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PREFACE

The Singapore Department of Statistics is responsible for developing national statistical standards and promoting the adoption of these standards. The *Singapore Standard Occupational Classification (SSOC)* is widely used in Singapore as the national standard for classifying information on occupations collected in statistical surveys and censuses of population as well as in administrative systems. The adoption of a common framework for classification benefits both producers and users of data. Among producers, data-sharing is facilitated by the use of the same classification, while users benefit from the availability of consistent and comparable data for analysis.

The SSOC adopts the basic framework and principles of the International Standard Classification of Occupations 1988 (ISCO-88). It is reviewed and updated periodically to reflect changes in the employment structure and the emergence of new occupations in Singapore. This publication is the fourth edition of the SSOC and supersedes previous editions. It describes the scope and structure of the classification as well as the principles adopted. Brief descriptions of the groups and an alphabetical index are included to facilitate understanding and use of the classification.

The first draft of the SSOC 2000 was prepared by a planning group comprising representatives from the Ministry of Manpower, Economic Development Board, Monetary Authority of Singapore, Institute of Technical Education and Infocomm Development Authority of Singapore, with inputs from other government ministries and statutory boards. This first draft provided a valuable working document for the review of the Singapore Department of Statistics. I would like to express my appreciation all who have, in one way or other, contributed towards the classification.

INTRODUCTION

The Singapore Standard Occupational Classification (SSOC) is the national standard for classifying statistical information on occupations to ensure data comparability and consistency. It is designed for use in censuses of population and all other surveys where occupation data are collected. To maintain the currency and relevance of SSOC, the classification is revised regularly, taking into account economic, technological and organisational changes which tend to bring about emergence of new types of work as well as redundancy of some existing jobs.

The SSOC 2000 was prepared as part of the preparations for the 2000 Census of Population. It was updated from the SSOC 1990, which was essentially based on the International Standard Classification of Occupations 1988 (ISCO-88), published by the International Labour Organisation (ILO). Comments and suggestions from government ministries, departments and statutory boards were incorporated, wherever appropriate.

SCOPE AND NATURE OF CLASSIFICATION

The SSOC 2000 is a classification of occupations according to the type of work performed. Its primary objective is to classify in detail the occupations of the civilian working population, but with provisions for the collective classification of those in the armed services and the foreign diplomatic personnel. It is not applicable to the economically inactive population such as housewives, full-time students, retired persons and voluntary social workers.

STRUCTURE OF CLASSIFICATION

The SSOC 2000 comprises five levels of aggregation, namely Major Group, Sub-major Group, Minor Group, Unit Group and Occupation.

A numerical five-digit coding system is used to distinguish the different levels of classification. The structure and the notation system allow users the flexibility to tabulate, analyse and publish data according to the level of detail required. The basic arrangement of the SSOC 2000 is as follows:

Major Groups (one-digit codes) are the highest level of aggregation and represent very broad fields of work rather than specific types of work performed. There are 10 major groups, such as Professionals, Clerical workers, Production craftsmen and related workers, etc. They are each identified by their corresponding one-digit code ie 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, 9 or 0 as the case may be.

Sub-major Groups (two-digit codes) are the sub-divisions of the major groups eg Physical, Mathematical and Engineering Science Professionals (Sub-major Group 21) within the Major Group 2 'Professionals'. There are 32 sub-major groups corresponding to their respective two-digit codes.

Minor Groups (three-digit codes) are the groups within the sub-major groups eg Architects, Engineers and Related Professionals (Minor Group 214) within the Sub-major Group 21. There are 119 such groups being identified by their respective three-digit codes.

Unit Groups (four-digit codes) are sub-divisions of the minor groups. The classification of groups is finer and more detailed than that for the major groups eg Civil Engineers (Unit Group 2142) within the Minor Group 214. There are 274 unit groups, each identified by the corresponding four-digit code.

Occupations (five-digit codes) are sub-divisions of the unit groups. There are 993 occupations, each identified by a five-digit code.

The following example illustrates the breakdowns of several distinct occupations from the highest level of aggregation (one-digit) to the lowest level of detail (five-digit).

At a given level of aggregation including the lowest fifth digit, each important occupation or occupational group is given a distinct numeric code of the appropriate number of digits. The numeral 9 in the last digit of a two-, three-, four- or five-digit code designates all other miscellaneous occupational groups “not elsewhere classified” (“nec”). These residual categories usually comprise a variety of the less common types of occupational groups which are not significant enough to justify a separate code. As such, they are collectively placed in a separate category so that no occupational groups, however small or insignificant, are left out of the classification scheme.

PRINCIPLES OF CLASSIFICATION

The basic principle used in the classification of occupations in the SSOC 2000 is according to the main type of work performed. Persons who perform the same principal tasks are considered as doing the same type of work and classified under the same occupational group, irrespective of the level of authority, responsibility, work experience, skills and qualifications. Hence, while the senior or more experienced workers in a particular occupation have the subsidiary duty of supervising other workers in the same occupation, such additional supervisory task do not change the basic nature of work done. Chief chemist is therefore classified among chemist (unit group 2113) and chief architect among architects and town planners (unit group 2141).

In defining the broad types of work in the SSOC 2000, the basic concept of skill is adopted. Skill refers to the ability to carry out the tasks and duties of an occupation and has, for the purposes of the SSOC 2000, the following two dimensions:

- a **Skill level**, which is a function of the complexity and range of the tasks and duties involved; and
- b **Skill specialisation**, defined by the field of knowledge required, the tools and machinery used, the materials worked on or with, as well as the kinds of goods and services produced.

There are basically four broad skill levels which can be defined in operational terms as follows:

- a The **first skill level** is defined as requiring primary or no education.
- b The **second skill level** is defined as requiring secondary or post secondary education.

- c The **third skill level** is defined as requiring tertiary education leading to an award not equivalent to a first university degree.
- d The **fourth skill level** is defined as requiring tertiary education leading to a university or postgraduate university degree, or the equivalent.

The use of educational categories to define the four skill levels does not imply that the skills necessary to perform the tasks and duties of a given job can be acquired only through formal education. The skills may be, and often are, acquired through informal training and experience. In addition, the focus is on the skills required to carry out the tasks and duties of an occupation and not on whether a worker in a particular occupation is more or less skilled than another worker in the same occupation.

The major groups of the SSOC 2000 can be categorised according to the four skill levels:

- a Occupations in Major Group 2 ‘Professionals’ require the fourth skill level as defined above.
- b Occupations in Major Group 3 ‘Associate Professionals And Technicians’ require the third skill level as defined above.
- c Occupations in Major Groups 4 ‘Clerical Workers’, 5 ‘Service Workers and Shop and Market Sales Workers’, 6 ‘Agricultural and Fishery Workers’, 7 ‘Production Craftsmen and Related Workers’, and 8 ‘Plant and Machine Operators and Assemblers’ require the second skill level as defined above.

- d Occupations in Major Group 9 ‘Cleaners, Labourers and Related Workers’ require the first skill level as defined above.

The concept of skill level is not applicable to Major Group 1 ‘Legislators, Senior Officials and Managers’ and Major Group X ‘Workers Not Classifiable by Occupation’.

In general, occupations are classified in progressively finer detail within each major group according to skill specialisation.

In classifying occupations by skill level and skill specialisation, two priority rules can be applied:

- a In cases where the tasks and duties performed require different skill levels, the job should be classified according to those tasks and duties which require the highest level of skill. For example, ‘accounts clerk cum receptionist’ should be classified in 41302 (Ledger and Accounts Clerk) and ‘finance and administrative manager’ in 12341 (Budgeting and Financial Accounting Manager).
- b In cases where the tasks and duties are associated with different stages of the process of producing and distributing goods and services, the tasks and duties related to the **production** stages should take priority over associated tasks and duties, such as those related to the sale and marketing of the same goods, their transportation or the management of the production process. For example, a worker who bakes bread and pastries and then sells them should be classified as a baker, not as a sales worker.

COMPARISON WITH THE SSOC 1990

The basic structure of the SSOC 2000 remains essentially the same as that in the SSOC 1990. However, with significant occupational changes brought about by changes in the economic structure and activities, several modifications were made to the occupational groups to reflect these recent developments.

A redefinition of job scope as well as changes in the job requirements over the last ten years have resulted in a need to reorganise some of the occupational groups. Primary school teachers have been moved from Major Group 3 to Major Group 2 in SSOC 2000. With the automation of sorting and other clerical aspects of the postal services, mail distribution workers are reclassified as service workers under Major Group 5 in SSOC 2000.

A number of new titles are added in this latest classification. Examples include business development manager, network systems and data communication analyst, multi-media programmer, network and computer systems administrator, information technology auditor, biomedical engineer, materials engineer, conservator (art works), tool/mould designer, quality assurance technician, medical diagnostic radiographer, radiation therapist, sonographer, telemarketer, refractory worker and mould lofter.

Some of the occupations in the SSOC 1990 are too detailed and require very precise occupation descriptions which may not be attainable in practice. For practical reasons, these occupations are consolidated into a general occupation title in SSOC 2000. For example, the SSOC 1990 contains detailed breakdown of the unit group for chemists into 'Chemist (General)', 'Organic chemist', 'Inorganic chemist', 'Physical chemist', 'Analytical chemist' and 'Other chemist'. Since adequate information on the specific chemical process is not available, these detailed breakdowns at 5-digit level are recombined into a single 5-digit code 'Chemist'.

Occupations which are insignificant or of little relevance are no longer given separate titles in the SSOC 2000. Instead, they are reclassified into the residual occupational title. For example, railway construction engineer is now classified under 21429 'Other civil and structural engineers' and well puller

(Petroleum and gas well) under 81119 'Other well drillers and borers and related workers'.

On the whole, the SSOC 2000 contains fewer categories at 4-and 5-digit levels as compared with SSOC 1990. The number of minor groups and occupations has been reduced from 314 and 1,116 in SSOC 1990 to 274 and 993 in SSOC 2000 respectively.

