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PREFACE

The Singapore Department of Statistics (DOS) develops national statistical standards and promotes their adoption and use in Singapore. The adoption and use of these standards in the collection, analysis and dissemination of statistics ensure consistency and comparability of data, facilitating relevant and meaningful analysis as well as data sharing.

The Singapore Standard Educational Classification (SSEC) is the national standard for classifying educational programmes and qualifications. The SSEC is used for censuses of population, household surveys and administrative databases. The SSEC makes reference to and is consistent with the basic framework and principles of the International Standard Classification of Education (ISCED) 2011 and the ISCED Fields of Education and Training (ISCED-F) 2013 developed by the United Nations Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organisation (UNESCO) Institute for Statistics (UIS). It is reviewed periodically to reflect developments in the education system as well as initiatives in workforce education and upgrading.

The SSEC 2015 is the third edition of the SSEC and supersedes the previous editions. It consists of three sub-classifications – classification of level of education attending, classification of educational qualification attained and classification of field of study.

The review of the SSEC was undertaken by a working group comprising representatives from several agencies, including the Singapore Department of Statistics, Council for Private Education, Ministry of Education, Ministry of Manpower, Institute of Technical Education and Singapore Workforce Development Agency. Inputs from other stakeholders have also been incorporated, where appropriate. I would like to thank all who have contributed to the review of the classification.

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Introduction

The Singapore Standard Educational Classification (SSEC) is designed for use in the collection of data (e.g. censuses, surveys, administrative records) that requires the classification of educational programmes and qualifications. It is also used in the compilation, presentation and analysis of a wide range of statistics, including demographic, social and education statistics. To ensure the continuing relevance of the SSEC, the classification is updated regularly, taking into account changes in the international standards, developments in the education system as well as initiatives in educating, training and upgrading the workforce which could bring about new programmes and qualification/ certification systems.

2 The SSEC 2015 makes reference to the basic framework and principles of the International Standard Classification of Education (ISCED) 2011 and ISCED Fields of Education and Training classification (ISCED-F) 2013. The SSEC is revised to take into account changes in Singapore's education landscape to maintain relevance to the local context, as well as changes in international standards to enhance international comparability. Apart from changes in the full-time education system and vocational certification system, developments in the continuing education and training programmes have also been taken into consideration when revising the SSEC.

Scope and Structure of the Classification

3 The SSEC 2015 comprises three sub-classifications:

- Classification of Level of Education Attending
- Classification of Educational Qualification Attained
- Classification of Field of Study

4 The hierarchical structure of the SSEC is defined by aggregating categories representing various educational programmes in Singapore's present education system and the educational qualifications currently awarded in Singapore. For educational programmes offered in Singapore based on foreign education systems, and qualifications which were awarded in Singapore in the past or those awarded overseas, the proxy equivalence to the current system and qualifications in Singapore can be used to determine the appropriate classification. Appendix I provides a chart of the key programmes in Singapore's full-time education as well as continuing education and training systems.

Sub-classifications of SSEC 2015

Classification of Level of Education Attending

5 The level of education attending refers to the grade or standard of formal education that a full-time student is attending.

6 The classification for level of education attending is a two-digit hierarchical structure. Six broad levels of education can be identified:

7 The various broad levels of education are broken down into more detailed categories such as grade of education at the primary and secondary level, and orientation of the programme (general/vocational) at post-secondary (non-tertiary) level.

8 When classifying programmes into the detailed categories, one of the main consideration is the educational content of the programme at a particular educational level. In practice, supplementary criteria for classifying the level of education attending also include typical age of students attending the educational programme, duration of education, minimum entrance requirements and next typical educational level.

9 An example to illustrate the application of the criteria is the six-year Integrated Programme. While the Integrated Programme does not include a national examination at the end of secondary level, a student progressing from the fourth year to the fifth year would typically prepare for pre-university examinations such as the GCE 'A' Level Examination to be attempted at the end of the sixth year. The typical age of students in the fifth and sixth year of the Integrated Programme is 16 to 18 years old. In addition, the progression and duration within an Integrated Programme is similar to the conventional educational pathway with separate secondary and pre-university programmes. Therefore, the fifth and sixth year of the Integrated Programme will be classified as Post-Secondary (Non-Tertiary) level.

Classification of Educational Qualification Attained

10 The level of educational qualification attained refers to the grade or standard of education passed or the highest level of education where a certificate, diploma or degree is awarded by an educational or training institution. The educational qualification may be attained through full-time or part-time study in a structured educational programme.

