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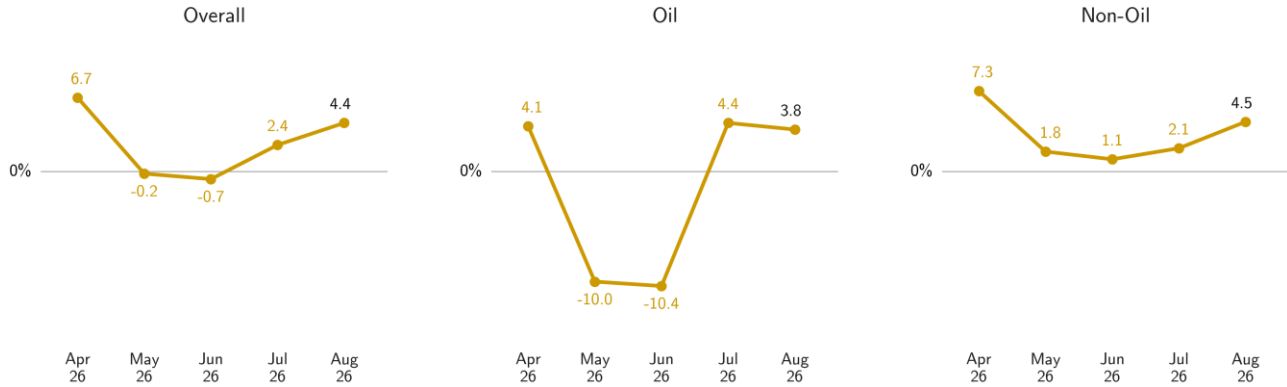

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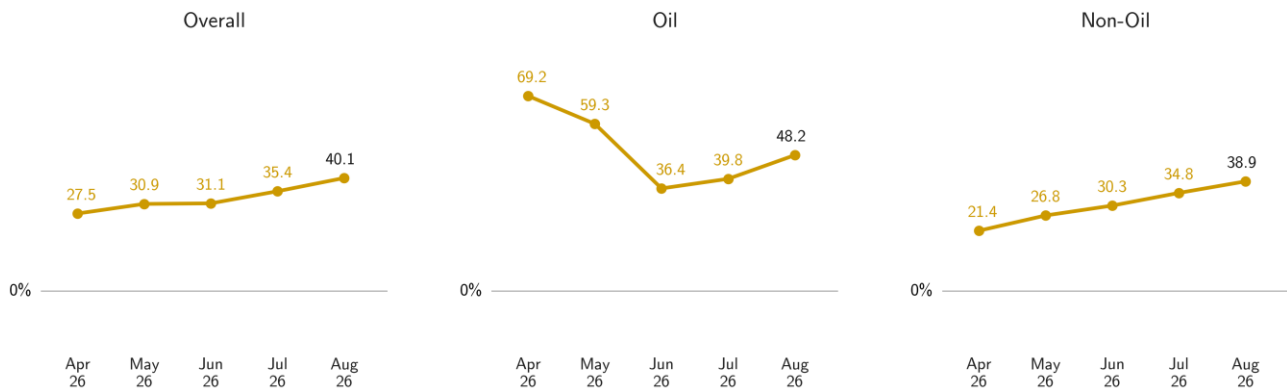
Singapore Manufactured Products Price Index (2023=100) August 2026

Month-on-Month



The Singapore Manufactured Products Price Index rose 4.4% in August 2026, following the 2.4% increase in July 2026. The Oil index rose 3.8%, extending the 4.4% increase in the previous month. The Non-oil index increased 4.5% in August 2026, up from the 2.1% rise in July 2026, continuing the gains seen in recent months.