SUMMARY OF MAJOR GROUPS

LEGISLATORS, SENIOR OFFICIALS AND MANAGERS

This major group includes occupations in the public sector where the job holders' main tasks consist of determining and formulating government policies, enacting laws and public regulations, overseeing their implementation, representing the government, or planning, directing and co-ordinating the policies and activities of ministries, departments and statutory boards. Also included here are occupations in the private sector where the job holders' main tasks consist of formulating the strategies and policies of enterprises and own account business units, implementing the policies and/or running the affairs of the business concerns. Reference to skill level has not been made in defining the scope of this major group. It has been divided into 8 minor groups, reflecting differences in tasks associated with different areas of authority and different types of enterprises and organisations.

PROFESSIONALS

This major group includes occupations where the main tasks require a high level of specialised knowledge and ability in the fields of physical and life sciences, or social sciences and humanities. The main tasks consist of increasing the existing stock of knowledge, applying scientific and artistic concepts and theories to the solution of problems, and teaching about the foregoing in a systematic manner. Most occupations in this major group require skills at the fourth skill level. This major group has been divided into 20 minor groups, reflecting differences in tasks associated with different fields of knowledge and specialisation.

ASSOCIATE PROFESSIONALS AND TECHNICIANS

This major group includes occupations where the main tasks require technical knowledge and ability in one or more fields of physical and life sciences, or social sciences and humanities. The main tasks consist of carrying out technical work connected with the application of concepts and operational methods in the above-mentioned fields, and in teaching at certain educational levels. Most occupations in this major group require skills at the third skill level. This major group has been divided into 21 minor groups, reflecting differences in tasks associated with different fields of knowledge and specialisation.

CLERICAL WORKERS

This major group includes occupations where the main tasks require the knowledge and ability necessary to organise, store, check, transcribe, compute and retrieve information. The main tasks consist of performing secretarial duties, operating word processors and other office machines, recording and computing numerical data, and performing a number of customer-oriented clerical duties, mostly in connection with money-handling operations and appointments. Most occupations in this major group require skills at the second skill level. This major group has been divided into 8 minor groups, reflecting differences in tasks associated with different areas of specialisation.

SERVICE WORKERS AND SHOP AND MARKET SALES WORKERS

This major group includes occupations where the main tasks require the knowledge and ability necessary to provide personal and protective services, and to sell goods in shops or at markets. The main tasks consist of providing services related to travel, housekeeping, catering, personal care, protection of individuals and property, and to maintaining law and order, mail distribution or selling goods in shops or at markets. Most occupations in this major group require skills at the second skill level. This major group has been divided into 9 minor groups, reflecting differences in tasks associated with different areas of specialisation.

AGRICULTURAL AND FISHERY WORKERS

This major group includes occupations where the main tasks require the knowledge and ability necessary to produce farm and fishery products. The main tasks consist of growing crops, breeding animals, catching or rearing fish, conserving forests and, selling products to purchasers, marketing organisations or at markets. Most occupations in this major group require skills at the second skill level. This major group has been divided into 2 minor groups, reflecting differences in tasks associated with different areas of specialisation.

PRODUCTION CRAFTSMEN AND RELATED WORKERS

This major group includes occupations where the main tasks require the knowledge and ability to practise skilled trades or handicrafts which, among other things, involves an understanding of materials and tools to be used, as well as of all stages of the production process, including the characteristics and the intended use of the final product. The main tasks consist of extracting raw materials, constructing buildings and other structures and

making various products as well as handicraft goods. Most occupations in this major group require skills at the second skill level. This major group has been divided into 17 minor groups, reflecting differences in tasks associated with different areas of specialisation.

PLANT AND MACHINE OPERATORS AND ASSEMBLERS

This major group includes occupations where the main tasks require the knowledge and ability necessary to operate and monitor large scale, and often highly automated, industrial machinery and equipment. The main tasks consist of operating and monitoring, processing and production machinery and equipment, as well as driving vehicles and driving and operating mobile plant, or assembling products from component parts. Most occupations in this major group require skills at the second skill level. This major group has been divided into 24 minor groups, reflecting differences in tasks associated with different areas of specialisation.

CLEANERS, LABOURERS AND RELATED WORKERS

This major group covers occupations which require the knowledge and ability necessary to perform mostly simple and routine tasks, involving the use of hand-held tools and in some cases considerable physical effort, and, with few exceptions, only limited personal initiative or judgement. The main tasks consist of doorkeeping and property watching, as well as cleaning, washing, pressing, and working as labourers in the fields of agriculture, construction, manufacturing and transport. Most occupations in this major group require skills at the first skill level. This major group has been divided into 10 minor groups, reflecting differences in tasks associated with different areas of work.

DESCRIPTION OF MINOR GROUPS

111 LEGISLATORS

Legislators determine, formulate and direct government policies, and make, ratify, amend or repeal laws, public rules and regulations.

Tasks performed usually include presiding over or participating in the proceedings of parliament, determining, formulating and deciding on government policies; making, ratifying, amending or repealing laws, public rules and regulations; serving on government administrative boards or official committees; directing administrators and officials of government departments and statutory boards in interpreting and implementing government policy; serving the interests of the constituencies which they represent.

Legislators who are principally engaged in other full-time occupations are classified in the group appropriate to their main occupations and not here.

112 SENIOR GOVERNMENT AND STATUTORY BOARD OFFICIALS

Senior government and statutory board officials advise government on policy matters and oversee the interpretation and implementation of government policies and legislation by government departments and statutory boards.

Tasks performed usually include advising government on policy matters; advising on preparation of government budgets, laws, rules and regulations, including amendments; overseeing the interpretation and implementation of government policies and legislation by government departments and statutory boards.

Included are officers representing the country as ambassadors, consul-generals or permanent delegates to intergovernmental organisations. Government employees who manage government-owned or government-controlled industrial, commercial or other business enterprises are excluded and classified in the same group as managers of similar private establishments. Government employees performing mainly professional functions are classified in Major Group 2.

113 SENIOR OFFICIALS OF SPECIAL-INTEREST ORGANISATIONS

Senior officials of special-interest organisations determine, formulate and direct the implementation of policies of special-interest organisations such as political party organisations, trade unions, employers' organisations, trade and industry associations, humanitarian or charity organisations, or sports associations, and represent their organisations and act on their behalf.

Tasks performed usually include determining and formulating the policies, rules and regulations of the organisation; negotiating on behalf of the organisation, its members and clients; promoting the interests of the organisation, its members and clients before the legislature, government or general public; planning, organising and directing sections charged with implementing the organisation's policies, rules and regulations.

121 COMPANY DIRECTORS

Company directors participate as members of boards of directors in agricultural, industrial, trade, transport, communication or other such enterprises, formulate policies and are responsible to the proprietors or shareholders for ensuring that policies so formulated are implemented and progressively amended in the light of changing circumstances.

Tasks performed usually include determining and formulating policies governing the operations of the enterprise; reviewing the operations and results of the enterprise; representing the enterprise in its dealings with outside bodies, including government authorities and other organisations.

122 GENERAL MANAGERS

General managers plan, direct, control and co-ordinate, on proprietors' or on own behalf, the activities of agricultural, industrial, trade, transport, communication or other such enterprises, within the powers delegated to them and guidelines set up by a board of directors to whom they are answerable for the results obtained and operations undertaken.

Tasks performed usually include assessing past, present and projected performance of the enterprise; formulating and determining the programme of the enterprise; determining the methods by which the programme should be carried out; controlling and coordinating the activities of the different functional sections of the enterprise; conducting or directing negotiations on behalf of the enterprise; deciding or approving senior staff appointments.

123 DEPARTMENT MANAGERS

Department managers plan, direct and co-ordinate specialised functions belonging to particular fields of activity within an enterprise, under the broad direction of the directors and general manager and in consultation with managers of other departments.

Tasks performed usually include planning, directing and coordinating activities of their departments; directing daily operations; planning and controlling expenditures; overseeing the selection, training and performance of staff; liaising with managers of other departments; representing their departments in dealings with other parts of the enterprise or with outside bodies.

129 MANAGERS NOT ELSEWHERE CLASSIFIED

This minor group covers managers not classified elsewhere in sub-major group 12. Shop sales managers, lodging services managers and restaurant and other catering services managers are classified here.

130 WORKING PROPRIETORS

Working proprietors run by themselves or jointly with other partners, their own commercial undertakings in agriculture, manufacturing, construction, wholesale and retail trade, restaurants and hotels, transport or business and other services.

Tasks performed usually include planning and managing daily operations; estimating needs of the business, maintaining records and keeping accounts; negotiating with suppliers, customers and other enterprises; planning and controlling the use of resources; selecting and supervising employees.

Self-employed professionals, insurance agents, real estate agents, pawnbrokers, money changers, hawkers, hair-dressers, electricians, motor car mechanics, etc who run their own businesses but perform the principal tasks of their occupations are classified in the minor groups appropriate to their occupations and not here.

211 PHYSICAL SCIENCE PROFESSIONALS

Physical science professionals conduct research, improve or develop concepts, theories and operational methods, or apply scientific knowledge relating to physics, astronomy, meteorology, chemistry, geophysics and geology.

Tasks performed usually include conducting experiments, tests and analyses to determine the composition or structure and properties of matter, including the earth and the earth's crust and atmosphere; evaluating results of investigations and experiments and deriving conclusions; applying scientific knowledge to test, develop and improve materials, and industrial products and processes; developing or improving oil, gas, water and mineral exploitation, navigation, radio communications, civil engineering and weather forecasting; preparing scientific papers and reports.

212 MATHEMATICIANS, STATISTICIANS AND RELATED PROFESSIONALS

Mathematicians, statisticians and related professionals conduct research, improve or develop mathematical, actuarial or statistical concepts, theories and operational methods and techniques, and apply this knowledge to a wide range of tasks in such fields as engineering, business or medicine as well as natural, life or social sciences.

