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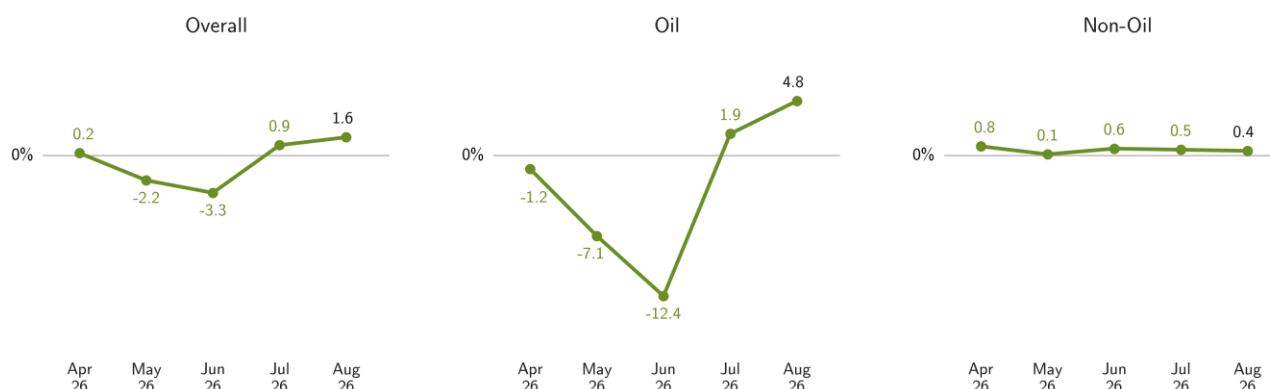

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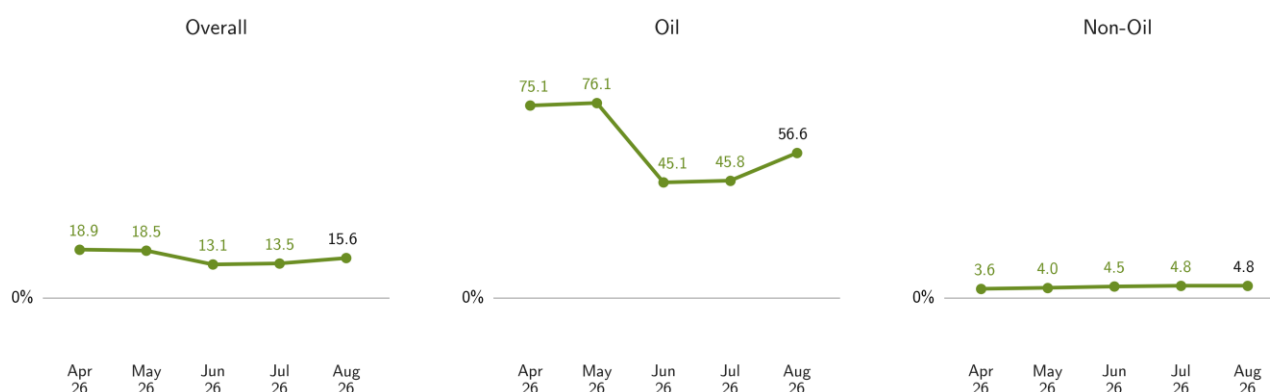
Import Price Index (2023=100) August 2026

Month-on-Month



The Import Price Index rose 1.6% in August 2026, extending the 0.9% increase in July 2026 and marking a second consecutive month of growth following declines in May and June 2026. The Oil index increased 4.8%, accelerating from the 1.9% rise in July 2026. The Non-oil index rose 0.4% in August 2026, continuing its recent run of monthly increases of less than 1%.