Year-on-Year



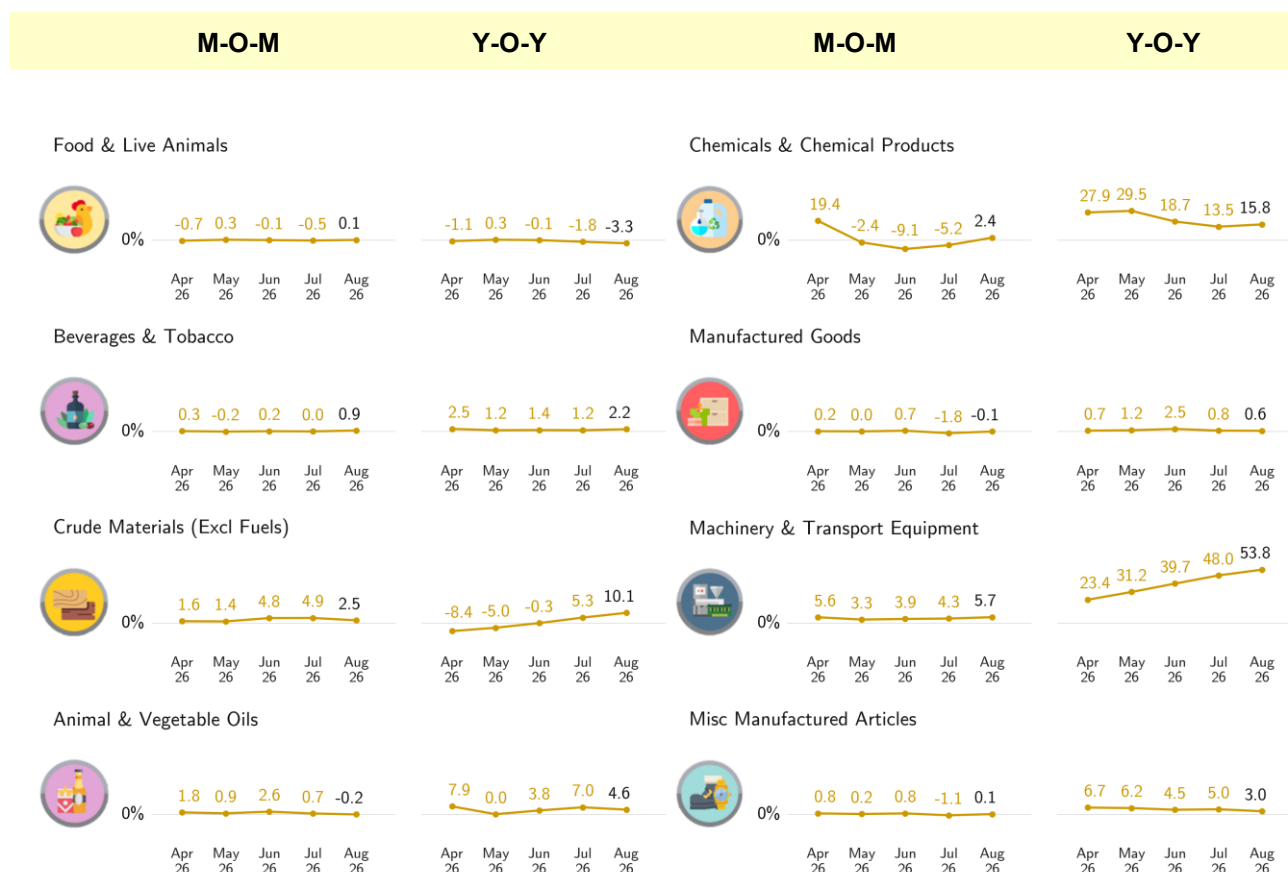
The Singapore Manufactured Products Price Index rose 40.1% year-on-year in August 2026, up from the 35.4% increase in July 2026 and continuing the upward trend seen in recent months. The Oil index increased 48.2% in August 2026, accelerating from the 39.8% increase in July 2026. The Non-oil index increased 38.9% in August 2026, extending its upward trend from the 34.8% increase in the previous month.

The month-on-month and year-on-year increases in the Oil index were mainly driven by higher prices of petroleum and petroleum products, against the backdrop of the Middle East conflict¹.