Tasks performed usually include conducting research in mathematics or statistics and advising on or applying mathematical, actuarial and statistical principles and techniques; planning, designing and conducting statistical collections; evaluating, organising, processing, interpreting and analysing statistical data; dealing with, and advising on, actuarial matters, including design of insurance and pension schemes; preparing scientific papers and reports.

213 INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY PROFESSIONALS

Information technology professionals conduct research, plan, develop and improve computer-based information processing and multimedia systems, software and related concepts, develop principles and operational methods, as well as maintain data dictionary and management systems of databases to ensure integrity and security of data.

Tasks performed usually include conducting research into theoretical aspects of and operational methods for the use of computers, such as data structures and databases, algorithms, artificial intelligence, computer languages, data communication and robotics;

advising on, planning and managing computer installations and operations; evaluating, planning and designing software configurations for specific applications; designing, writing, testing and maintaining computer programmes; developing methods and procedures for quality assurance and security of information systems; advising on, designing and administering database systems; preparing scientific papers and technical reports, documentation and manuals; analysing, designing, testing and evaluating network systems such as LAN, WAN, Internet, Intranet and data communications systems; performing network modelling analysis and planning; researching and recommending network and data communications hardware and software.

Included here are computing services managers who plan and direct computer operations on data entry and processing, or plan and direct development of application systems. Telecommunications specialists who deal with the interfacing of computer and communications equipment are also included in this minor group. Engineers who specialise in the design and development of computer hardware are classified in minor group 214 (Architects, Engineers and Related Professionals). Engineers and other technical staff who are engaged in the installation, diagnostic tests, repair and servicing of computer hardware, incidental to the sale of such equipment to clients, are classified in minor group 341 (Finance and Sales Associate Professionals), together with sales and service advisers who assist and train clients in end-user applications. Teaching professionals who conduct formal courses in one or more aspects of information technology are classified in either minor group 231 (University, Polytechnic and Other Higher Education Teachers) or minor group 332 (Extracurriculum Teachers), according to the level of the courses.

214 ARCHITECTS, ENGINEERS AND RELATED PROFESSIONALS

Architects, engineers and related professionals conduct research and improve or develop concepts, theories and operational methods, or apply existing knowledge in such fields as architecture, engineering, and technological or economic efficiency of production processes.

Tasks performed usually include conducting research and advising on, designing and directing the construction, maintenance and repair of buildings, towns, traffic and landscape systems, civil and other engineering structures, electrical and electronic products and systems, as well as machines, machinery and industrial plants; developing and applying commercial-scale chemical processes for the production of various substances and materials; developing and applying commercial-scale methods to extract water, oil and gas and other minerals from the earth, or metals from their ores, or to develop new materials; studying and advising on technological aspects of particular materials, products and processes and on efficiency of production and work organisation; surveying land, sea and other areas and producing graphic, digital and pictorial representations; preparing scientific papers and reports.

221 LIFE SCIENCE PROFESSIONALS

Life science professionals conduct research, improve or develop concepts, theories and operational methods, or apply scientific knowledge relating to biology, microbiology, zoology, botany, ecology, anatomy, biochemistry, biophysics, physiology, bacteriology, cytology, genetics, agronomy, pathology or pharmacology.

Tasks performed usually include conducting research, performing field or laboratory studies, experiments and tests on all forms of human, animal and plant life, including specific organs, tissues, cells and micro-organisms and the effect of environmental factors or drugs and other substances on them; analysing and evaluating data obtained; developing practical applications in such fields as agriculture, pharmaceutical and other industries or medicine; preparing scientific papers and reports.

222 HEALTH PROFESSIONALS

Health professionals conduct research, improve or develop concepts, theories and operational methods, and apply scientific knowledge relating to medicine, dentistry, veterinary medicine, pharmacy, psychiatry, and promotion of health.

Tasks performed usually include performing diagnostic, preventive and curative services for human and animal disorders and illnesses; administering surgical and medical or dental treatment; preparing and dispensing medicaments according to doctors' prescriptions or established formulae; preparing scientific papers and reports.

231 UNIVERSITY, POLYTECHNIC AND OTHER HIGHER EDUCATION TEACHERS

University, polytechnic and other higher education teachers teach one or more subjects at tertiary levels, conduct research and improve or develop concepts, theories and operational methods pertaining to their particular disciplines, and prepare scholarly papers and books.

Tasks performed usually include designing or modifying curricula and preparing courses of study; conducting courses, giving seminars or delivering lectures and conducting tutorials and laboratory experiments; administering, evaluating and marking examination papers and tests; directing research of post-graduate students; conducting research in their particular subjects to improve or develop concepts, theories and operational methods for application in industrial and other fields; participating in decisions concerning the organisation of teaching and related activities; preparing scientific and other scholarly papers and reports.

232 UPPER SECONDARY AND SECONDARY EDUCATION TEACHERS

Upper secondary and secondary education teachers teach one or more subjects, for educational or vocational purposes, at some or all levels between the termination of primary education and the beginning of tertiary education.

Tasks performed usually include designing or modifying curricula and preparing educational or vocational courses of study; giving lessons and supervising pupils' class work and discipline; preparing, assigning and correcting exercises; administering, evaluating and marking examination papers and tests; participating in decisions concerning the organisation of school teaching and related activities.

233 PRIMARY EDUCATION TEACHERS

Primary education teachers teach a range of subjects and organise educational activities for children at primary-school age.

Tasks performed usually include preparing programme of learning and giving instruction in a range of subjects at the primary education level; preparing, administering and marking tests, projects and assignments to train pupils and to evaluate their progress; encouraging personal development of pupils; supervising pupils in classroom and other areas of school.

234 SPECIAL EDUCATION TEACHERS

Special education teachers teach physically or mentally handicapped children, young persons or adults, or those with learning difficulties, at a given level of education.

Tasks performed usually include adapting curriculum to suit the particular group of mentally or physically handicapped persons, or those with learning difficulties; teaching one or more subjects to, for instance, deaf or blind persons by using braille, lip-reading and other special aids and techniques; preparing reports.

239 TEACHING PROFESSIONALS NOT ELSEWHERE CLASSIFIED

This minor group covers teaching professionals not classified in minor groups 231-234. Teaching professionals classified here should include those who conduct research and develop or advise on teaching methods and aids, or review and examine teachers' work and the results achieved in applying a particular curriculum programme and suggest changes and improvements.

Tasks performed usually include carrying out research on current developments in curricula, teaching methods and other educational practices, including teaching aids, and advising on necessary changes and improvements; carrying out periodic inspection of teachers' work in the application of a particular curriculum programme and suggesting changes and improvements if necessary; preparing reports.

Teachers mainly engaged in teaching activities outside the normal school curriculum, such as teaching of micro-computer software packages, flower arrangement and related arts and crafts, and foreign languages are classified in minor group 332 (Extracurriculum Teachers).

241 ACCOUNTANTS

Accountants plan and perform accounting services, advise on accountancy matters, and plan and conduct audits of accounts of private persons, enterprises, institutions and governmental organisations.

Tasks performed usually include advising on, planning and installing budgetary, accounts controlling and other accounting policies and systems; preparing and certifying financial statements for presentation to management, shareholders, statutory or other bodies;

preparing tax returns, advising on taxation problems and contesting disputed claims before tax officials; preparing or reporting on profit forecasts and budgets; conducting financial investigations in such matters as suspected fraud, insolvency and bankruptcy; auditing accounts and bookkeeping records.

242 FINANCIAL ANALYSTS AND RELATED PROFESSIONALS

Financial analysts and related professionals improve, advise on or apply operational methods relating to financial investments in a brokerage firm, fund management unit or treasury department of business and other organisations.

Tasks performed usually include analysing the financial profile of companies for the purpose of making investment recommendations; investing funds on behalf of an investment organisation's clients in the money and capital markets; overseeing and coordinating treasury activities such as forex, money market and bond transactions.

Employees of banks and other similar establishments who are engaged mainly in assessing and approving applications for credit, loan and other banking and related financial services are classified in minor group 392 (Statistical, Administrative and Related Associate Professionals).

249 BUSINESS PROFESSIONALS NOT ELSEWHERE CLASSIFIED

This minor group covers business professionals not classified in minor groups 241 and 242. Business professionals classified here should include those who improve, advise on or apply operational methods relating to the organisation and conduct of business such as marketing, advertising, applications of rules concerning patents or steps to be taken in setting up and running a business.

Tasks performed usually include conducting research on, determining and advising on existing sales levels and assessing markets and future trends; planning, advising on or directing and coordinating production of advertising campaigns for particular clients of an advertising agency; giving advice concerning patents and assisting in preparing applications or examining applications submitted for registration; studying and advising on general aspects of financial, legal, organisational, marketing and other aspects connected with setting up and running a business.

250 LEGAL PROFESSIONALS

Legal professionals conduct research on legal problems, draft laws and regulations, advise clients on legal aspects of problems, and plead cases or conduct prosecutions in courts of justice or preside over judicial proceedings and pronounce judgement in courts of justice.

Tasks performed usually include giving clients legal advice; undertaking legal business on clients' behalf, and conducting litigation; presiding over judicial proceedings and pronouncing judgements in courts of justice.

291 ARCHIVISTS, LIBRARIANS AND RELATED PROFESSIONALS

Archivists, librarians and related professionals develop, conserve and maintain the collections of libraries, archives, museums, art galleries and similar establishments.

Tasks performed usually include conducting research, appraising or developing and organising the contents of archives and artifacts of historical, cultural and artistic interest, and ensuring their safe-keeping and preservation; organising the collections of, and exhibitions at, museums, art galleries and similar establishments; developing and maintaining the systematic collection of recorded and published material and making it available to users in libraries and related institutions; diagnosis and prognosis of art work for optimum form, quality and life span; preparing scholarly papers and reports.

292 SOCIAL SCIENCE AND RELATED PROFESSIONALS

Social science and related professionals conduct research, improve or develop concepts, theories and operational methods, or apply knowledge relating to philosophy, politics, psychology, economics, history, archaeology, sociology and other social sciences.