11 The classification for level of educational qualification attained is a two-digit hierarchical structure. The levels of educational qualifications are categorised into ten broad groups, each denoted by a digit from '0' to '9' at the 1-digit level. The general guideline for attainment of a particular level of education is as follows:

Primary Qualification	Passed PSLE or equivalent
Lower Secondary Qualification	Did not pass General Certificate of Education (GCE) at 'Normal' ('N') or 'Ordinary' ('O') Level or equivalent
Secondary Qualification	Obtained at least one pass at GCE 'N' or 'O' Level or equivalent
Post-Secondary Qualification (Non-Tertiary)	Obtained at least one pass at GCE 'Advanced' ('A') Level or equivalent, or awarded at least an ITE Nitec or Higher Nitec certification or equivalent
Polytechnic Diploma	Awarded a diploma or advanced diploma by a Polytechnic
Professional Qualification	Obtained a certificate, diploma or other qualification by a professional body or vocational institution
Bachelor's or Equivalent	Awarded bachelor's degree or equivalent by a university
Postgraduate Diploma/ Certificate Qualification (Excluding Master's and Doctorate)	Awarded postgraduate diploma or certificate by a university or postgraduate educational or training institution

12 The ten broad groups contain more detailed distinction by orientation of the programme or the specific type of qualifications typically awarded in Singapore's context.

13 In defining the broad groups of educational qualifications, the certification used in Singapore's mainstream education system is used as a benchmark. This is an important consideration in identifying equivalent qualifications awarded by continuing education and training institutions. Qualifications awarded by professional bodies must be the result of fulfilling the requirements of structured educational programmes and

passing the appropriate standards. The levels of educational qualifications exclude certificates of courses attendance and honorary qualifications which are not the result of structured learning and examination by an educational/training institution or professional body.

14 The attainment of an educational qualification usually occurs when a certain grade or standard of education is passed at the end of an educational programme. Therefore, the same considerations of educational content are applicable, as in the case for level of education attending, when classifying the educational qualification attained. Supplementary criteria for classifying educational qualification include the typical age of education, duration of education, minimum entrance requirements and next typical level of educational qualification.

15 For instance, using the example of the six-year Integrated Programme, a student in the programme who had passed the relevant examinations at the end of Year 4 and had been promoted to Year 5 will be classified in code 39 "Other certificates or qualifications of equivalent standard (secondary)" if there is a need to classify the educational qualification attained at this juncture, given that the progression and duration within an Integrated Programme is similar to the conventional educational pathway with separate secondary and pre-university programmes.

Classification of Field of Study

16 The field of study refers to the principal discipline, branch or subject matter of study that leads to the award of the qualification attained at polytechnic or university levels. Vocational qualifications at post-secondary level may also be classified by field of study, where applicable.

17 The classification for field of study is a four-digit hierarchical structure comprising three levels - broad field (two-digit), narrow field (three-digit) and detailed field (four-digit). The broad field constitutes the highest level of aggregation in the field of study classification, with 15 categories in total. Moving down the hierarchy, there are 61 three-digit narrow fields and 248 four-digit detailed fields of study.

18 The 15 broad fields of study are as follows:

- 00 Generic Programmes and Qualifications
- 01 Education
- 02 Fine & Applied Arts
- 03 Humanities & Social Sciences
- 04 Mass Communication & Information Science
- 05 Business & Administration
- 06 Law

- 07 Natural, Physical, Chemical & Mathematical Sciences
- 08 Health Sciences
- 09 Information Technology
- 10 Architecture, Building & Real Estate
- 11 Engineering Sciences
- 12 Engineering, Manufacturing & Related Trades
- 13 Services
- 99 Other Fields

19 The following illustrates the hierarchical structure of the field of study classification from the broad field to the detailed field, using 'Human Resource Management' as an example:

20 At the three and four-digit levels, the digit '9' that appears in the last digit position denotes residual fields of study grouped at the respective level of detail.

21 In classifying an educational programme by the field of study, the main consideration is the theoretical content of the programme. In the case of inter- or multi-disciplinary programme, i.e. programme which combines two fields of study, the 'majority rule' should be applied. Based on the majority rule, an inter- or multi-disciplinary programme should be classified to the field of study where most time is spent on (i.e. the leading/main field of study). In practice, the number of modular credits may be used in place of time spent on a field of study. In line with the guidelines provided by ISCED-F 2013, inter-disciplinary programmes with more than one leading broad field should be classified in the broad field listed first in the title (or in the curriculum or syllabus if not listed in the title) of the programme or qualification.

Comparison with SSEC 2010

Classification of Level of Education Attending

22 The classification of level of education attending in the SSEC 2015 remains broadly similar to the structure in SSEC 2010, with minor modifications made to the description of certain categories. The comparison is shown in the following table.