Year-on-Year

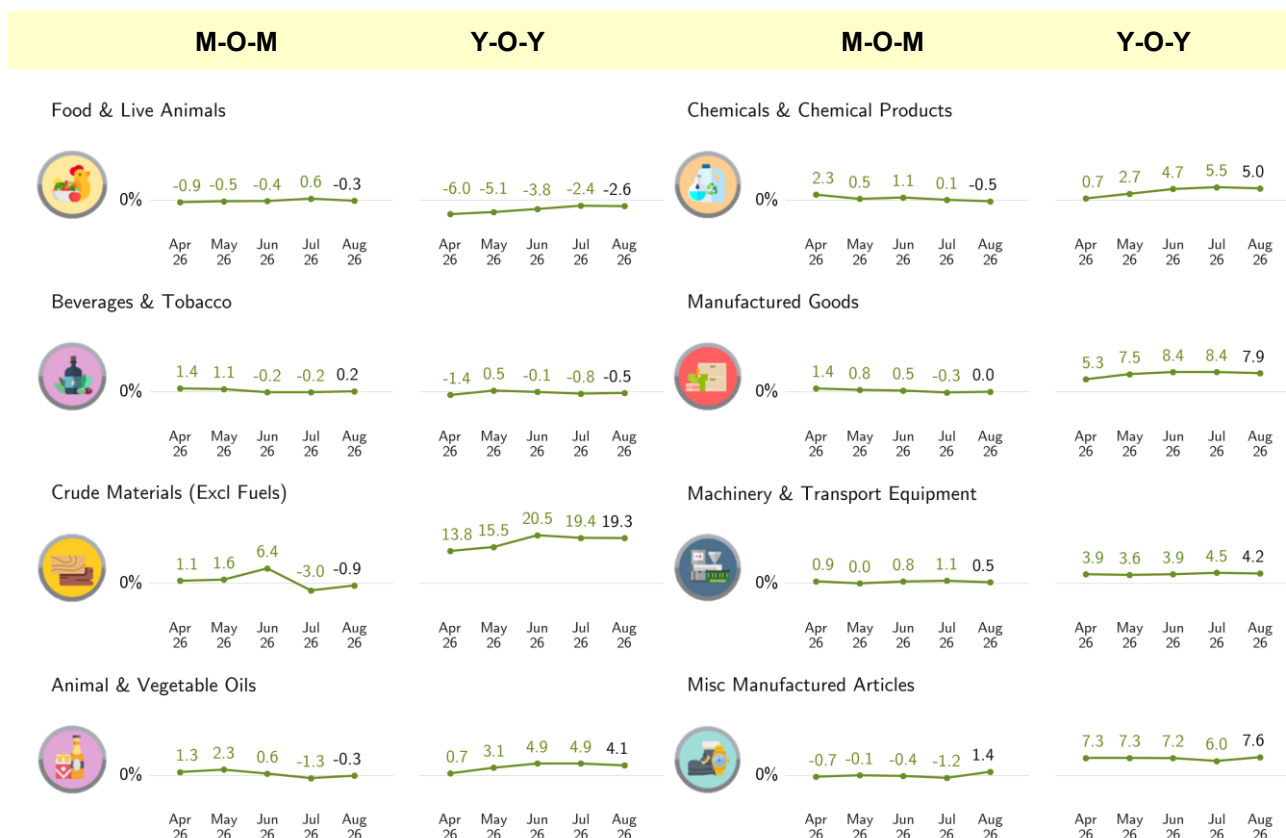


The Import Price Index rose 15.6% in August 2026 from a year ago, picking up pace from the 13.5% increase in July 2026. The Oil index continued to rise strongly, increasing 56.6% in August 2026, up from the 45.8% increase in July 2026. The Non-oil index rose 4.8%, unchanged from the increase in July 2026, following a gradual pick-up in the preceding months.

The month-on-month and year-on-year increases in the Oil index were mainly driven by higher prices of petroleum and petroleum products, against the backdrop of the Middle East conflict¹.