Tasks performed usually include formulating and suggesting solutions to present or projected economic, political or social problems; researching into and analysing past events and activities and tracing the origin and evolution of the human race; studying mental processes and behaviour of individuals and groups; preparing scientific papers and reports.

293 WRITERS AND CREATIVE OR PERFORMING ARTISTS

Writers and creative or performing artists conceive, create and perform literary, dramatic, musical and other works of art.

Tasks performed usually include writing literary or journalistic works; appraising merits of literary and other works of art; sculpting, painting, engraving, or creating cartoons; restoring paintings; composing music; dancing or acting in dramatic and cinematic productions or directing such productions.

294 RELIGIOUS PROFESSIONALS

Religious professionals function as perpetrators of the sacred traditions, practices and beliefs and celebrate or administer at the rituals of initiation, preside over ritual reenactment of creative, redemptive or salvatory events, and offer sacrifices to the gods or to one God.

Tasks performed usually include perpetrating sacred traditions, practices and beliefs; conducting religious services, rites and ceremonies; undertaking various administrative and social duties within the framework of a particular religious organisation; providing spiritual and moral guidance in accordance with the religion professed; writing religious papers and reports.

299 OTHER PROFESSIONALS NOT ELSEWHERE CLASSIFIED

This minor group covers other professionals whose functions are outside the scope of those classified in minor groups 291-294.

310 ASSISTANT ENGINEERS

Assistant engineers assist in the development of operational methods in engineering, design of structures, machinery and equipment or application of existing knowledge to solve engineering problems.

Tasks performed usually include assisting in designing new products and developing or improving production processes; assisting in technical supervision of manufacture, utilisation, maintenance and repair of structures, machinery and equipment.

311 CHEMICAL AND PHYSICAL SCIENCE TECHNICIANS

Chemical and physical science technicians perform technical tasks related to research in chemistry, physics, geology, geophysics, meteorology and astronomy, as well as to the development and practical applications of research results.

Tasks performed usually include assisting with the design and conduct of field and laboratory tests and data collection; preparing detailed estimates of quantities and costs of projects and operations; applying knowledge of principles and practices in order to identify and solve problems arising in the course of their work.

312 BUILDING AND ENGINEERING TECHNICIANS

Building and engineering technicians perform technical tasks related to research and the practical application of concepts, principles and operational methods in areas such as engineering, technical drawing or economic efficiency of production process.

Tasks performed usually include providing technical assistance in research and development, or testing prototypes; preparing detailed estimates of quantities and costs of projects and operations; providing supervision during the process of the projects or operations; applying knowledge of principles and practices in order to identify and solve problems arising in the course of their work; preparing maps and detailed technical drawings.

313 COMPUTER SYSTEMS OPERATORS

Computer systems operators operate mainframe computers and peripheral equipment and carry out limited programming tasks in connection with installation and maintenance of mainframe computer hardware and software.

Tasks performed usually include operating mainframe computers and peripheral equipment; organising computing jobs; mounting magnetic tapes and disks; keeping log of computing operations; and performing back-up operations.

Computer data entry operators are classified in minor group 411 (Secretaries and Keyboard Operating Clerks). Clerical workers who use computers as part of their jobs in administration, accounting, statistical compilation and computation, material recording or client reception are classified in the minor groups 412-490 appropriate to their principal clerical tasks.

314 OPTICAL AND ELECTRONIC EQUIPMENT OPERATORS

Optical and electronic equipment operators take photographs, control motion picture and video cameras and other equipment to record and edit images and sound, control broadcasting and telecommunications equipment and systems.

Tasks performed usually include taking photographs; controlling motion picture and video cameras and other equipment to record and edit images and sound; controlling the technical functioning of radio and television broadcasting equipment and telecommunications systems.

Medical X-ray technicians and operators of technical equipment for medical diagnosis or treatment are classified in minor group 322 (Health Associate Professionals).

315 TRANSPORT CONTROLLERS, TECHNICIANS AND SUPERVISORS

Transport controllers, technicians and supervisors command and navigate ships and aircraft, perform technical functions to ensure safe and efficient movement and operations, and supervise land, air and waterborne transport service operations.

Tasks performed usually include controlling the operation of mechanical, electrical and electronic equipment on board ship or on aircraft, commanding and navigating ships or aircraft or directing the movements of ships or aircraft; supervising railway, road, air and waterborne, transport service operations; coordinating, flight planning and assisting in monitoring of en-route operations; supervising the receipt and dispatch of cargo and mail through aircraft and assessing freight charges.

316 BUILDING, SAFETY AND HEALTH INSPECTORS

Building, safety and health inspectors enforce the rules and regulations relating to fire prevention and other hazards, occupational safety, protection of health and the environment, safety of production processes, and goods and services produced, used or sold, as well as those relating to the quality standards and specifications of manufacture.

Tasks performed usually include ensuring that buildings and other structures comply with approved building plans, grading and zoning laws and fire regulations; advising on and inspecting fire-prevention systems; investigating fire sites to determine the cause of fire; inspecting industrial and other enterprises on the grounds of occupational safety, and safety of production processes, as well as of goods produced, used or sold; ensuring compliance with health and environment protection rules and regulations; ensuring compliance with the quality standards and specifications of manufacturers.

321 LIFE SCIENCE TECHNICIANS AND RELATED ASSOCIATE PROFESSIONALS

Life sciences technicians and related associate professionals perform technical tasks related to research and the practical application of concepts, principles and operational methods particular to life sciences, such as biology, botany, zoology, bacteriology and biochemistry, as well as to agriculture and agronomy.

Tasks performed usually include preparing materials for experiments and collecting specimens and samples of plants and animals; assisting in carrying out experiments and tests; collecting data and estimating quantities and costs required for projects; advising on ways to improve quantity and quality of yields and efficiency of operation in farming.

322 HEALTH ASSOCIATE PROFESSIONALS

Health associate professionals perform technical tasks related to research and the practical application of concepts, principles and operational methods in the fields of medicine, veterinary medicine, dentistry, pharmacy, promotion of health and related disciplines.

Tasks performed usually include examining eyes and prescribing spectacles or contact lenses; advising on prevention and treating disorders of bones and muscular systems; participating in medically oriented vocational, educational or recreational activities to rehabilitate physically or mentally disabled persons; planning the preparation of therapeutic or other diets and advising on nutrition aspects of community food and health programmes; helping medical doctors, dentists, veterinarians and pharmacists in the practical application of preventive and curative medical knowledge; providing nursing services, care and advice; delivering or assisting in the delivery of babies, and instructing mothers in baby care; operating, recording and editing images captured using optical and electronic equipment used for medical diagnosis or treatment; controlling technical equipment used to diagnose or treat illness and disorders.

331 PRE-PRIMARY EDUCATION TEACHERS

Pre-primary education teachers teach a range of subjects and organise educational activities for children below primary-school age.

Tasks performed usually include preparing programme of learning and giving instruction in a range of subjects at the pre-primary education level; planning and organising activities designed to facilitate children's development of language, physical and social skills.

332 EXTRACURRICULUM TEACHERS

Extracurriculum teachers engage in teaching activities outside the normal school curriculum, such as teaching of micro-computer software packages, flower arrangement and related arts and crafts, and foreign languages.

Tasks performed usually include explaining uses and operations of micro-computers and software packages; teaching flower arrangement and related arts and crafts

through demonstrations; giving lessons on oral and written forms of foreign languages, and supervising students in language laboratories.

**339 TEACHING ASSOCIATE PROFESSIONALS NOT ELSEWHERE
CLASSIFIED**

This minor group covers other teaching associate professionals engaged in teaching activities outside the scope of those classified in minor groups 331 and 332, eg they provide private tuition to schoolchildren at their homes or at tuition centres, or undertake relief teaching at schools.

341 FINANCE AND SALES ASSOCIATE PROFESSIONALS

Finance and sales associate professionals buy and sell financial instruments, different types of insurance, real estate and other business services, deal on the foreign exchange, sell and perform specialised information duties in selling technical products or services, act as buyers on behalf of organisations, or appraise the value of commodities, real estate and other properties and sell these by auction, or organise and manage or coordinate exhibitions and conventions.

Tasks performed usually include analysing market trends for financial instruments, the foreign exchange, commodities and real estate and buying or selling on behalf of clients or on their own behalf; advising on and selling insurance coverage; ensuring proper recording of transfers of financial instruments and ownership of real estate; selling technical equipment, supplies or services using specialised knowledge of the technology of the composition, utilisation and maintenance of the goods or equipment sold; advising customers on the application, installation and operation of technical equipment and other products bought; buying goods or services on behalf of organisations; appraising the value of commodities, real estate or other property, or selling in auctions; organising and managing or coordinating exhibitions and conventions.

342 BUSINESS SERVICE AGENTS AND TRADE BROKERS

Business service agents and trade brokers establish necessary contacts between buyers and sellers of commodities and services, carry out customs clearance procedures and ensure that insurance and export/import licences are in order, match jobseekers with vacancies known to government placement offices, find workers for vacant posts on a commission basis, or contract labour for particular projects, and sell various other business services.

Tasks performed usually include establishing contacts between buyers and sellers of commodities and services; carrying out customs clearance procedures and ensuring that insurance and export/import licences are in order; matching jobseekers with vacancies known to government placement offices, or advising on training schemes; finding workers for various posts or contracting labour for particular projects at the request of enterprises and other, including government, institutions; finding places for jobseekers on a commission basis; establishing business contacts; selling business services such as advertising space in the printed media, advertising time on radio and television programmes, transport services and other facilities, or credit and other business information; arranging contracts for performances of

entertainers and artists, as well as for the publication of books, production of plays, recording and sale of music.

391 GOVERNMENT ASSOCIATE PROFESSIONALS

Government associate professionals enforce or apply relevant government rules and regulations relating to national borders, public finance, economic development, social services, process or examine applications for licences or authorisations in connection with travel, exports and imports of goods, establishment of businesses, erection of buildings and other activities subject to government regulations, and investigate crimes committed and disseminate information relating to crime prevention.