23 In SSEC 2015, the description "University First Degree" at the one-digit level has been replaced with the term "Bachelor's or equivalent". This is to further align with the terminology used in ISCED 2011. To better reflect the difference in rigor and duration of various programmes at the postgraduate level, separate categories have been created for the postgraduate diplomas and certificates versus the other qualifications (i.e. master's and doctorate) at the broad level.

24 At the two-digit level, the number of categories remains the same, with amendments to the descriptions of certain categories. The descriptions of code 21 to 25 have been renamed as "Secondary X" to broaden the scope and accommodate the specialised schools in Singapore offering pre-vocational programmes at the secondary level. The focus of such programmes is on hands-on and practical learning, leading to a combination of academic and vocational qualifications.

Classification of Educational Qualification Attained

25 As the structure of the level of education attending and the educational qualification attained classifications are closely linked, most of the changes in descriptions for the level of education attending classification also apply to the classification of educational qualification attained. At the two-digit level, a new code for “Pre-primary/Kindergarten Education” is added to capture qualifications attained at this level. The following table compares the one-digit groups of SSEC 2015 and 2010:

26 With growing emphasis on the Continuing Education and Training (CET) programmes in Singapore, such as the programmes under the Singapore Workforce Skills Qualifications (WSQ) system and bite-sized learning and skills-upgrading modules, the scope and description of the category “Other Education (Non-Award Courses/Miscellaneous)” is refined to “Modular Certification (Non-Award Courses/Non-full Qualifications)” to better cater to users’ needs to classify educational attainment/skills upgrading within the system. Modular programmes such as the polytechnic post-diploma certificate programmes have been reclassified here. This category is denoted by the letter ‘N’. Similar to the SSEC 2010, full qualifications awarded based on the WSQ system will be classified and benchmarked to the equivalent educational qualifications in the mainstream education system

Classification of Field of Study

27 In the SSEC 2015 field of study classification, the number of broad fields increased from 14 to 15; narrow fields from 59 to 61 and detailed fields from 238 to 248. A new broad field for “Generic Programmes and Qualifications” has been introduced to account for broad generic programmes and qualifications which cover a broad range of subjects with little or no specialisation in a particular field or fields, in line with the ISCED 2011. At the detailed field level, codes for “Basic Programmes and Qualifications”, “Literacy and Numeracy” and “Personal Skills and Development” have been included under this new broad field.

28 New detailed fields for “Games Design” and “Animation & Visual Effects” have been added to the narrow field of Design & Applied Arts (022) to reflect the prevalence of programmes in these fields being offered by our Institutes of Higher Learning (IHLs). The field of “Student/Youth Care” has also been split to create separate categories for “Student Care” and “Youth Care” given that the focus of the programmes are quite different, with the former covering aspects like supervised care for children before/after school and the latter covering issues like engaging at-risk youths and mentoring youths. A new detailed field has also been created for “Pastry Making & Baking Skills” under the narrow field Food Services (132) to reflect the specialised programmes/courses in baking and pastry making offered by some of the schools in Singapore.

29 The table below lists the fields of study which are assigned unique codes at the four-digit level in SSEC 2015.

30 At the broader level, the field of “Veterinary Sciences” has been reclassified from 08 “Health Sciences” in SSEC 2010 to 07 “Natural, Physical, Chemical & Mathematical Sciences” in SSEC 2015, in line with the treatment in the ISCED-F 2013, where the broad field devoted to “(Human) Health and Welfare” is kept separate from other sciences.

31 A table of comparison for the field of study classification between SSEC 2015 and 2010 is given in Appendix IV.

Practical Considerations in the Design and Usage of SSEC 2015

32 The design of SSEC 2015 has remained largely similar to SSEC 2010. A major consideration in retaining the design of the SSEC is the requirements for collecting and classifying data collected in sample household and labour force surveys and the extent of details that could be obtained from respondents. For example, there is no distinction between professional qualifications awarded by accredited institutions and those that are not accredited. Respondents are generally not able to provide sufficient information for such distinction either for themselves or on behalf of household members.