Month-on-Month Change

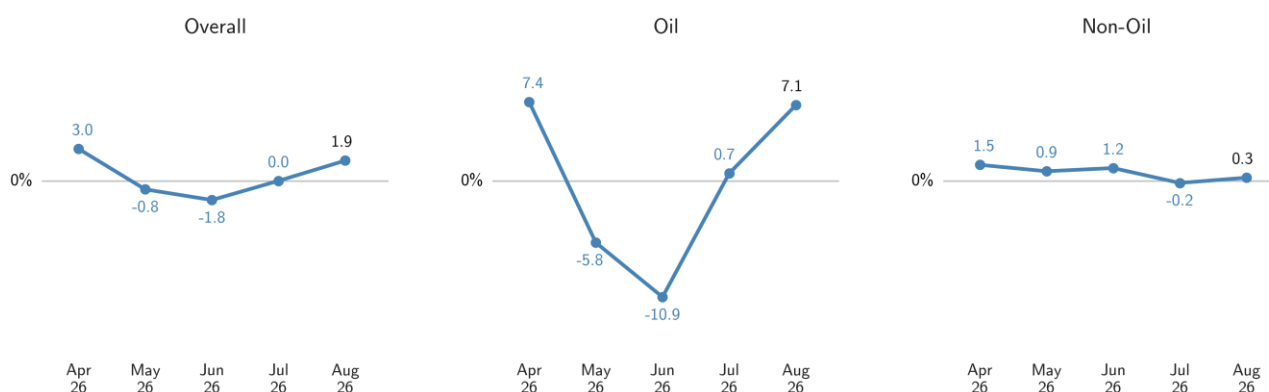
Only 3 of the 8 Non-oil sub-indices rose month-on-month in August 2026. The Machinery & Transport Equipment and Miscellaneous Manufactured Articles sub-indices were the largest contributors to the increase in the Non-oil index. The Machinery & Transport Equipment sub-index rose 0.5%, mainly due to higher prices of electrical machinery apparatus such as electronic integrated circuits. The Miscellaneous Manufactured Articles sub-index increased 1.4%, mainly due to higher prices of jewellery. Notably, the increase in the Miscellaneous Manufactured Articles sub-index reversed four consecutive months of decline.

Year-on-Year Change

Most of the Non-oil sub-indices rose year-on-year in August 2026. The Machinery & Transport Equipment and Miscellaneous Manufactured Articles sub-indices were the largest contributors to the increase in the Non-oil index. The Machinery & Transport Equipment sub-index rose 4.2%, mainly due to higher prices of electrical machinery apparatus such as electronic integrated circuits. The Miscellaneous Manufactured Articles sub-index rose 7.6%, mainly due to higher prices of jewellery.

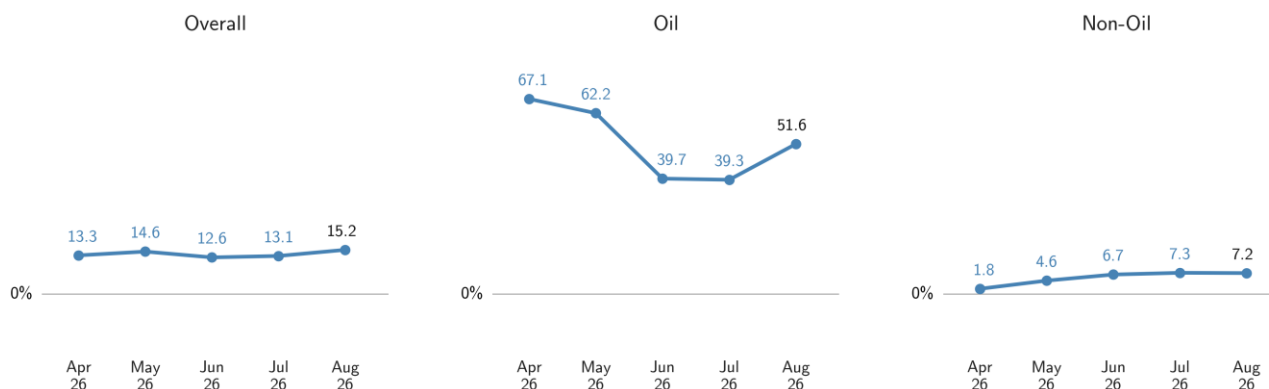
Export Price Index (2023=100) August 2026

Month-on-Month



The Export Price Index rose 1.9% in August 2026, its first increase in four months. The Oil index increased 7.1%, accelerating from the 0.7% rise in July 2026 and marking its largest month-on-month increase since April 2026. The Non-oil index rose 0.3% in August 2026, reversing the 0.2% dip in the previous month.