Tasks performed usually include manning national borders and checking persons and vehicles, travel and transport documents and goods transported across the border to enforce government rules and regulations; examining tax returns to determine taxes payable by persons and businesses; processing applications for economic and social benefits; processing applications for government authorisations and licences necessary to travel, import or export goods, erect buildings, establish a business or undertake other activities subject to government regulation; monitoring the application and compliance of regulations on price, wages or weights and measures; investigating facts and circumstances relating to the prevention and solution of crimes, and testifying in courts of law.

392 STATISTICAL, ADMINISTRATIVE AND RELATED ASSOCIATE PROFESSIONALS

Statistical, administrative and related associate professionals implement and support the communication, documentation and management and general functions of an organisational unit, organise the flow of information among different organisational units and implement mathematical, statistical and related activities.

Tasks performed usually include drafting administrative correspondence and minutes; assisting in the preparation of budgets, monitoring of expenditures, drafting of contracts and purchasing or acquisition orders; assisting in the organisation and hosting of hospitality functions; assisting in planning the collection, processing and presentation of mathematical, statistical and actuarial data and in carrying out these operations; assisting in the analysis of data and other information and writing of reports; giving relevant information on policy questions, departmental programmes, administrative and other matters.

393 SOCIAL WORK ASSOCIATE PROFESSIONALS

Social work associate professionals provide guidance to clients in social and related matters to enable them to find and use resources to overcome difficulties and achieve particular goals.

Tasks performed usually include helping individuals and families with personal and social problems; working to prevent development of delinquency or to achieve rehabilitation by organising and supervising social activities of individuals and groups; helping

physically or mentally handicapped persons to obtain adequate treatment and improve their ability to function in society.

394 TRANSLATORS AND INTERPRETERS

Translators and interpreters translate or interpret from one language into another.

Tasks performed usually include translating from one language into another and ensuring that the correct meaning of the original is retained; interpreting from one language into another and ensuring that the correct meaning of the original is transmitted.

395 ARTISTIC, ENTERTAINMENT AND SPORTS ASSOCIATE PROFESSIONALS

Artistic, entertainment and sports associate professionals design products or decorate interiors, present information through the media, entertain audiences by performing amusing, spectacular or exciting acts in circuses, in stadiums, or on stage, participate in sports competitions, or train or direct those who perform such activities.

Tasks performed usually include designing products, or creating interior decorating schemes; reading news bulletins, conducting interviews and making other announcements or introductions on radio, television or in theatres and other establishments; entertaining audiences by performing on stage; performing amusing antics, tricks of illusion, or difficult and spectacular acrobatics; participating in sports competitions; caring for, training or performing with animals, birds or aquatic animals.

Artistes who act in dramatic productions are classified in minor group 293 (Writers and Creative or Performing Artists).

396 NON-ORDAINED RELIGIOUS ASSOCIATE PROFESSIONALS

Non-ordained religious associate professionals participate in the practice of religious works, or preach and propagate the teachings of their respective religions.

Tasks performed usually include participating in the practice of religious works; preaching and propagating the teachings of their respective religions.

399 OTHER ASSOCIATE PROFESSIONALS NOT ELSEWHERE CLASSIFIED

This minor group covers other associate professionals engaged in technical and related tasks outside the scope of those classified in minor groups 391-396 eg they assist librarians and curators to appraise, classify and index documents or exhibits, supervise activities of stage crews and organise backstage activities such as wardrobes, scenery and stage property.

411 SECRETARIES AND KEYBOARD OPERATING CLERKS

Secretaries and keyboard operating clerks record oral or written information on paper or in machine readable form.

Tasks performed usually include recording dictated words and spoken statements in shorthand and transcribing it in typewritten form; typing material using typewriters, word processors, personal computers or teleprinters; entering data onto electro-magnetic media in the form of magnetic cards, disks or tapes; performing various secretarial duties.

Console operators are classified in minor group 313 (Computer Systems Operators). Clerical workers who enter data into the computer as part of their jobs in administration, accounting, statistical compilation and computation, material recording or client reception are classified elsewhere in the minor groups appropriate to their principal clerical tasks.

412 ADMINISTRATIVE CLERKS

Administrative clerks perform a wide range of general duties, mostly connected with the keeping of office and library records and routine aspects of insurance transactions, legal matters or personnel records.

Tasks performed usually include recording information regarding acquisition, issue and return of books; classifying and filing various documents and other records; keeping address lists; keeping mailing lists; keeping personnel or any other office records; carrying out specialised clerical tasks in connection with legal or insurance matters; preparing simple and routine correspondence.

413 ACCOUNTING AND FINANCE CLERKS

Accounting and finance clerks obtain, compile and compute bookkeeping and financial data and handle cash transactions incidental to business matters.

Tasks performed usually include helping with accounting and bookkeeping records and computations; taking charge of cash transactions incidental to the business; calculating production costs; calculating wages; performing clerical tasks relating to the financial transactions of a bank or similar establishment.

414 STATISTICAL AND COMPUTER OPERATIONS CLERKS

Statistical and computer operations clerks obtain, code, compile and compute statistical data, or prepare production schedules and keep records of computer operations.

Tasks performed usually include obtaining and compiling statistical data from surveys or administrative records; calculating various rates, ratios and percentages and presenting them in tabular or graphic form; preparing day-to-day production schedules for computer operations; preparing job flows, including files required, for submission to the computer.

Electronic digital computer operators are classified in minor group 313 (Computer Systems Operators) and computer data entry clerks in minor group 411 (Secretaries and Keyboard Operating Clerks).

415 MATERIAL-RECORDING CLERKS

Material-recording clerks keep records of goods produced, purchased, stored, dispatched, and of materials needed at specified production dates.

Tasks performed usually include controlling and arranging receipt and dispatch of goods and materials; recording produced, stocked, ordered and dispatched goods; recording production materials received, put into stock or issued; computing quantities of the production materials required at specified dates and helping with preparation and checking of production operations schedules.

421 CASHIERS, TELLERS AND RELATED CLERKS

Cashiers, tellers and related clerks perform a number of operations in connection with receiving, changing and paying out of money in retail stores, theatres, banks and other establishments, including those related to betting or gambling, pawning and debt-collecting.

Tasks performed usually include receiving payments from clients for goods and services bought; receiving, changing and paying out money in banks, post offices or other establishments; receiving and paying off bets on results of sporting events; lending money against articles deposited or other securities.

422 CLIENT INFORMATION CLERKS

Client information clerks deal directly with clients in connection with travel arrangements, various types of information requested, appointments to be made, including those for hospitals, medical and dental surgeries, as well as incoming or requested telephone calls.

Tasks performed usually include providing information about tours and other travel, arranging itineraries and making travel and hotel reservations for clients; receiving clients or patients; providing relevant information and making appointments on behalf of various establishments, including hospitals, medical or dental surgeries; operating a telephone switchboard.

490 CLERICAL WORKERS NOT ELSEWHERE CLASSIFIED

This minor group covers other clerical workers performing miscellaneous clerical tasks outside the scope of those classified in minor groups 411-422, such as proof-reading and correcting proofs, writing letters and completing forms on behalf of illiterate persons, sorting forms or other documents by hand, inspecting documents and marking them with identification numbers, addressing circulars and envelopes by hand.

511 TRAVEL AND TRANSPORT SERVICE INSPECTORS AND WORKERS

Travel and transport service inspectors and workers provide various personal services in connection with travelling by aircraft, ship, bus, train or other public transport vehicles during journeys, and escorting individuals and groups on travel tours, sightseeing visits and excursions.

Tasks performed usually include taking care of general needs, comfort and safety of passengers during journey; providing necessary or requested information and answering various questions in connection with the journey; collecting, issuing or inspecting tickets on board public transport; accompanying individuals or groups on sightseeing tours or excursions, and describing points of interest; providing other guide services such as organising and conducting mountain climbing, hunting or fishing excursions.

512 HOUSEKEEPING AND CATERING SERVICE WORKERS

Housekeeping and catering service workers organise, supervise and carry out housekeeping functions in hotels, hospitals and other institutions, on board ships and in private households, prepare and cook meals in hotels, restaurants and other public eating places, clubs, hospitals and other institutions, in private households, and aboard ships or passenger trains, or serve food and beverages in commercial establishments.

Tasks performed usually include organising and supervising the work of domestic staff in commercial establishments; taking care of general welfare and suitable conduct of individuals in institutions; controlling the purchase, storage and issue of supplies; preparing and cooking foodstuffs; serving food and beverages.

Service workers mainly engaged in cleaning and washing or helping in the kitchens of hotels, restaurants and other eating places are classified in minor group 912 (Cleaners in Offices, Hotels and Other Establishments). Domestic service workers are classified in minor group 911 (Domestic Helpers and Cleaners).

513 PERSONAL CARE AND HOUSEHOLD SERVICE WORKERS

Personal care and household service workers perform various tasks in order to improve the appearance of individuals, provide companionship or look after the wardrobe and other personal effects of employers, provide child care and help in looking after children, and provide embalming and funeral services and pest extermination services.

Tasks performed usually include cutting, washing and dressing hair; giving beauty treatment and applying cosmetics and make-up; shaping and polishing finger and toe nails; attending to clients taking baths and administering elementary massage; taking care of employer's children and helping teachers by taking care of children at lunch or other school breaks; providing services as companions or valets; providing embalming and funeral services; exterminating rodents, mosquitoes, termites and other household pests and carrying out spraying of pesticides and other action to prevent breeding of the pests.

514 PROTECTIVE SERVICE AND RELATED WORKERS

Protective service and related workers protect individuals and property against fire and other hazards, maintain law and order and enforce laws and regulations.