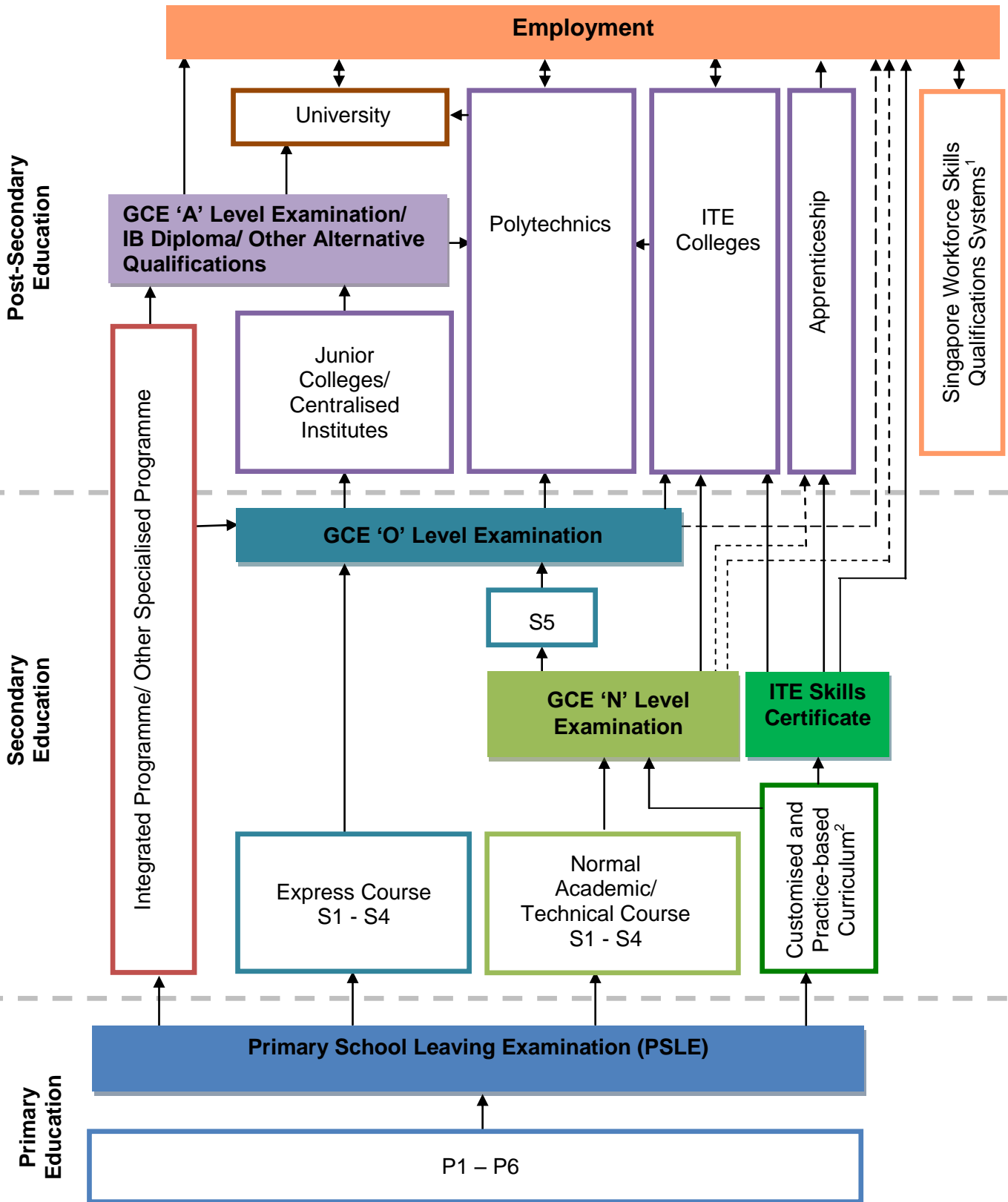

Key Singapore statistics are available via the following sections:

- **Statistics**
which provides access to the latest statistical findings of DOS as well as statistics compiled by Research and Statistics Units (RSUs) in ministries and statutory boards.
- **News**
which provides a listing of the news released by DOS and RSUs.
- **Publications**
which presents the latest editions of DOS' publications, papers and articles.
- **Browse by Themes**
which presents official statistics compiled by DOS and RSUs in the various ministries and statutory boards according to themes. Within each theme, relevant statistics and related press releases, publications and references are provided.

Statistical resources are available via:

- **Publication and Papers**
which lists the latest editions of publications released by DOS according to statistical domains at <http://www.singstat.gov.sg/publications/publications-and-papers>. All softcopy DOS publications are available for free downloading. Statistical tables of DOS publications in Excel format are also available.
- **Advance Release Calendar**
which provides a six months ahead advance release calendar of key statistical indicators.

The website also provides a convenient gateway to international statistical websites under the "Methodologies & Standards" section:

- **Guide to International Statistics**
which provides hyperlinks to international databases and classifications, as well as websites of international bodies and other national statistical offices.
- **IMF Dissemination Standards Bulletin Board**
which provides metadata about Singapore's key indicators in the real, fiscal, financial and external sectors, including dissemination practices and information about pre-release access of current indicators.