Year-on-Year



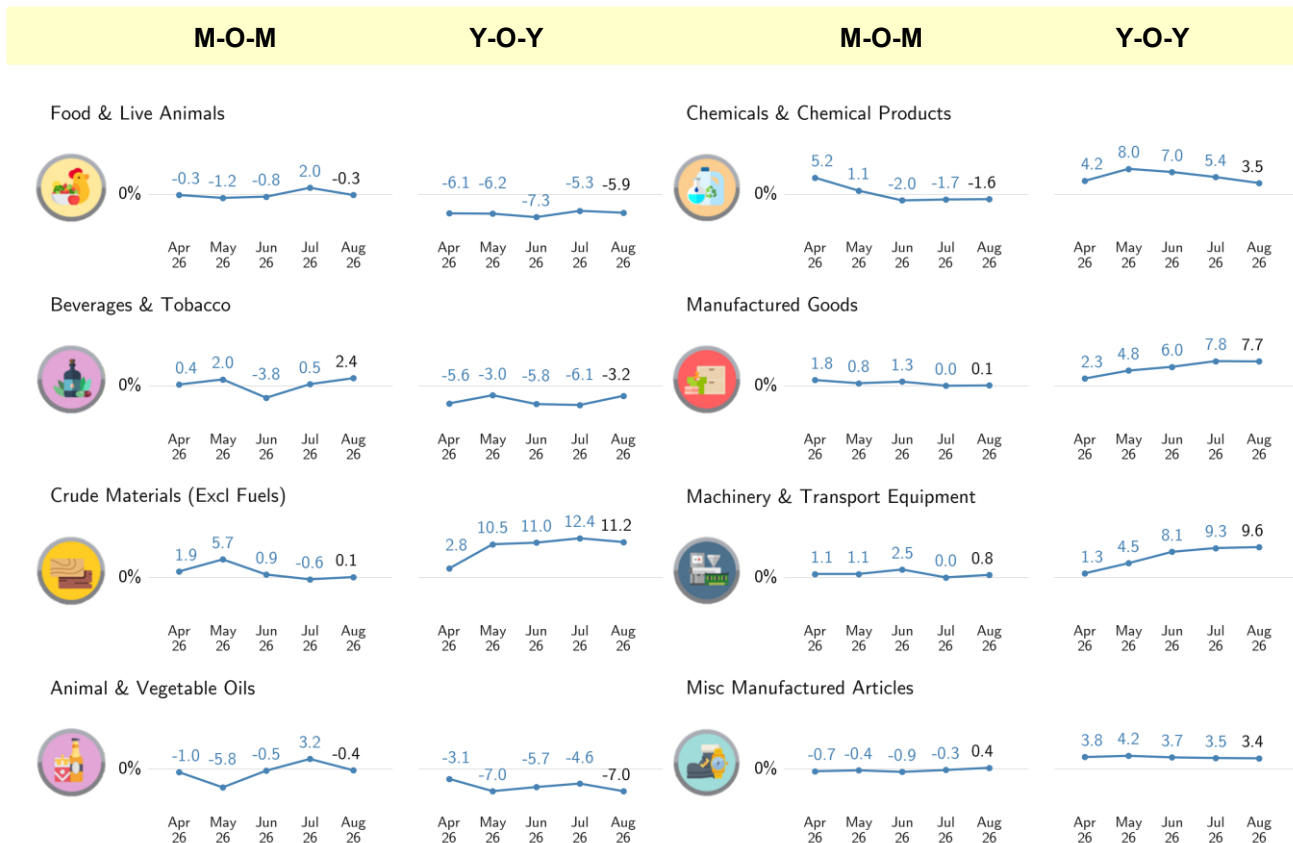
The Export Price Index rose 15.2% in August 2026 from a year ago, the largest year-on-year increase in the past six months and up from the 13.1% increase in July 2026. The Oil index continued to rise, increasing 51.6% in August 2026, a marked acceleration from the 39.3% increase in July 2026. The Non-oil index rose 7.2%, similar to the 7.3% increase in July 2026, following a pick-up in growth in recent months.