Tasks performed usually include preventing, fighting and extinguishing fires, rescuing persons and salvaging property and goods during and after fires and major accidents; maintaining law and order, protecting persons and property from hazards and unlawful acts and arresting persons for breaking law; directing traffic and assuming authority in the event of accidents; watching over and maintaining discipline among inmates of prisons, reformatories or penitentiaries; patrolling industrial plants, banks, museums or other properties to prevent theft, violence or disturbances; conducting private investigations for commercial or other establishments and individuals; patrolling beaches and swimming pools to prevent accidents and to rescue swimmers from drowning; patrolling natural reserves and parks to prevent theft, vandalism and fires.

515 MAIL DISTRIBUTION WORKERS

Mail distribution workers perform sorting, recording, delivery and other duties in connection with mail services from post offices or related organisations, as well as from or within an establishment.

Tasks performed usually include performing mail-handling duties in post offices; sorting and delivering mail to private houses and elsewhere; sorting and keeping simple records of incoming and outgoing correspondence and dispatching outgoing mail in various establishments.

519 SERVICE WORKERS NOT ELSEWHERE CLASSIFIED

This minor group covers other service workers performing tasks outside the scope of those classified in minor groups 511-515 eg operating sound amplifying equipment such as loudspeakers and microphones, and cinema projectors, operating a sound-mixing panel backstage during theatrical performances, pasting advertising posters and notices on billboards, collecting, caring for and feeding lost or strayed dogs and other animals, or diving under water to carry out salvaging work. Meter readers are included here.

521 SHOP SALES AND RELATED WORKERS

Shop sales and related workers sell goods in wholesale or retail establishments, and demonstrate and explain functions and qualities of goods.

Tasks performed usually include selling goods in wholesale establishments to retailers or large-scale consumers; selling goods to customers of retail establishments; promoting goods through the telephone; demonstrating and explaining qualities and functions of goods.

Workers who carry out specialised technical selling or supporting service activities requiring knowledge of the technology of the composition, utilisation and maintenance of the

goods or equipment sold are classified in minor group 341 (Finance and Sales Associate Professionals). Also excluded from here are insurance, real estate, securities and business services salesmen, and buyers and purchasing agents who are classified in minor group 341.

522 STALL SALES WORKERS

Stall sales workers sell various goods such as leather or textile craft products, wood carvings, embroidery, lace, or newspapers, periodicals, postcards, cigarettes, chocolates and ice-creams, at stalls which are usually placed, by licence, at particular places, or they sell fruit, vegetables and other, mostly perishable, foodstuffs in markets.

Tasks performed usually include buying and then selling the above-mentioned or other similar goods at stalls usually grouped at particular places by permission of the relevant authorities; selling fruit, vegetables and other, mostly perishable, foodstuffs in markets.

523 FASHION AND OTHER MODELS

Fashion and other models wear and display clothing and other items for sale or pose as models for advertising or for artistic creation.

Tasks performed usually include dressing in sample apparel of new or current styles or of type wanted by customer; walking, turning and otherwise demonstrating style and other characteristics to best advantage; posing as model for artistic photography, sculpture or painting; posing as model for photography or films in the field of advertising.

610 AGRICULTURAL WORKERS

Agricultural workers plan and carry out the necessary operations to grow and harvest different crops and produce animal husbandry products, for sale or delivery on a regular basis to wholesale buyers, marketing organisations or at markets.

Tasks performed usually include determining kinds and amounts of crops to be grown and livestock to be raised; purchasing seeds, fertiliser, fodder and other supplies; performing farming operations such as land preparation, sowing, cultivating and harvesting crops, breeding, raising and tending livestock and producing various animal husbandry products; maintaining farm buildings, machinery and equipment; delivering or marketing farm products.

Forestry workers who carry out the necessary operations to cultivate and conserve forests are included in this minor group. Tasks performed usually include caring for forest stands; patrolling and keeping watch to detect forest and participating in fire-fighting operations.

620 FISHERY WORKERS

Fishery workers catch, breed and cultivate fish and other aquatic life, for sale or delivery on a regular basis to wholesale buyers, marketing organisations or at markets.

Tasks performed usually include preparing nets and other fishing gear and equipment; operating fishing vessels to, from and at fishing grounds; baiting, setting and hauling in fishing gear; cleaning, freezing, icing or salting catch; breeding, raising and cultivating fish, oysters, mussels, or other aquatic animals.

710 SUPERVISORS AND GENERAL FOREMEN (BUILDING TRADES)

Supervisors and general foremen in building trades supervise activities of a distinct unit at a construction site, and control and coordinate the activities of workers engaged in various occupations.

Tasks performed usually include interpreting specifications and job orders; determining sequence of operations and use of equipment; estimating manpower requirements; assigning duties to workers; analysing and resolving work problems; coordinating the work of one or more units with other units; recommending or initiating personnel action.

711 BUILDING TRADES WORKERS

Building trades workers construct, install, finish, maintain and repair internal and external structures of buildings and other constructions.

Tasks performed usually include digging and laying of foundations, erecting and repairing walls and structures of brick, stone and other materials; erecting reinforced concrete frameworks and structures and finishing cement surfaces; covering roof frameworks with one or more kinds of materials; erecting and repairing various types of wooden structures and fittings; installing parquet and other kinds of flooring or covering floors and walls with tiles or mosaic panels; applying plaster to walls and ceilings; applying insulating materials to walls, floors and ceilings as well as boilers, pipes, refrigeration and air-conditioning equipment; cutting, fitting and setting glass in windows and similar openings in buildings and vehicles; preparing surfaces, and applying paint and similar materials to buildings, ships, motor vehicles, and various manufactured products; covering interior walls and ceilings with wallpaper, silk or other fabrics; erecting temporary metal or wooden scaffolding; constructing roads, bridges, flyovers, tunnels and other civil engineering works; demolishing buildings with explosives or various tools; laying pipes to form sewers, drains, water mains and conduits for cables.

**720 SUPERVISORS AND GENERAL FOREMEN
(METAL, MACHINERY AND RELATED TRADES)**

Supervisors and general foremen in metal, machinery and related trades supervise production activities within a distinct unit of an establishment concerned with plumbing and pipe fitting, fabrication of metal products, preparation and erection of metal structures, or fitting and installing mechanical, electrical or electronic machinery and equipment, and control and coordinate the activities of workers in various occupations.

Tasks performed usually include interpreting specifications and job orders; determining sequence of operations and use of equipment; estimating manpower requirements;

assigning duties to workers; analysing and resolving work problems; coordinating the work of one or more units with other units; recommending or initiating personnel action.

721 METAL MOULDERS, PLUMBERS, WELDERS, SHEET METAL WORKERS, STRUCTURAL METAL PREPARERS AND RELATED TRADES WORKERS

Metal moulders, plumbers, welders, sheet metal workers, structural metal preparers and related trades workers make moulds and cores for casting metal, fit, install and repair plumbing fixtures, pipes and pipeline systems, weld and cut metal parts, make and repair articles of sheet metal, install, erect and repair heavy metal structures, tackle, cable cars and related equipment or carry out similar work under water.

Tasks performed usually include making moulds and cores for casting metal; fitting, installing and repairing plumbing fixtures and pipeline systems; casting, welding and shaping metal parts; making and repairing articles of sheet metal such as sheet steel, copper, tin or brass; installing, erecting, maintaining and repairing metal structures, as well as tackle, cable cars and related equipment; carrying out similar work under water.

722 BLACKSMITHS, TOOLMAKERS AND RELATED TRADES WORKERS

Blacksmiths, toolmakers and related trades workers hammer and forge bars, rods or ingots of iron, steel and other metals to make and repair various kinds of tools, equipment and other articles, polish and sharpen metal surfaces, and perform various metalworking tasks.

Tasks performed usually include hammering and forging iron, steel and other metals to make and repair various kinds of tools, equipment and other articles; making, maintaining and repairing dies, jigs, gauges and fixtures; making and repairing metal patterns for foundry moulds; polishing and sharpening metal surfaces and tools.

723 MACHINERY MECHANICS AND FITTERS

Machinery mechanics and fitters fit, install, maintain and repair vehicles, engines, agricultural or industrial machinery, and mechanical equipment.

Tasks performed usually include examining drawings or specifications of item to be made and planning sequence of operations; performing filing, chiselling and other supplementary tooling and machining to ensure correct fit; aligning and fitting parts using hand tools such as wrenches, spanners, screwdrivers and pliers; erecting and installing machinery at place of use; adjusting and maintaining machinery to keep them in good working order; repairing or replacing defective parts.

724 ELECTRICAL AND ELECTRONIC INSTRUMENT MECHANICS AND FITTERS

Electrical and electronic instrument mechanics and fitters fit, adjust, install and repair electrical and electronic equipment such as electrical motors, generators, domestic appliances, computer hardware, sound and image recording and telecommunications systems,

install and service electrical wiring systems in houses, industrial plants and other establishments, and in ships, motor vehicles and aircraft, and install, construct and repair electrical cables, telephone and telegraph lines and related equipment.

Tasks performed usually include examining wiring and assembly diagrams and other specification, performing filing, chiselling and other supplementary tooling and machining to ensure correct fit; fitting parts together using screwdrivers, pliers and other tools, and installing and connecting wiring; erecting and installing machinery at place of use; adjusting and maintaining machinery to keep them in good working order and repairing or replacing defective parts; installing, servicing and repairing electrical wiring systems and related equipment in houses, industrial and commercial establishments, other buildings, aircraft, motor vehicles and ships; installing, constructing and repairing electrical lines and joint cables.

Workers who assemble electrical or electronic equipment and components, usually in an assembly line, are classified in minor group 828 (Assemblers and Quality Checkers).

**730 SUPERVISORS AND GENERAL FOREMEN
(PRECISION, HANDICRAFT, PRINTING AND RELATED TRADES)**

Supervisors and general foremen in precision, handicraft, printing and related trades supervise production activities within a distinct unit of an establishment in which precision instruments, musical instruments, jewellery, pottery and glass products are fabricated or within a unit specialising in typesetting and related work in a printing establishment, and control and coordinate the activities of workers in various occupations.

Tasks performed usually include interpreting specifications and job orders; determining sequence of operations and use of equipment; estimating manpower requirements; assigning duties to workers; analysing and resolving work problems; coordinating the work of one or more units with other units; recommending or initiating personnel action.