Month-on-Month Change

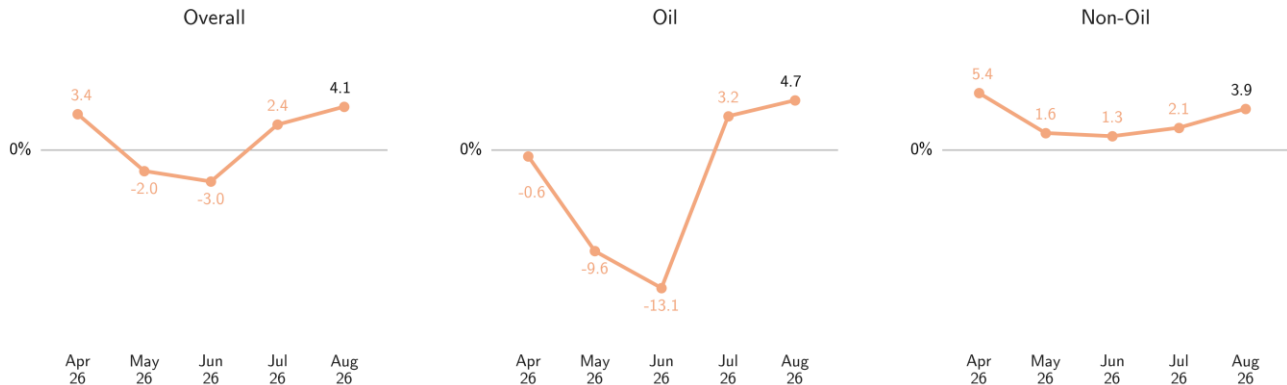
Compared with July 2026, the month-on-month increase in the Non-oil index was more broad-based in August, with more than half of its sub-indices recording increases. The Machinery & Transport Equipment sub-index was the largest contributor to the increase in the Non-oil index, rising 5.7%, mainly driven by higher prices of electrical machinery apparatus such as electronic integrated circuits. The Chemicals & Chemical Products sub-index was the second largest contributor, rebounding by 2.4% after three consecutive months of decline from May to July 2026, mainly due to higher prices for organic chemicals.

Year-on-Year Change

Most of the Non-oil sub-indices rose year-on-year in August 2026. The increase in the Non-oil index was led by the Machinery & Transport Equipment sub-index, which rose 53.8%, continuing the growth seen in recent months, mainly due to higher prices of electrical machinery apparatus such as electronic integrated circuits. The Chemicals & Chemical Products sub-index was the next largest contributor, rising 15.8%, primarily due to higher prices for organic chemicals.

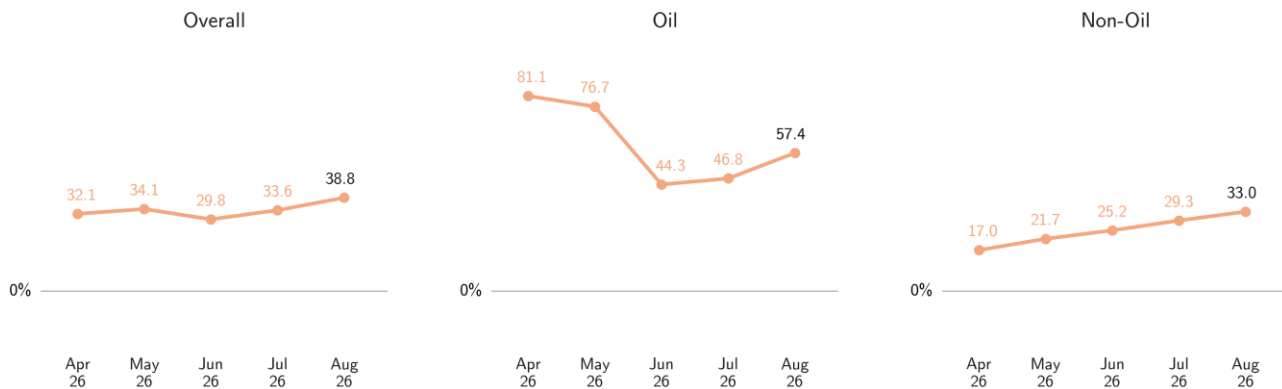
Domestic Supply Price Index (2023=100) August 2026

Month-on-Month



The Domestic Supply Price Index rose 4.1% in August 2026, extending the 2.4% increase in July 2026. The Oil index increased 4.7%, up from the 3.2% increase in July 2026, following three consecutive months of decline from April to June 2026. The Non-oil index rose 3.9% in August 2026, up from the 2.1% increase in July 2026.