The month-on-month and year-on-year increases in the Oil index were mainly driven by higher prices of petroleum and petroleum products, against the backdrop of the Middle East conflict¹.

Month-on-Month Change

5 of the 8 Non-oil sub-indices rose month-on-month in August 2026. The Machinery & Transport Equipment sub-index was the largest contributor to the increase in the Non-oil index, rising 0.8%, mainly due to higher prices of electrical machinery apparatus such as electronic integrated circuits.

Year-on-Year Change

5 of the 8 Non-oil sub-indices increased year-on-year in August 2026. The Machinery & Transport Equipment sub-index was the largest contributor to the increase in the Non-oil index, increasing 9.6%, mainly due to higher prices of electrical machinery apparatus such as electronic integrated circuits.

Technical Note

The **Import Price Index (IPI)** is used primarily as an indicator to track the price trends of imported goods into Singapore. Prices of imports, valued at CIF terms (cost, insurance and freight) are obtained monthly from major importers. The weighting pattern of the index is derived from import statistics for 2023.

The **Export Price Index (EPI)** measures changes in the price of all exports of merchandise from Singapore, including re-exports. In general, prices are obtained from major exporters of the selected commodities. Prices used in the index computation, are the prices of goods that physically leave Singapore's main ports of export; also termed as Free on Board (FOB) prices. The weights of the index are derived from the distribution of export by commodity in 2023.

The IPI and EPI have consistently recorded response rates of about 80% respectively for each reference month, based on total import and export values of all selected commodities where price data could be collected from surveys and administrative sources.

Index Formula

The 2023-based series is compiled using the Laspeyres formula where the price and weight reference periods are aligned to the year 2023. The geometric mean formula has been adopted in the computation of unweighted elementary aggregate price indices. The arithmetic mean formula is applied in compiling indices at higher levels of aggregation where weights of specific sub-indices are available.

Measurement of Changes in Price Indices

Change over previous month compares the index of the month with that of the preceding month. Such comparisons measure the change in the price index between two consecutive months. They serve as useful short-term indicators of the price movements.

Change over same period of previous year measures change in the index over a twelve-month period. Such comparisons compare the movement in the price index between similar months in two consecutive years.

Linking the Old 2018-Based Price Index Series to the New 2023-Based Price Index Series

The IPI and EPI have been rebased from base year 2018 to base year 2023. To facilitate comparison of the historical price indices across base years, the old 2018-based series are linked to the new 2023-based series by re-scaling them via a Linked Coefficient. The Linked Coefficient is the ratio of the annual 2023-based index in 2023 to the annual 2018-based index in 2023.

Example: Linking the old Iron & Steel Index series for IPI prior to 2023, to the 2023-based Iron & Steel Index (2023=100)

1) Calculate the linked coefficient

Year	Iron & Steel Index (2018=100)	Iron & Steel Index (2023=100)	Linked Coefficient
2023	117.2	100.0	$100.0 \div 117.2 = 0.853$

2) Re-scaling the old series to the 2023-based series using the Linked Coefficient

Year	Month	Iron & Steel Index (2018=100)	Iron & Steel Index (2023=100)
2021	Dec	130.3	$130.3 \times 0.853 = 111.1$
2022	Jan	128.7	$128.7 \times 0.853 = 109.8$

Rescaling the 2023-Based Index Series to Previous Years

To continue the old index series going forward in time, re-scale the new 2023-based index series to the old base year level, via a Rescaling Coefficient. The Rescaling Coefficient is the ratio of the annual 2023-based index in 2023 to the annual 2023-based index in the old base year.