731 PRECISION WORKERS IN METAL AND RELATED MATERIALS

Precision workers in metal and related materials make and repair precision instruments, musical instruments, jewellery and articles of precious metals.

Tasks performed usually include making and repairing watches and clocks; making, servicing and repairing nautical, meteorological, optical, surgical, dental, orthopaedic and other scientific instruments and equipment; making and repairing musical instruments; cutting or setting gems, and making and repairing jewellery and precious metalware.

732 POTTERS, GLASS MAKERS AND RELATED TRADES WORKERS

Potters, glass makers and related trades workers make bricks, tiles, pottery, porcelainware and glassware, engrave and etch designs on glass articles, and paint or decorate glass, ceramics and related articles.

Tasks performed usually include making abrasive wheels, pottery, porcelainware, bricks and tiles; making glassware; engraving and etching designs on glass articles; decorating

glass and ceramic articles; applying decorative coatings of paint and similar materials to various articles.

733 PRINTING AND RELATED TRADES WORKERS

Printing and related trades workers set and arrange printing type, make printing plates from set-up type, engrave lithographic stones, printing plates and rollers, make and print with silk screens, print on materials other than paper.

Tasks performed usually include setting and arranging printing type through electronic keyboarding or other machines; making printing plates from set-up type; engraving lithographic stones, printing plates, rollers, dies and blocks; making and printing with silk screens; printing on materials other than paper.

Printing, bookbinding and related machinery operators are classified in minor group 825 (Printing, Binding and Paper Products Machine Operators).

740 SUPERVISORS AND GENERAL FOREMEN (FOOD PROCESSING, WOODWORKING, TEXTILE, LEATHER AND RELATED TRADES)

Supervisors and general foremen in food processing, woodworking, textile, leather and related trades supervise production activities within a distinct unit of an establishment in which specific knowledge and skills are used for processing foodstuffs and beverages, preparation of fibres, treatment of wood, manufacture of wooden furniture, fur articles, made-to-order garments, footwear and leather goods, and control and coordinate the activities of workers in various occupations.

Tasks performed usually include interpreting specifications and job orders; determining sequence of operations and use of equipment; estimating manpower requirements; assigning duties to workers; analysing and resolving work problems; coordinating the work of one or more units with other units; recommending or initiating personnel action.

741 FOOD PROCESSING AND RELATED TRADES WORKERS

Food processing and related trades workers slaughter animals, kill fish, treat and prepare them and related food items for human and animal consumption, make various kinds of bread, cakes and other flour products, taste and grade various food products and beverages, or prepare tobacco and make tobacco products.

Tasks performed usually include slaughtering animals; killing fish; treating meat and fish and preparing them and related food items; making various kinds of bread, cakes and other flour products; tasting and grading various food products and beverages; preparing tobacco and making tobacco products.

Workers who operate machines to manufacture food and related products on an industrial basis are classified in minor group 827 (Food and Related Products Machine Operators).

742 WOOD TREATERS, CABINET MAKERS AND RELATED TRADES WORKERS

Wood treaters, cabinet makers and related trades workers season and preserve wood and wooden items, make and repair wooden furniture, wooden fittings, patterns and models, make wicker furniture and related articles, and decorate and repair wooden articles and wooden parts of goods.

Tasks performed usually include seasoning and preserving wood; making, decorating and repairing wooden furniture; making, decorating and repairing parts of or entire wooden vehicles, wooden models, patterns and various articles such as pipes, wooden shoes or sports goods; making wicker furniture, baskets and similar items, or brooms and brushes.

Workers who operate automatic and semi-automatic woodworking machines which perform repetitive work are classified in minor group 824 (Wood Products Machine Operators).

743 TEXTILE, GARMENT AND RELATED TRADES WORKERS

Textile, garment and related trades workers prepare natural and synthetic textile fibres, make patterns and mark and cut textile, leather and other materials in the manufacture of garments, gloves and miscellaneous products, make complete items of tailored clothing, dresses and other made-to-order garments, make and repair garments and other articles of fur, upholster furniture and interiors of vehicles, or sew textile products for furniture and decoration.

Tasks performed usually include preparing wool, cotton, flax, jute, hemp, and other natural and synthetic textile fibres for spinning and winding; making suits, skirts and similar tailored garments to clients' individual requirements; making, altering and repairing articles made of fur; making patterns and marking and cutting textile and kindred material in the manufacture of garments, gloves and other articles; upholstering furniture, making mattresses and making and installing interior decorations of textile, leather and similar materials; making sails, tents, awnings and similar articles; assembling and covering umbrellas.

Workers who operate machines for the manufacture of thread, yarn and textile, or sewing of garments in standardised series, are classified in minor group 826 (Textile Products Machine Operators).

744 LEATHER AND SHOEMAKING TRADES WORKERS

Leather and shoemaking trades make and repair footwear and other articles (except garments, hats and gloves) from leather and similar materials.

Tasks performed usually include making and repairing footwear from leather and similar materials; making and repairing articles mainly of leather and similar materials such as luggage, brief-cases, handbags, key and coin purses.

**790 PRODUCTION CRAFTSMEN AND RELATED WORKERS
NOT ELSEWHERE CLASSIFIED**

This minor group covers production craftsmen whose tasks are outside the scope of those classified in minor groups 741-744. Production craftsmen classified here should include those who make novelty articles from strips of leather or other pliable material by hand knotting and weaving, make wigs, fastening strands of hair to cloth base, mix colours for manufacture of paints, or make rubber stamps to order and mount them for use; prepare fur- and wool-bearing pelts for making garments and other products; extract solid minerals from underground or surface mines or quarries, or cut, shape and finish granite, limestone, marble, sandstone and other stones, for building, ornamental, monumental and other purposes.

810 STATIONARY PLANT SUPERVISORS AND GENERAL FOREMEN

Stationary plant supervisors and general foremen supervise production activities of a distinct unit at a well drilling site or within an establishment engaged in processing of mineral ore and stone, metal, wood, or chemicals, or activities of a distinct unit within an establishment concerned with the production and distribution of electricity, steam or gas, or with water supply, sewage disposal and treatment, or refrigeration and assimilated services, and control and coordinate the activities of workers in various occupations.

Tasks performed usually include interpreting specifications and job orders; determining sequence of operations and use of equipment; estimating manpower requirements; assigning duties to workers; analysing and resolving work problems; coordinating the work of one or more units with other units; recommending or initiating personnel action.

811 MINING PLANT OPERATORS

Mining plant operators operate and monitor plant for cutting channels in mine workface or for the drilling and sinking of wells.

Tasks performed usually include operating and monitoring machinery and equipment used for continuous mining or for drilling holes or cutting channels in a mine or quarry workface; operating and monitoring machinery and equipment used as well as for the drilling and sinking of wells.

812 METAL PROCESSING PLANT OPERATORS

Metal processing plant operators operate and monitor ore smelting, metal converting and refining furnaces, metal rolling mills, metal heat treating plants or metal extrusion plants.

Tasks performed usually include operating and monitoring furnaces for ore smelting, melting, refining, converting or reheating metal; operating rolling mills to make steel bars, plates, sheets, seamless tubes and pipes and other non-ferrous metal products; pouring metal into moulds and operating metal casting machines; operating and monitoring heating, cooling and chemical treating plant to alter the physical properties of metal objects; operating and monitoring machinery which draw and extrude metals through dies to make wire, pipes, tubes and similar products.

813 GLASS, CERAMICS AND RELATED PLANT OPERATORS

Glass, ceramics and related plant operators operate and monitor kilns, furnaces and other machinery and equipment used in the manufacturing of glass and ceramic products.

Tasks performed usually include operating and monitoring kilns, furnaces and other machinery and equipment used for making glass and ceramic products.

814 WOOD PROCESSING AND PAPERMAKING PLANT OPERATORS

Wood processing and papermaking plant operators operate and monitor machinery and equipment which saw, cut and grind wood in preparation for further use, convert wood and other materials into pulp and make paper from pulp.

Tasks performed usually include operating and monitoring machinery and equipment to saw logs into planks or boards or to cut uneven edges of rough boards; operating veneer cutting machine, plywood core layer and plywood press; operating and monitoring machines to convert logs, rags, waste paper and other materials into pulp; operating and monitoring machinery for making paper from pulp.

815 CHEMICAL PROCESSING PLANT OPERATORS

Chemical processing plant operators operate and monitor machinery and equipment which process chemicals and related materials to obtain products with desirable properties.

Tasks performed usually include operating and monitoring machinery and equipment for processing chemicals by crushing, heating, mixing, distilling or filtering to obtain products with desirable properties, or operating and monitoring plants for treating petroleum and petroleum-based products.

816 POWER GENERATING AND RELATED PLANT OPERATORS

Power generating and related plant operators operate and monitor machinery and equipment in an electrical power generating plant, and water treatment, incinerator and related plant, and operate and maintain ships' and other types of steam engines and boilers.

Tasks performed usually include operating and monitoring machinery and equipment for producing electric power; operating and monitoring steam engines and boilers and other stationary machinery and equipment such as incinerators or water treatment plants and pumping stations.

817 AUTOMATED ASSEMBLY LINE AND INDUSTRIAL ROBOT OPERATORS

Automated assembly line and industrial robot operators operate and monitor automated or semi-automated assembling lines as well as industrial robots.

Tasks performed usually include operating and monitoring automated or partly automated assembling lines as well as industrial robots.

819 OTHER STATIONARY PLANT AND RELATED PLANT OPERATORS

Other stationary plant and related plant operators cover plant operators whose tasks are outside the scope of those classified under minor groups 810-817. Plant operators classified here include those operating and monitoring machinery and equipment used for processing mineral ore and stone.

820 MACHINE SUPERVISORS AND GENERAL FOREMEN

Machine supervisors and general foremen supervise the production activities of a distinct unit within an establishment in which machines are used for the manufacture of various products on an industrial basis, or a unit concerned with manufacturing and assembling of electrical and electronic equipment and components, and control and coordinate the activities of workers in various occupations.