Year-on-Year



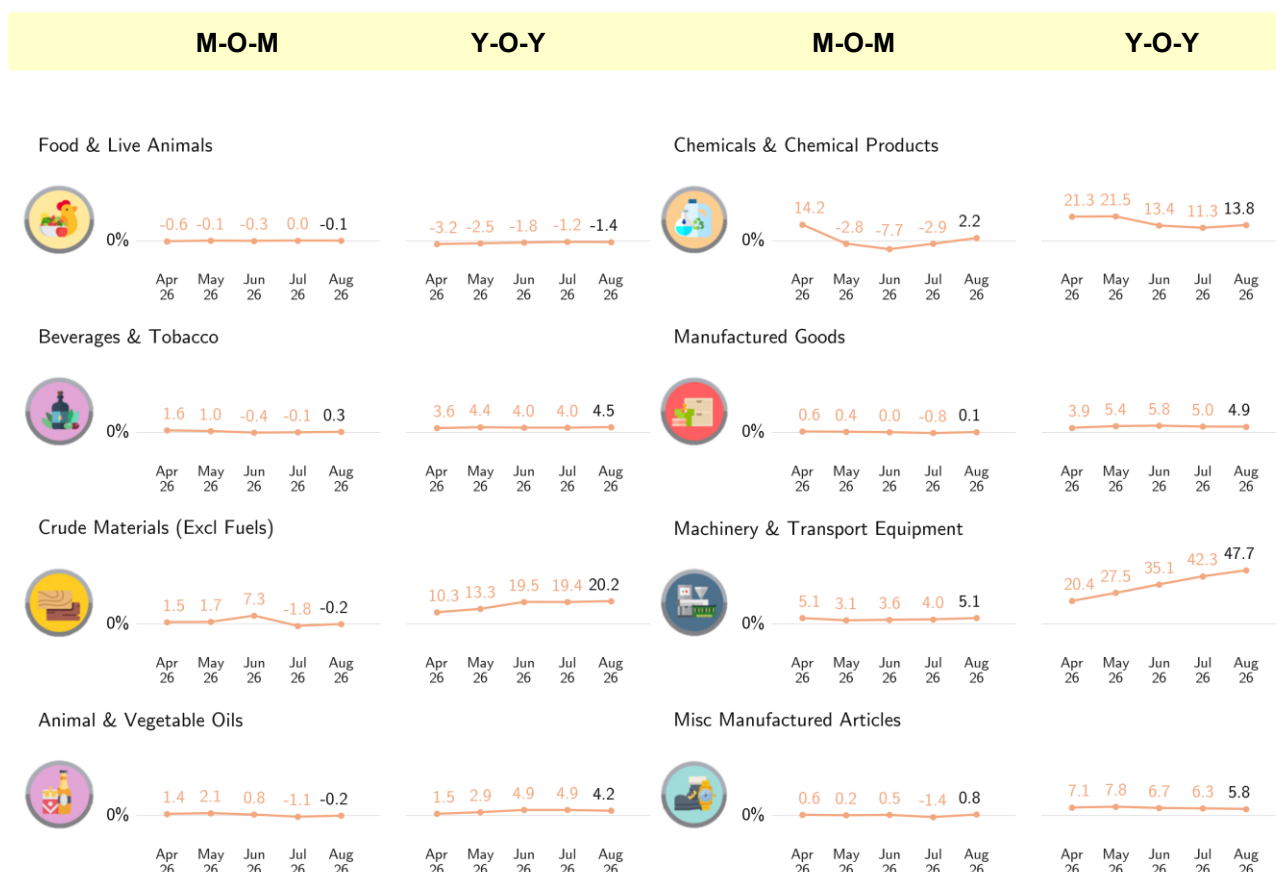
The Domestic Supply Price Index rose 38.8% in August 2026 from a year ago, extending the increases seen in recent months and up from the 33.6% increase in July 2026. The Oil index continued to rise, increasing 57.4% in August 2026, up from the 46.8% gain in July 2026. The Non-oil index rose 33.0% in August 2026, following the 29.3% increase in July 2026, with progressively stronger growth recorded in recent months.

