation of the curriculum content towards applications in the fields of study of insurance, finance and banking, observed locally and internationally.

The table below lists the fields of study which are assigned unique codes at the four-digit level in SSEC 2010.

30 The number of detailed fields has increased mainly due to the splitting of existing detailed fields into more specific fields and addition of new fields. The additional detailed fields allow users to classify certain fields of study in greater granularity. For example, the detailed field of Accountancy (0521) has been further broken down into more specialised fields of Auditing (0522) and Tax Accounting

(0524). On the other hand, the growth in demand for knowledge and skills in the realm of information and technology security has also provided the basis to include a new detailed field for Infocomm Security Management (0917).

A table of comparison for the field of study classification between SSEC 2010 and 2000 is available in Appendix V.

Practical Considerations in the Design and Usage of SSEC 2010

32 The design of SSEC 2010 has remained largely similar to SSEC 2000. A major consideration in retaining the design of the SSEC is the requirements for classifying data collected in the Census of Population 2010 and the extent of details that could be obtained from households. For example, there is no distinction between professional qualifications awarded by accredited institutions and those that are not accredited. Respondents are generally not able to provide sufficient information for such distinction either for themselves or on behalf of household members. Similar experience would be encountered for households covered in sample household surveys like the Labour Force Survey.

Appendix I: Recent Developments in the Singapore Education Landscape

Recent Developments in the Singapore Education Landscape

Integrated Programme

The Integrated Programme was first introduced in 2004 as a programme which provides an additional education choice for students who are clearly university-bound, and could do well in a less structured environment. The programme spans secondary and junior college education without intermediate national examinations at the end of secondary school. Hence, time previously used to prepare students for the GCE 'O' Level Examination would be used to engage them in broader learning experience. Selected schools could also offer alternative curricula and qualifications (eg International Baccalaureate and High School Diploma).

New Institute of Technical Education Certification System

The New Institute of Technical Education (ITE) Certification System was introduced in July 2002 to enable ITE to better respond to emerging industry manpower needs requiring certifications in the new knowledge-based economy, especially the service sector. The new certification system is applicable to post-secondary technical educational programmes as well as ITE skills training courses. It is more generic compared to its predecessor and defines ITE certifications by level of training while providing a more visible progression path for students and adult learners to maximise learning within the ITE certification framework.

Customised Vocational Programme

Schools that provide customised and vocational curriculum have been established since 2007. These schools provide enhanced vocational programmes that cater to a small group of students who have completed their primary education. Graduates of these schools can progress to further education at mainstream vocational/technical institutes, employment in the labour market or apprenticeship with industries.


Continuing Education and Training: Singapore Workforce Skills Qualification System

WSQ, or the Singapore Workforce Skills Qualifications, is a national credentialing system that trains, develops, assesses and recognises adult workers for competencies to enhance their employability. Based on standards developed by the Singapore Workforce Development Agency (WDA) and various industries, WSQ ensures workers acquire skills needed by employers at the workplace. With clear progression pathways, workers can also use WSQ to upgrade their skills and plan their careers. As training and assessment are competency-based, workers have to demonstrate the right competencies before they are certified. WSQ is accessible to all workers, as its entry criteria are skills and knowledge, not solely based on formal qualifications. The quality of WSQ is assured by WDA, from the

development of competency standards, accreditation of training providers to the award of its qualifications.