Example: Rescaling the new 2023-based Iron & Steel Index series for IPI to the 2018-based Iron & Steel Index (2018=100)

1) Calculate the rescaling coefficient

Base Year	Annual Iron & Steel Index in 2023	Annual Iron & Steel Index in 2018	Linked Coefficient
2023	100.0	85.3	$100.0 \div 85.3 = 1.172$

2) Re-scaling the new series to the 2018-based series using the Rescaling Coefficient

Year	Month	Iron & Steel Index (2023=100)	Iron & Steel Index (2018=100)
2024	Jan	95.6	$95.6 \times 1.172 = 112.0$
2024	Feb	95.3	$95.3 \times 1.172 = 111.7$

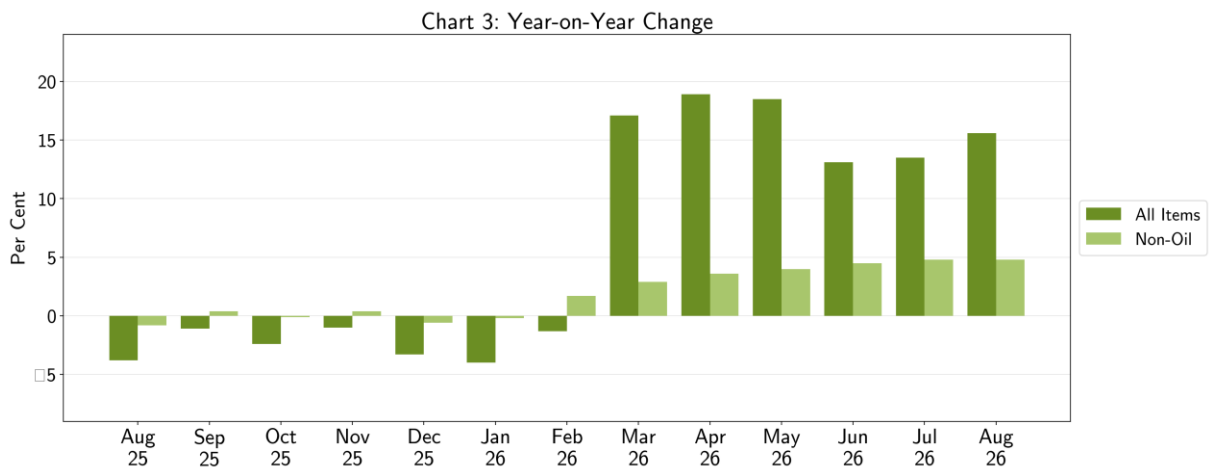
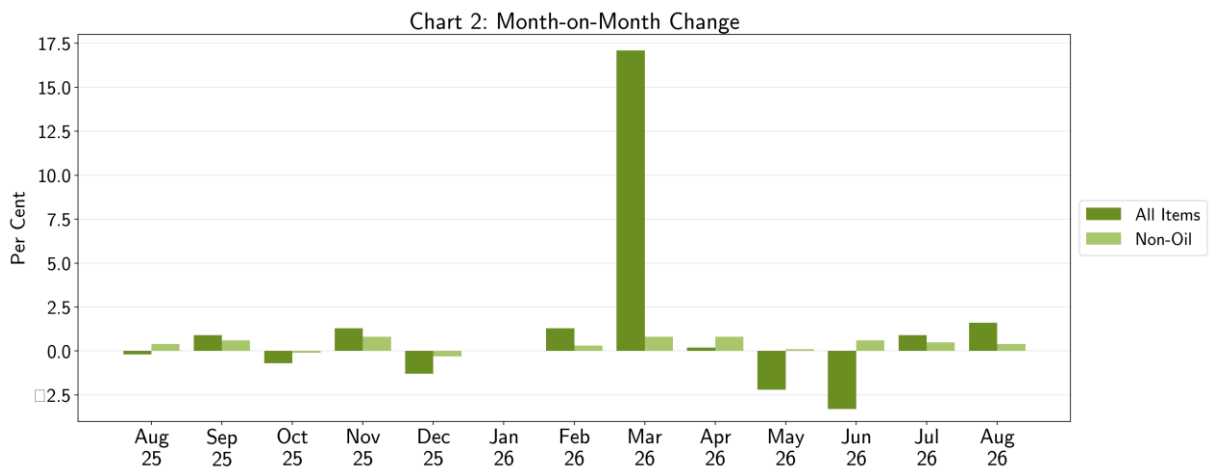
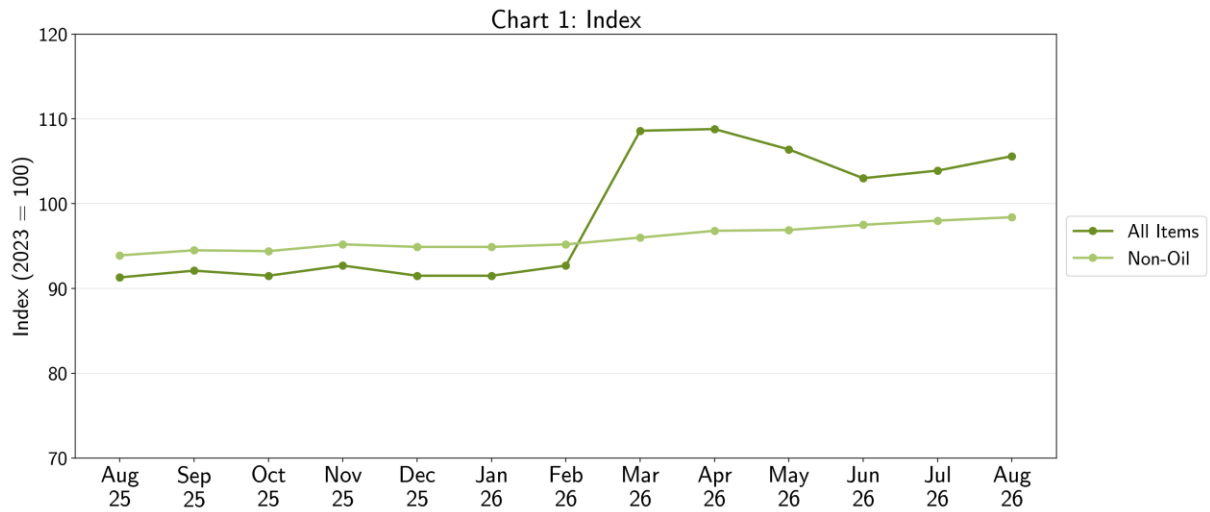
The indices may be revised when late returns and amendments received from respondents are incorporated.