The month-on-month and year-on-year increases in the Oil index were mainly driven by higher prices of petroleum and petroleum products, against the backdrop of the Middle East conflict¹.

Month-on-Month Change

5 of the 8 Non-oil sub-indices rose month-on-month in August 2026. The increase in the Non-Oil index was driven mainly by the 5.1% rise in the Machinery & Transport Equipment sub-index, largely on account of higher prices of electrical machinery apparatus such as electronic integrated circuits. The Chemicals & Chemical Products sub-index was the second largest contributor, rebounding 2.2% after three consecutive months of decline, stemming from higher prices for organic chemicals.

Year-on-Year Change

Most Non-oil sub-indices rose year-on-year in August 2026. The Machinery & Transport Equipment sub-index was the largest contributor to the increase in the Non-oil index, rising 47.7% as growth continued to sustain, mainly due to higher prices for electrical machinery apparatus such as electronic integrated circuits. This was followed by the Chemicals & Chemical Products sub-index, which rose 13.8%, led by higher prices for organic chemicals.

Technical Note

The **Singapore Manufactured Products Price Index (SMPPI)** monitors price changes of locally manufactured commodities. The weights of the index are derived from the distribution of local production by commodity in 2022. Ex-factory prices are obtained from principal manufacturers of the items concerned.

The **Domestic Supply Price Index (DSPI)** is designed to measure the changes in the price level of either goods manufactured locally or imported, which are retained for use in the domestic economy by the government, business or household sectors. For imported products, the prices refer to those paid by importers in bringing the goods into Singapore, commonly referred to as c.i.f. prices. In the case of Singapore manufactured products, the quotations used are ex-factory prices. The weight for each commodity item is proportional to the value of its total supply or availability in the domestic market in 2022.

The SMPPI has consistently recorded response rates of about 80% for each reference month, based on total production values of all selected commodities where price data could be collected from surveys and administrative sources for the month. The DSPI does not have a response rate given that it is a composite index of the SMPPI and the Import Price Index (IPI).

Index Formula

The 2023-based series is compiled using the 'modified Laspeyres' formula where the weight reference period of 2022 preceded the price reference period of 2023. The geometric mean formula has been adopted in the computation of unweighted elementary aggregate price indices. The arithmetic mean formula is applied in compiling indices at higher levels of aggregation where weights of specific sub-indices are available.

Measurement of Changes in Price Indices

Change over previous month compares the index of the month with that of the preceding month. Such comparisons measure the change in the price index between two consecutive months. They serve as useful short-term indicators of the price movements.

Change over same period of previous year measures change in the index over a twelve-month period. Such comparisons compare the movement in the price index between similar months in two consecutive years.

Linking the Old 2018-Based Price Index Series to the New 2023-Based Price Index Series

The SMPPI and DSPI have been rebased from base year 2018 to base year 2023. To facilitate comparison of the historical price indices across base years, the old 2018-based series are linked to the new 2023-based series by re-scaling them via a Linked Coefficient. The Linked Coefficient is the ratio of the annual 2023-based index in 2023 to the annual 2018-based index in 2023.

Example: Linking the old Iron & Steel Index series for SMPPI prior to 2023, to the 2023-based Iron & Steel Index (2023=100)

1) Calculate the linked coefficient

Year	Iron & Steel Index (2018=100)	Iron & Steel Index (2023=100)	Linked Coefficient
2023	135.6	100.0	$100.0 \div 135.6 = 0.737$

2) Re-scaling the old series to the 2023-based series using the Linked Coefficient

Year	Month	Iron & Steel Index (2018=100)	Iron & Steel Index (2023=100)
2021	Dec	125.6	$125.6 \times 0.737 = 92.6$
2022	Jan	127.2	$127.2 \times 0.737 = 93.7$

Rescaling the 2023-Based Index Series to Previous Years

To continue the old 2018-based index series going forward in time, re-scale the new 2023-based index series to the old base year 2018 level, via a Rescaling Coefficient. The Rescaling Coefficient is the ratio of the annual 2023-based index in 2023 to the annual 2023-based index in 2018.