Tasks performed usually include interpreting specifications and job orders; determining sequence of operations and use of equipment; estimating manpower requirements; assigning duties to workers; analysing and resolving work problems; coordinating the work of one or more units with other units; recommending or initiating personnel action.

821 METAL AND MINERAL PRODUCTS MACHINE OPERATORS

Metal and mineral products machine operators operate and monitor metalworking machines and machines for making products composed primarily of non-metallic mineral materials.

Tasks performed usually include operating and monitoring metalworking machines set up for repetitive work such as lathes, power shears and boring, grinding and metal sawing machine tools, or operating and monitoring machines to extrude, mould, mix, grind and cut various pre-cast cement, concrete and stone products.

822 CHEMICAL PRODUCTS MACHINE OPERATORS

Chemical products machine operators operate and monitor machines which process a variety of chemicals and other ingredients to produce pharmaceuticals, toiletries, explosives, photographic or other chemical products, or to finish, plate and coat metal articles.

Tasks performed usually include operating and monitoring machines which mould, filter, ferment, mix, blend and otherwise process chemicals and other materials to give them desired properties for further industrial production, or to make finished products; operating and monitoring machines which finish, plate and coat metal products; processing photographic and motion picture film and operating machines to make photographic prints.

823 RUBBER AND PLASTICS PRODUCTS MACHINE OPERATORS

Rubber and plastics products machine operators operate and monitor machines which knead and blend rubber and rubber compounds and produce various components and products from natural and synthetic rubber and plastics.

Tasks performed usually include operating and monitoring machines which knead and blend rubber and rubber compounds, and produce various components and products from natural and synthetic rubber and plastics, such as industrial accessories, footwear, domestic articles, sports and life saving equipment and pneumatic tires, by extruding, moulding, laminating and vulcanising.

824 WOOD PRODUCTS MACHINE OPERATORS

Wood products machine operators operate and monitor automatic and semi-automatic woodworking machines which perform repetitive work.

Tasks performed usually include operating and monitoring woodworking machines for sawing, shaping, boring, planing, turning or carving wood.

825 PRINTING, BINDING AND PAPER PRODUCTS MACHINE OPERATORS

Printing, binding and paper products machine operators operate and monitor various types of printing and copying machines, or machines which bind and emboss books or which produce various articles from paper, paperboard, cardboard, cellophane and similar materials.

Tasks performed usually include operating and monitoring various types of printing and copying machines, or operating and monitoring machines which bind and emboss books or which produce boxes, bags, envelopes, drinking cups and other articles from paper, paperboard, cardboard, cellophane and similar materials.

826 TEXTILE PRODUCTS MACHINE OPERATORS

Textile products machine operators operate and monitor machines which spin and wind thread, weave fabrics, treat textile products or sew or embroider garments.

Tasks performed usually include operating and monitoring machines which spin and wind yarn and thread or weave cloth, tapestry, lace, carpet or other fabrics; or knit garments, fabrics and other articles; or operating sewing or embroidery machines for the manufacture of garments in standardised series; or operating and monitoring machines which bleach, dye and otherwise treat textile products.

827 FOOD AND RELATED PRODUCTS MACHINE OPERATORS

Food and related products machine operators operate and monitor machines which process foodstuffs and manufacture food and related products for human and animal consumption.

Tasks performed usually include operating and monitoring machines for manufacturing meat and fish products, for processing milk and cream and manufacturing dairy products, for crushing and grinding grain, spices or similar foodstuffs, for making biscuits, noodles and related products, for processing fruits, nuts and vegetables, for processing and refining sugar, for processing tea, coffee and cocoa, or for producing beer, wine, spirits and other beverages, or tobacco products.

828 ASSEMBLERS AND QUALITY CHECKERS

Assemblers and quality checkers assemble components into products according to strictly laid out procedures and inspect finished products or parts for conformance to manufacturer's standards. The products worked on may move from one worker to the next along assembly lines.

Tasks performed usually include assembling components into electrical and electronic equipment, batteries, rubber and plastic goods or toys; inspecting finished products or parts for accuracy of assembly, for conformity to weight and other specifications, and for defects in finish or operation.

829 MACHINE OPERATORS NOT ELSEWHERE CLASSIFIED

This minor group covers machine operators not classified in minor groups 821-828 eg they operate and monitor machines which pack and label products, packages and containers, or operate bottle washing machines.

830 MOBILE MACHINERY SUPERVISORS AND GENERAL FOREMEN

Mobile machinery supervisors and general foremen supervise activities of a distinct unit within an establishment concerned with the transport of materials and goods, and control the activities of workers in related occupations.

Tasks performed usually include interpreting specifications and job orders; determining sequence of operations and use of equipment; estimating manpower requirements; assigning duties to workers; analysing and resolving work problems; coordinating the work of one or more units with other units; recommending or initiating personnel action.

831 MRT TRAIN OPERATORS AND RELATED WORKERS

MRT train operators and related workers drive monorail, MRT trains or locomotives to transport freight or passengers, manoeuvre railway coaches and operate railway signals.

Tasks performed usually include driving MRT trains or locomotives, operating railway signals, switching rolling stock and making up trains in railway yards.

832 MOTOR VEHICLE DRIVERS

Motor vehicle drivers drive and tend motor vehicles to transport materials, goods and passengers.

Tasks performed usually include tending and driving motorcycles, cars, taxis, trams and buses, heavy trucks, lorries and vans in order to transport passengers, goods and materials.

833 MOBILE MACHINERY OPERATORS

Mobile machinery operators drive, tend, operate and monitor agricultural and other machinery and equipment for handling materials and heavy objects.

Tasks performed usually include driving, tending, operating and monitoring tractors and other specialised machinery in agriculture, or earth-moving, hoisting, lifting and related equipment.

834 SHIPS' DECK CREW AND RELATED WORKERS

Ships' deck crew and related workers carry out deck duties on board ship and similar duties on board other waterborne craft.

Tasks performed usually include standing look-out watches at sea and in harbour, steering ship according to instructions, and cleaning, painting and maintaining ship and its deck equipment as required.

911 DOMESTIC HELPERS AND CLEANERS

Domestic helpers and cleaners perform various tasks in private households in order to keep the interiors and fixtures clean, and prepare and serve meals.

Tasks performed usually include sweeping or vacuum cleaning, washing, ironing, preparing food and serving meals.

912 CLEANERS IN OFFICES, HOTELS AND OTHER ESTABLISHMENTS

Cleaners in offices, hotels and other establishments clean and tidy the interiors and fixtures of hotels, offices and other establishments.

Tasks performed usually include sweeping or vacuum cleaning, washing and polishing floors, furniture and other fixtures in buildings; making beds, cleaning bathrooms, supplying towels, soap and related items; cleaning kitchens and generally helping with kitchen work, including dishwashing.

913 TRANSPORT VEHICLE CLEANERS

Transport vehicle cleaners engage in the cleaning of motor vehicles, ships and ship tanks, aircraft, railway carriages and other transport equipment.

Tasks performed usually include cleaning, washing and polishing cars and other vehicles, by hand or machine; washing ships and ship tanks with water or various solutions; sweeping or vacuum cleaning interior of aircraft and railway carriages, buses and similar vehicles.

914 GARBAGE COLLECTORS, SWEEPERS AND RELATED WORKERS

Garbage collectors, sweepers and related workers collect garbage from buildings, yards, streets and other public places, or keep streets and other public places clean.

Tasks performed usually include collecting, loading and unloading garbage; sweeping streets and other public places.

920 PORTERS, ATTENDANTS AND RELATED WORKERS

Porters, attendants and related workers deliver messages or carry luggage, attend parking places and health and sanitary places.

Tasks performed usually include delivering messages, packages and other items within an establishment or between establishments, to households or other places; carrying luggage, especially at hotels, stations or airports; doorkeeping or watching properties; recording or checking parking time and collecting parking fees; delivering laboratory supplies, equipment or specimens to designated work areas and cleaning laboratory equipment; assisting in care of patients in hospitals and nursing homes, moving patients to treatment units and distributing dressing packs, treatment trays and other supplies.

931 AGRICULTURAL AND FISHERY LABOURERS AND RELATED WORKER

Agricultural and fishery labourers and related workers perform simple and routine farming, forestry and fishing tasks requiring physical effort and use of simple hand-held tools.

Tasks performed usually include digging, shovelling, loading, unloading, stacking, raking, pitching; spreading manure or fertilizers; watering and weeding; grass cutting and tree pruning; picking fruits, vegetables and various plants; feeding animals; cleaning animal quarters and various farm grounds; clearing undergrowth in forest stands; clearing sea-bed and performing other simple tasks connected with aquatic cultivation.

932 MANUFACTURING LABOURERS AND RELATED WORKERS

Manufacturing labourers and related workers perform simple and routine tasks connected with manufacturing requiring mainly physical effort and the use of simple hand-held tools.

Tasks performed usually include lifting, carrying, loading, unloading or washing raw materials or products in manufacturing establishments.

933 CONSTRUCTION LABOURERS AND RELATED WORKERS

Construction labourers and related workers perform simple and routine tasks requiring physical effort and the use of simple hand-held tools.

Tasks performed usually consist of digging, shovelling, lifting, moving, carrying, clearing, loading and unloading; spreading gravel, carrying bricks or performing similar tasks in the construction of roads, dams or buildings.

934 TRANSPORT LABOURERS AND RELATED WORKERS

Transport labourers and related workers carry out freight handling by hand, move materials or products within an establishment, or pedal trishaws and similar vehicles.

Tasks performed usually include freight handling by hand; moving materials or products within an establishment; pedalling trishaws and similar vehicles to transport passengers and goods.

939 LABOURERS AND RELATED WORKERS NOT ELSEWHERE CLASSIFIED

This minor group covers labourers and related workers not classified elsewhere eg they perform simple and routine tasks such as sorting and packing by hand.