Export Price Index (2023 = 100) August 2026

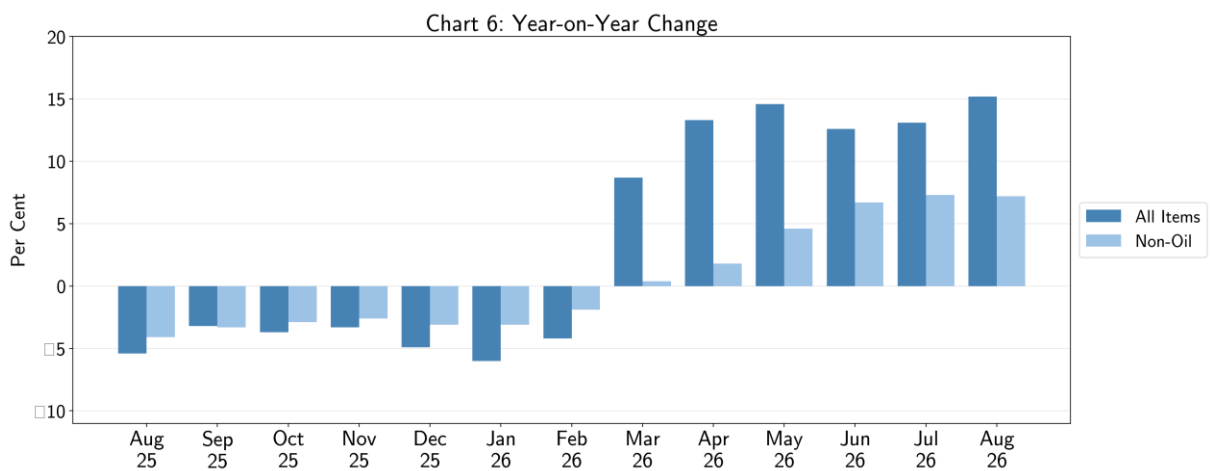
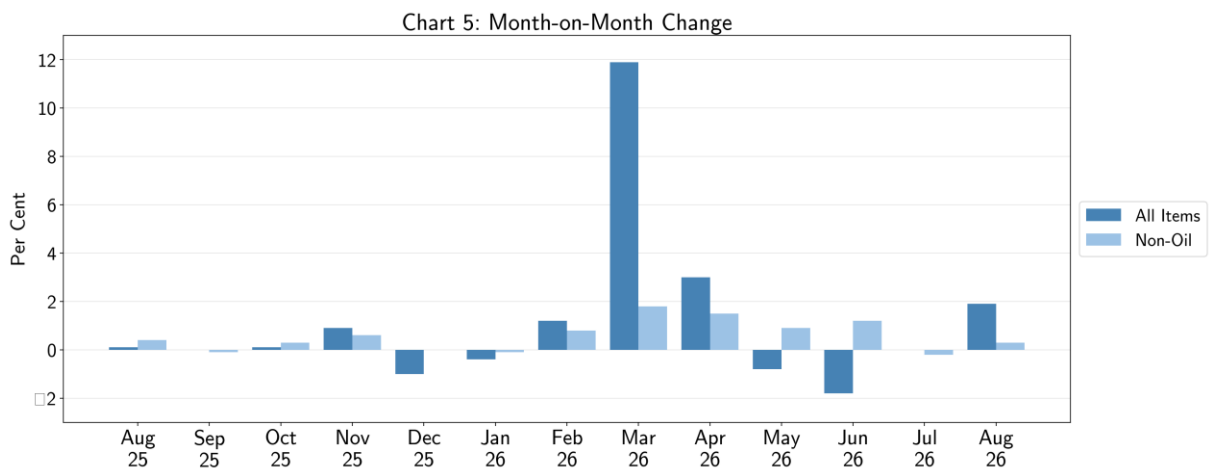
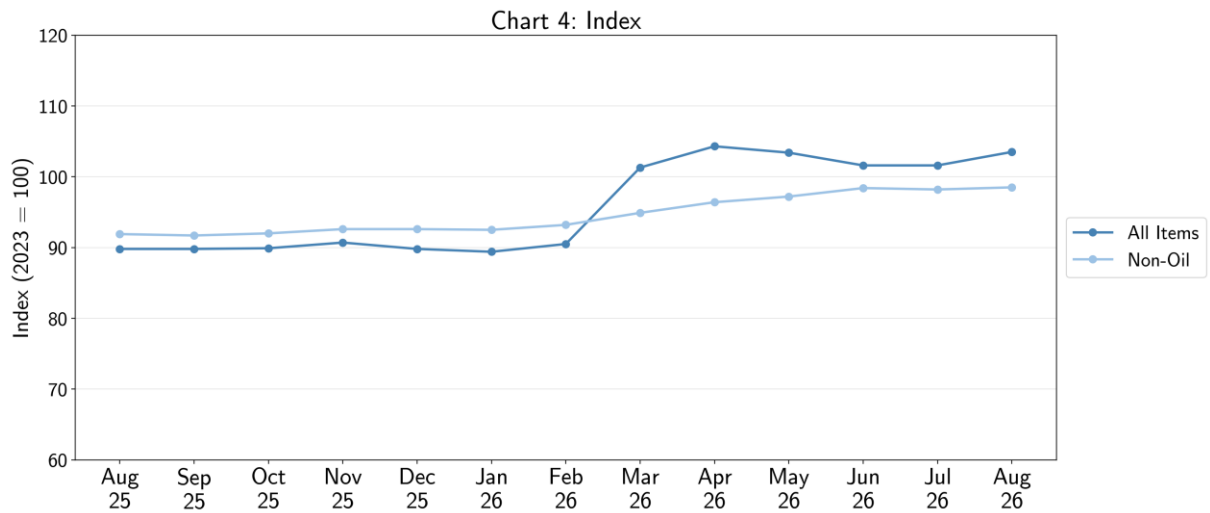