Example: Rescaling the new 2023-based Iron & Steel Index series for SMPPI to the 2018-based Iron & Steel Index (2018=100)

1) Calculate the rescaling coefficient

Year	Annual Iron & Steel Index in 2023	Annual Iron & Steel Index in 2018	Rescaling Coefficient
2023	100.0	73.7	$100.0 \div 73.7 = 1.357$

2) Re-scaling the new series to the 2018-based series using the Rescaling Coefficient

Year	Month	Iron & Steel Index (2023=100)	Iron & Steel Index (2018=100)
2024	Jan	100.0	$100.0 \times 1.357 = 135.7$
2024	Feb	100.6	$100.6 \times 1.357 = 136.5$

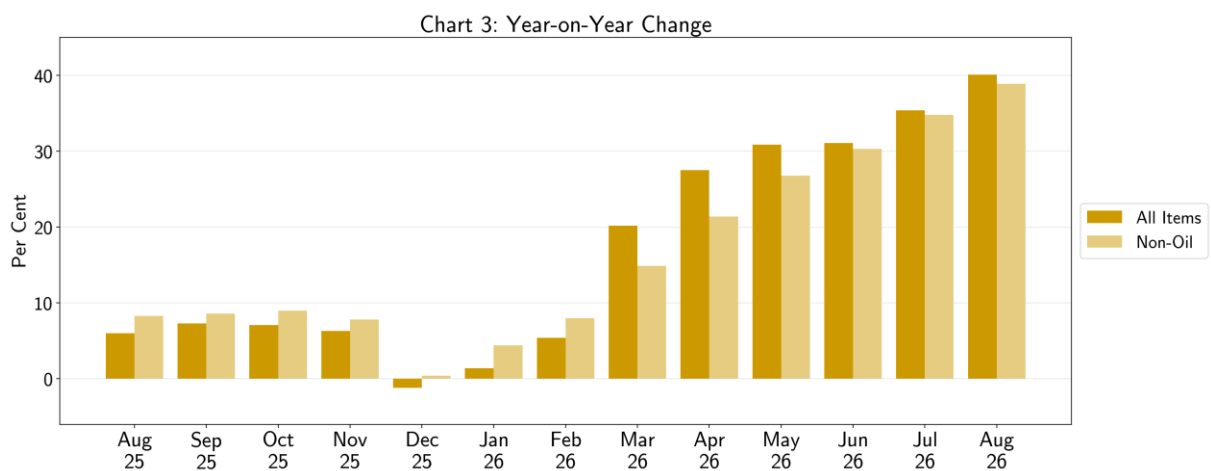
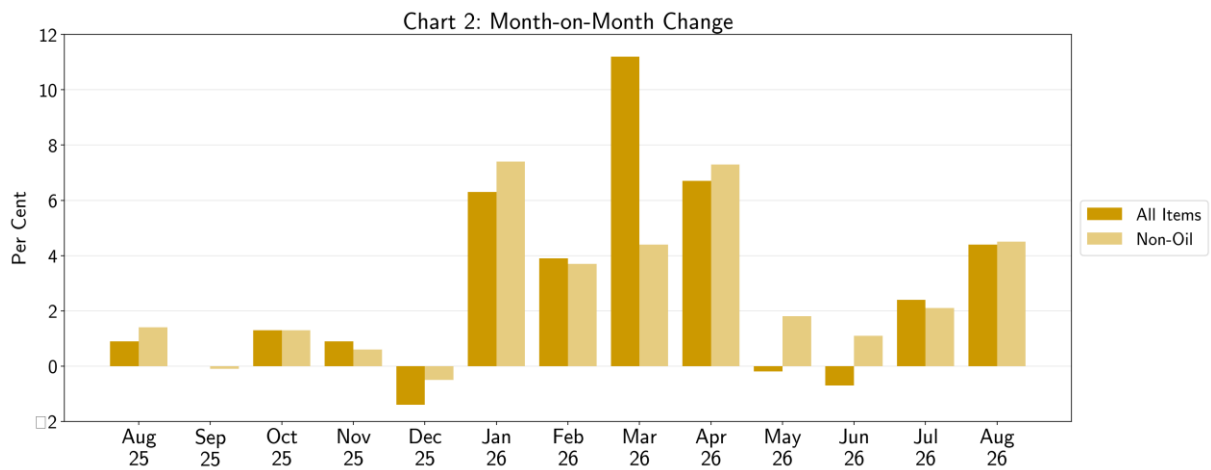
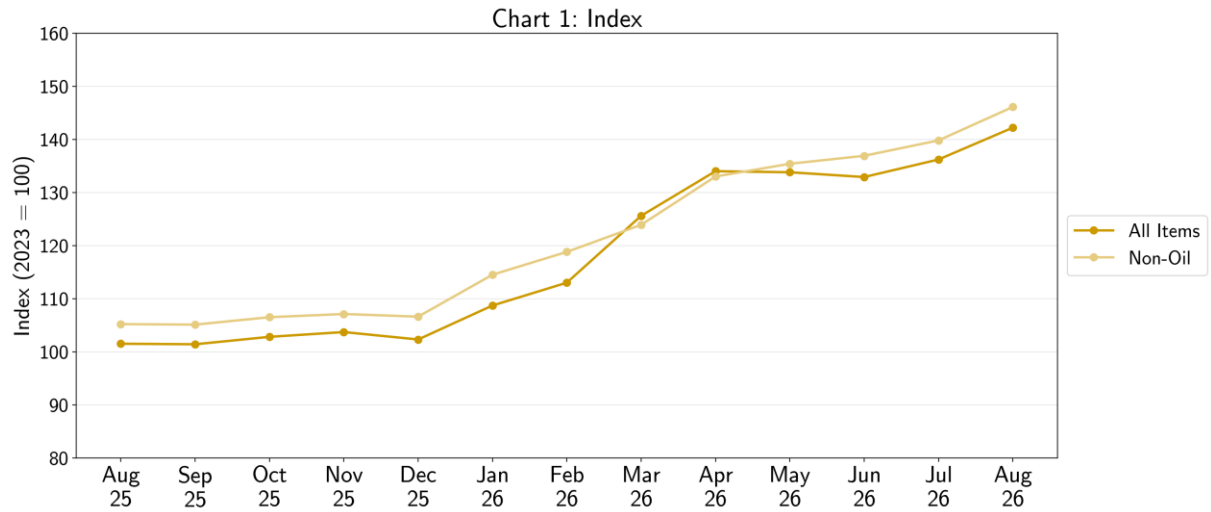
The indices may be revised when late returns and amendments received from respondents are incorporated.

Domestic Supply Price Index (2023 = 100) August 2026

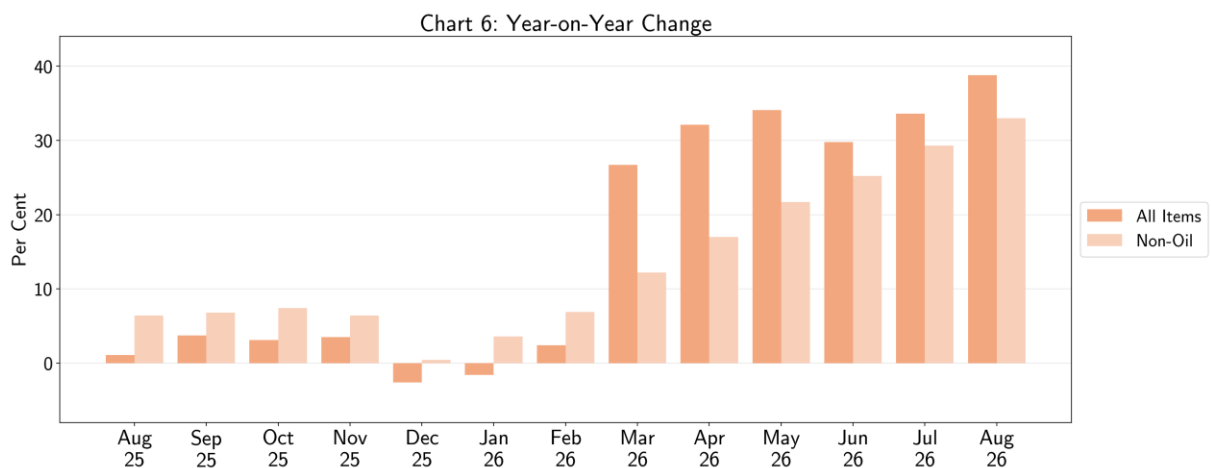
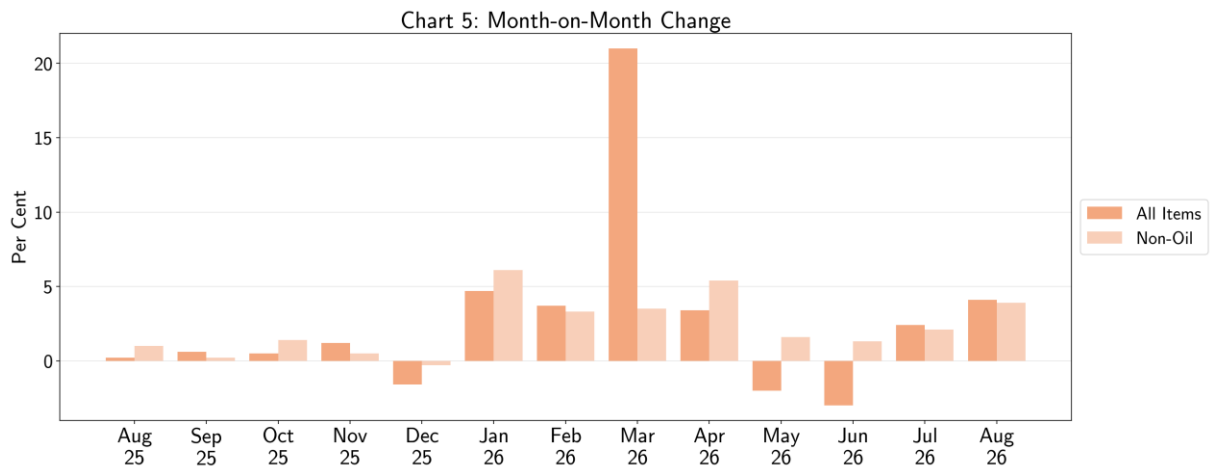
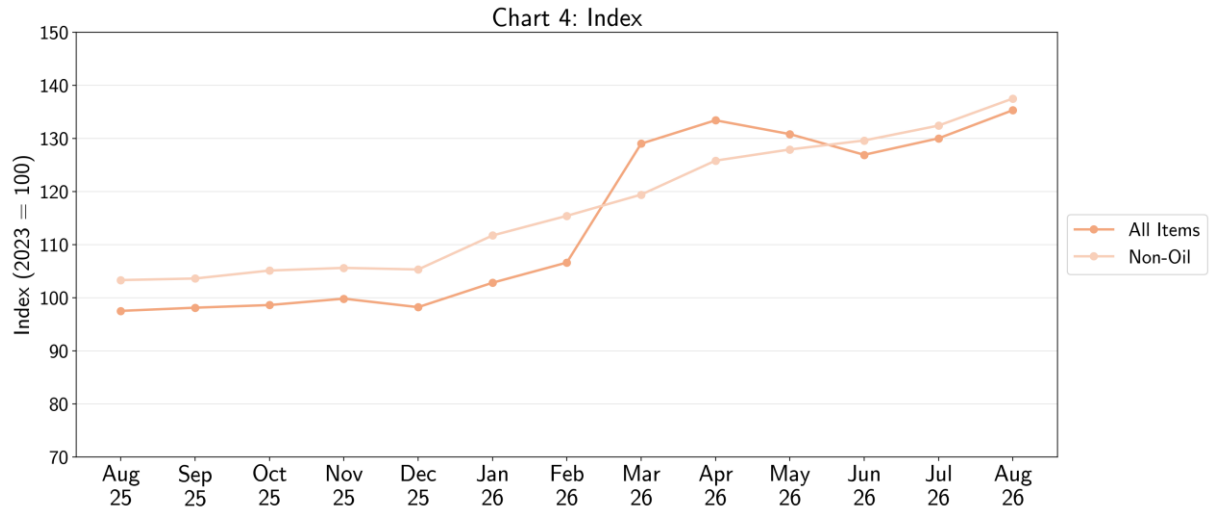
